
# WIN FROM WITHIN










































## Ziya Gaskin
















#### Taylor Haynes














# Nelly Vera-Esquivel


#### Alexander Wieczorek



















## Mohamed Abdullah














#### Devon Gill


## SCHOOL'S OUT

#### measures taken by OPS




The announcement banning gatherings until May 31 dashed many hopes that the spring sports season would be able to go on, as all group sports were officially prohibited by the governor.
