




Featured in the **Register** besides the regular news and sports stories were numerous guest editorials and a student-opinion poll, "The Eagles' View."


A new column, the "Schneider Zone," created by Harold Schneider, added interest to the second page.

"Don't look so happy. The deadline was yesterday!"


A musical skit with well-known tunes boosted sales for the 1963 O-Book at an O-Book pep rally in the fall.

Six Centralites studied national and state government and campaigned for state offices during an exciting week at Cornhusker Boys' and Girls' State, June 16-22 in Lincoln.

These delegates, who were guests of the American Legion, were chosen for their scholarship, leadership, and health.

Each of the Central delegates was either elected or appointed to a state office. Dale Brodkey was elected associate justice of the Supreme Court. Her score of 90 per cent on the government test was the highest of all Girls' Staters. The boys were appointed to the following offices: Thomas Hammerstrom, purchasing agent; Steven Marcus, tax commissioner; John McIntyre, director of public institutions; Roger Persell, director of the department of motor vehicles; and Michael Siemon, adjutant general.

Each year several months of outside preparation precedes Boys' and Girls' State. This year, alternates studying with the delegates were Betty Brody, Harold Knight, Neil Miller, and Steven Rosenquist.

Robin Aronson, Anthony Bradford, John McPhail, and Suzanne Moshier were chosen, but they were unable to participate.

The climax of the week was the Boys' State-Girls' State Dance with which an educational week of fun, new friends, and hard work came to an end.




NOAH





The 1962-63 Debate Squad, coached by Miss Donna Miller, extended the trophy string of Central's debaters over three seasons to 60.


The debate season ran from October to May during which time the debaters attended approximately 25 major tournaments over a five-state area.

A Cappella Choir, directed by Mr. Rodney Walker, lived up to its musical reputation during 1962-63.


One of the biggest A Cappella presentations was the musical. This year's presentation of "The Music Man" drew a larger audience than any other musical presented on Central's stage.

For the third year in a row, Central's fine swim team took a backseat in state-wide competition only to State Champion Lincoln Southeast. The Mermen, under Coach Robert Davis, lost only one dual meet out of seven and succeeded in drowning out all opposition with surprising ease in the Inter-City Meet. Dennis Tibbitts, in the 100-yard butterfly, Jim Boyle, in the 400-yard free, and Ken Glasser, in the 200-yard individual medley and 100-yard breast-stroke, all earned Inter-City titles with nationally-ranked Glasser setting records in both of his events.

The Eagles were convincingly defeated by per-

ennial powerhouse Southeast in the State Meet but took second place easily and garnered three state titles. Ken Glasser's star continued to rise as he set state records in his two events in exceptional style. Team Co-Captain Dave Lindberg was victorious in possibly the most grueling and thrill-packed event of the meet, the 400-yard free-style.

The loss of Co-Captains Lindberg and Jelen will be felt, but the return of Glasser, Boyle, Tibbitts, and many other extremely talented underclassmen leaves only one thing more to be said: "Look out, Lincoln Southeast!"


Basketball

The Central High Basketball Quintet promised to be a bright spot of the Eagle 1962-1963 athletic year. Three-year Lettermen John Armstrong and Ulysses "Butch" Cribbs would lead a group of six returning from last year's successful team. Bobby Nelson, Tim Schmad, Orlandus Neal, John McPhail, Steve Regelean, and Walt Haney all donned "Purple and White" previously and were certainly capable of garnering one of the Hilltop's most successful seasons. Help from underclassmen was assured as rangy James Grigsby fought for and earned a starting berth.

The season opened with and continued to show Central playing basketball at its most spectacular. Its run-and-shoot, fast-breaking offense had true spectator appeal and was very successful. Coupled with the unique "half-court press" innovation of Coach Marquiss, the Eagles proceeded to win 12 of 19 regular season contests. Of the seven losses four of them were by a total of a mere six points!

Central, Tech, and Prep were favored to win their respective district tourneys and to advance into the state finals at Lincoln. All three teams succeeded, with the Eagles eliminating Benson 60-56 and Bellevue 58-48 on successive nights. Central, thus, went to State for the first time in five long years and carried with it the hopes of 2,100 students.

At least three of the starting five were guaranteed postseason honors. Fantastic Johnny Armstrong, all-around workhorse Butch Cribbs, and sharpshooting Bobby Nelson showed the ability that would awe even the most critical sports scribe.






O-Club





This year, in the interest of national and state conservation, the Outdoorsmen maintained a booth at the Sport and Wild Life Exhibition in Omaha.




