Crack Squad






Central's Hi-Y group has lived up to its ideals of "creating, maintaining and extending throughout the home, school and community the high standards of Christian character."




Central Keglers



Center "Moon" Mullins, who led the team in scoring with 151 markers was followed by guard Wally Bryans with 133.


The reserves, led by Coach Jim. Sharp, garnered a third place in the inter-city league while George Andrews' freshmen tied for the second spot in their bracket.

North Invitational Champions . . . City Champions . . . State Champions . . . Records and opponents both fell as Central's wrestling team ended their third undefeated season in dual competition while completing their second sweep of the tournaments.

By capturing their third city title, Coach Norman Sorensen's able grapplers have compiled the longest winning streak in Nebraska's prep history with 40 consecutive victories.

With the aid of eight returning lettermen, the Purples opened the season by winning the North crown over 11 other schools. Three Eagles, Jack Byrne, Dave Roseland and Ellie Watkins, grabbed first place honors.

The matmen melted all opposition in dual

matches with Abraham Lincoln, South, Tech and Thomas Jefferson falling by the wayside. The going was rough in spots, however, as North pushed the Eagles 20-19. Only by a win in the final match were the Hilltoppers able to extend their victory streak. The Purples avenged the near upset later in the season as they gave the Vikings a 24-9 lesson.

Highlighting a remarkable season by wining the State Championship with a record 58 points, the Eagles led second-place Tech by an incredible 20-point margin. Jim Goermar and Watkins garnered initial championships, while Bill Hudgins and Roseland won crowns for the second time.

Junior Hudgins led the varsity with 58 points. Team captain Roseland and Watkins were runner-ups with 56 apiece.

On The Track

Eagles Gene Almy and Jim Goermar are two first place discus heavers who are capable of still better performances. Goermar and Almy team with Mark Palmer in the shot section. Other dependable point getters include vaulters Jim Demco and Bob Weigel, and jumpers Pullias, Kelley and Williams.

In addition to the intercity card, the cindermen will participate in other sprint carnivals with the Tee Jay Relays, the City, District and State tournaments heading the list.








Backstop Chuck Evans looks on as batsman Frank Anania gives the ball a ride.
