# Director's Report

## Dear Central High School Supporter,

On behalf of the Central High School Foundation Board of Directors, the Foundation staff, and myself, I hope this Annual Report finds you and your loved ones well!

This annual report provides an aerial snapshot of this year's wins, laying out all the opportunities made possible by your support in one sweeping view. When the view is this fantastic, we want to give you every opportunity to enjoy it! After all, as Mike said in his letter, this year's success is entirely attributable to you and your support. As the world around us changes and the educational landscape shifts, the tradition of excellence built into the culture of our community combined with your assistance have proven to be the unchanging keys to our students' success. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you.

This year we dedicated the Gale Sayers Memorial Statue, made possible by the enthusiasm of Eagle Nation. The statue was unveiled at a public ceremony at the conclusion of a \$250,000 capital campaign, directed by the Central High School Foundation. Gale is considered one of the greatest running backs in the history of the National Football League and is the youngest person ever to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. The statue, in front of the Victory Eagle outside Seemann Stadium, is positioned so that its wings are forever soaring over one of Central's greatest athletes as well as each Eagle who passes underneath.

Additionally, this year the Central High School Foundation made a significant impact on our current Eagles. Through Classroom and Teacher Grants, we were able to fund a number of supplemental curricular projects, trips, leadership programs, and much more. For example, one of the Foundation's grants assisted the Central High School Debate Team by helping fund access to research tools, providing entry fee funds for nationwide tournaments, and supplying other academic and competition resources. As a result, Debate has become a sought-after extra-curricular activity at Central. Support from the Foundation also helped the Math Club with transportation, meals and entry fees to local and national math competitions, and allowed teachers to purchase supplies for projects in the

Enrichment Math course.

The Foundation also funded the Drama Department's annual trip to the Nebraska Thespian Festival, a two-and-a-half-day immersive performing art experience. And the Foundation's support allowed the International Baccalaureate staff to develop IB Jumpstart, a team-building event for students. Jon Flanagan, an IB English teacher, described how important the Foundation's support is to the IB students: "At its core, the rigorous IB curriculum is driven by student inquiry and student discussion. For our students to succeed, they must become comfortable sharing original ideas, questioning the assertions of their peers, and receiving constructive criticism. IB Jumpstart is the means by which we condense and accelerate student bonding, so they can feel comfortable engaging in that way. Support from the Central High School Foundation allows us to do that important work."



Additionally, the Foundation was able to provide funding for meaningful professional development for Central's 200+ staff members. Quality professional development and support positively affect teacher retention and expertise, resulting in quality learning for our students.

## Science

Students use special equipment to maintain a 240-gallon marine biology saltwater aquarium used in Marine Biology, Ecology, and in the Advanced Research classes. This creates the opportunity for students to test hypotheses and carry out experiments on the interactions in the marine ecosystem.


# Statue Honoring Gale Sayers Revealed

The unveiling of the Gale Sayers ('61) memorial statue took place outside Lee ('38) and Willa Davis ('43) Seemann Stadium before Central's first home football game of the season against Omaha Northwest on August 26, 2022. This special event open to the public included a program with featured speakers Executive Director Michele Roberts, Board President Mike Lebens ('70), Gale's brother Roger Sayers ('60), Central principal Ms. Dionne Kirksey, current student Charlie Yale ('24), and sculptor Littleton Alston. The Central football team also wore commemorative helmet decals for their game against Omaha Northwest that evening. Funding for the statue was made possible thanks to the generosity of hundreds of Central alumni and community supporters.

Gale Sayers ('61), a great Eagle athlete, friend of the Central High School Foundation, and former Chicago Bears star, passed away September 22, 2020. Gale is considered one of the greatest running backs in the history of the National Football League and is the youngest person to ever be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame at age 34. He was a member of the Central High School Hall of Fame and was a proud supporter of Central High School and the Central High School Foundation until the end of his life.

Littleton Alston, Eagle parent and owner of Alston Art Studio, was selected by the Central High School Foundation as the sculptor to design and construct this bronze statue. The bronze statue, nearly 8-feet tall and weighing 1,400 pounds, is paired with a granite base that lists some of Sayers' accomplishments and honors.

## About the Endowment

The Senior Recognition Ceremony for the Class of 2023 was held on May 10, 2023 in the Central High School auditorium. This annual event is presented by Central High School, the Central High School Foundation, and the Central High P.E.P. to honor graduating seniors. Graduating seniors from the Class of 2023 earned a total of \$20.3 million in scholarship money to further their education.

The Scholarship Endowment Fund began in 1980 when a 1932 alum donated \$2,000. Then-principal Doc Moller immediately started to solicit money from various sources in order to guarantee the perpetual growth of the fund.

Today, the Central High School Foundation Scholarship Endowment has grown to nearly \$2 Million! Scholarship recipients are chosen by the Central High School Scholarship Committee on the basis of application, scholarship, citizenship, and need. Congratulations to all scholarship recipients!

