



A Cappella Choir

In keeping with the precedent of past years, the 1960-61 A Cappella Choir experienced a hectic but rewarding year. Under the competent direction of Mrs. Elsie Howe Jensen and the assistance of Mrs. Delma Barber, a multitude of activities allowed the choir to display its talents.

The major activity was the presentation of the opera, "The Mikado," Dec. 16-17. Musical solos with the support of a colorful chorus were blended with acting talents to produce a tremendous success. All this was accomplished despite interference from light failures and firemen. Five fire trucks were called to Central (a false alarm). Firemen insisted upon walking across the stage with all their apparatus while rehearsal was in progress. Unflustered choir members didn't drop a line or miss a note.

With little time for a breather, the choir participated in an Omaha Symphony Orchestra concert

at the Civic Auditorium and a choral program at Joslyn Museum.

In January choir members were an integral part of the All-City Music Festival, singing a medley of tunes from "The Sound of Music." The success of the 1961 Road Show was due in part to the senior choir's superb interpretation of the "Flower Drum Song." The Spring Music Festival in May rounded out a well-balanced year.

As seniors sang in their last performance in the choir at graduation, they realized that they had become an important part of the long-standing A Cappella tradition.

Junior Choir, larger this year than usual, lent valuable support to the senior choir in the music festivals. Trained with eventual promotion in mind, Junior Choir members showed that the success of future choral groups is assured.



Success was the watchword of the 1960-61 varsity debaters. Sparked by the championship team of Steve Guss and Dick Kaslow, the squad competed in 18 week-end tournaments in five states.

Coached by Miss Donna Miller, the debaters were divided into seven competitive teams whose members rose through the ranks from beginning debate training.

The oratorical whizzes garnered 23 major awards during the past season. Beginning debaters foreshadowed future success by capturing the Sweepstakes and Best Speaker Awards at the Prep Beginners' Tourney. In the Missouri Valley tournaments, a feminine squad upheld the reputation of womanhood by taking first place, while the boys received a second.

Central rhetoricians brought back the Team Excellence Award at the Fremont High School Invitational. Our traveling troupe of vocal gymnasts defeated rugged competition by capturing the Outstanding Team Award at Worthington, Minn., the Sweepstakes and Outstanding Speaker Awards at the Sioux City Central Four State Invitational and the Sweepstakes and Class A and B Debate awards at the Kearney State College Forensics.

Wins at the Missouri Valley Cross Question Open Tourney and Central and Mercy invitationals added more feathers to the Eagles' cap. The Bishop Ryan Tourney, Southeast Invitational and state meet ended the year.

In May, at the end of a victorious season, a banquet was held at which special awards were presented.

Guided by President Trudy Erwin and Sponsor Mrs. Jean Skinner, the 1960-61 Student Council modified a 22year-old system by writing and ratifying a new constitution.

Officers elected by their fellow Council members this year were Trudy Erwin, president; Steve Guss, vice-president; Janie Kennedy, recording secretary; Connie Svolopoulos, corresponding secretary; Jeff Pomerantz, treasurer; and Chris Perrin and David Adams, sergeants-at-arms. After elections in late January, six sophomores joined seven seniors and seven juniors to bring total Council membership to 20.

This year Student Council participated in two Intracity Student Council Exchange days, Nov. 15 and Mar. 14. On these days each of the five Omaha schools sent delegates to the other schools to compare and contrast academic features.

During National Education Week in November, the Council sponsored a Faculty Coffee before school. On Dec. 22 the Second Annual Alumni Tea was held, enabling former Central students to visit with previous teachers and to renew old acquaintances.

The Central representatives cooperated with the Intracity Student Council Safe-Driving Committee to organize an effective program to increase safety in the schools.

The Student Council is constantly endeavoring to promote school spirit by selling purple and white beanies or by organizing and presenting pep rallies.

The Nebraska Association of Student Councils convention was held in Columbus, Nebraska, Nov. 12. Trudy Erwin and David Adams were delegates. Bill Abernathy, NASC president, presided over the assembly.

The 1960 football team brought pride and honor to both students and faculty of Central High. For the first time since 1938, the Purple and White pigskin performers garnered an undisputed first place in Inter-city ratings.

According to both the Associated Press and United Press International, the Eagles were the Nebraska State Football Champions. The Omaha World-Herald rated Central and Creighton Prep state co-champions.

In the opening game Central demonstrated its power by out-scoring a highly rated Lincoln Central team, 29-12.

The Eagle football machine clobbered the South Packers, 32-18, in the next contest. The 40-13

victory over North added fuel to the flames the Eagles were spreading in the Inter-city League. The second and third strings played a big part in the 54-0 slaughter over Abraham Lincoln.

The stage was set for the climax of the season. A record-breaking crowd witnessed the exhibition of high school football at its best, October 7, at Municipal Stadium.

The only two undefeated teams in the Intercity, Central and Prep, were pitted against each other in a contest that would probably decide the state championship. It was a clash between a rampaging Central offense and a tough Prep defense.

Because of a remarkable display of defense on both teams, neither backfield had an opportunity to score. A Bluejay field goal attempt was ruled no good and a long Eagle touchdown run was called back because of a penalty. This was the story of the game—a 0-0 tie.

Although in early season predictions Tech was

rated as the top team, Central bowled over the Trojans, 26-0, in the following contest.

A rough Benson team was finally subdued to the tune of 19-13, October 26.

With pressure mounting, the Eagles wrapped the Westside Warriors for a 32-9 victory in the next to the last game of the season.

Central had a little trouble in taming a pesky Lincoln Northeast squad. But when the gun sounded, ending the game and concluding the season, the scoreboard read 20-13 in favor of the Eagles.

The state championship team produced some of the finest performers in the state. Fullback Vernon Breakfield, halfback Gale Sayers and tackle Don Fiedler were named to the World-Herald's 1960 All Inter-city Football team. Fiedler and Sayers also captured All-State honors in the World-Herald poll.

The PTA held a banquet to honor the team, which added a final touch to this undefeated season.









After a two-year drought, the 1960-61 Central wrestling team






TENNIS TEAM

The track team opened its season with a victory at the Omaha University Invitational. First place in the Columbus meet fell to the Eagles as they set a roaring pace in track competition.









Highlight of the year for GAA members is the O-Ball. Presented with the O-Club in June, the dance features the crowning of the King and Queen of Sports.





The War Department reorganized the cadets into an ROTC regiment in 1937. Four years later this regiment became a battalion consisting of four regular companies and one freshman company. The school has since been reorganized into a battle group with seven companies including the band company.

In 1939 the Cadet Officers' Club replaced the Senior Cadet Club, which had been organized in 1895. The Cadet Non-Commissioned Officers' Club also was reorganized that year.

This year a new position was initiated. One ROTC cadet from the city high school system was selected ROTC Cadet Corps Commander.