## Class of 2023 Inductees



### SUSAN BREEDING Class of 1974

Breeding has worked as an Emmy Award-winning reporter and anchor in some of the nation's largest TV markets. She launched her career in Sioux City before advancing to a reporter job in Phoenix. There she won three regional Emmy awards, a UNL journalism alumni award, and was honored by Arizona's governor for outstanding service to the community. She then moved to the nation's second largest TV market in Los Angeles, where assignments ranged from covering disasters to interviews with A-list celebrities like Taylor Swift, Tom Hanks,

and George Clooney. In 2015, she was hired by Glendale, Arizona, where she is communications director. She is a 2023 Outstanding Woman in Business honoree from Phoenix Business Journal. She provided visionary leadership for 2023's Super Bowl LVII, overseeing communications for Glendale and serving the entire state on the AZ Super Bowl Host Committee's communications team. She also serves on the board of trustees for the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences, which is the governing body for the national Emmy awards.



### HUBERT "HUB" BROWN Class of 1976

Brown has made his mark in journalism as a TV reporter, anchor and producer and now as an educator of college journalists. Brown received his bachelor's and master's degrees in journalism from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He worked for 15 years for both commercial and public television stations covering state government and public affairs. He launched his teaching career at UNL in 1989

before moving in 1996 to Syracuse University, where he rose to associate dean of research, creativity, international initiatives and diversity. He was named dean of the University of Florida's College of Journalism and Communications in 2021. In 2016, he was honored with a service award from the Association for Journalism and Communication.



### GREGORY ERWIN Class of 1958

Erwin combined his legal skills and mind for business to make a mark on his hometown. After graduating at the top of his University of Nebraska law school class, he first worked in New York before returning to Omaha in 1974 and becoming the ninth partner at Kutak Rock. The securities lawyer was credited with inventing the publicly traded Master Limited Partnership, an innovative financing

vehicle that's widely used today. In 1984, he co-founded America First Companies, a novel, publicly traded fund of government-backed mortgages. In 1991, Greg won the contract for Omaha's municipal lottery. Big Red Keno expanded across Nebraska and became one of the nation's largest keno operators. Erwin died in March 2023 at age 82.



### DR. EDWARD FOGARTY Class of 1989

After graduating from the University of Chicago, Fogarty received his medical degree from UNMC and completed radiology residency at Creighton. As Chair of Radiology at the University of North Dakota he advanced multiple innovations in clinical imaging and medical education. Fogarty's neuroimaging collaboration with Professor of Emergency Medicine Paul Harch, MD at LSU has validated

hyperbaric medicine protocols for the reversal of subacute and chronic neurological injury, including dementia. In 2020, Dr. Fogarty received a Federal CARES ACT Grant to implement countermeasures against COVID19 based on the work of Central Alumnus Albert Crum, MD published in the journal *Antiviral Research*. Search "Hyperbaric Eden" for an Eagle's view of Fogarty's best medical photojournalism.



### BRUCE HOBERMAN Class of 1965

Bruce Hoberman co-founded Homer's Record Stores at the age of 24. Twenty-two years later he sold Homer's, spending the next 10 years working with non-profit organizations. Bruce and his wife became volunteers with USAID, spending over a year living in Sub-Saharan Africa helping develop small and medium size businesses. In 1986, Bruce graduated from Harvard Business School's OPM program for entrepreneurs. In 1988, he won the Business Excellence Achievement

Award from the UNL Business School Alumni Association. In 1991, he was named SBA's District II Business Person of the Year. In 2003, he co-founded Proxibid, serving as Chairman of the Board until the company was sold in 2020. Proxibid grew from a startup to become the largest online auction site in the world. Bruce also serves on the Board of Directors of the Buckle (BKE NYSE).



### RICHARD KASLOW Class of 1961

Dr. Richard Kaslow has directed ground-breaking federal and academic research into infectious diseases, including HIV. He graduated from Harvard Medical School and attained board certification in internal medicine, infectious disease, and preventive medicine. For 23 years with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the National Institutes of Health, he conducted cohort studies of HIV and other epidemiologic investigations. Thereafter, at the University of Alabama at Birmingham for 17 years, his teams identified genetic determinants of HIV, hepatitis B vaccine

response, and other conditions. As a senior executive at the Veterans Health Administration for the next five years, he oversaw work on epidemiologic issues ranging from pandemic preparedness to health effects of environmental exposure during deployment. He collaborated on more than 250 scholarly publications and continues to edit a widely used textbook on human viral diseases. Dr. Kaslow served as President of the American College of Epidemiology, and in 2009 the American Public Health Association recognized him with the John Snow Award for outstanding contributions to epidemiology.

### RACHEL TOMLINSON MINDRUP

A professional artist and art educator, Mindrup has used her talents to promote awareness and raise funds to fight the genetic disease Neurofibromatosis (NF). Mindrup received her master of fine arts from the Art Institution of Boston at Lesley University and also studied at the Art Academy of Los Angeles. Her life changed when her son was diagnosed with Neurofibromatosis (NF). Since the disease was little-known and received little research funding, she began painting portraits for people who donated to NF charities. Her

Deming, MD, endowed chair of medical humanities in Creighton University's School of Medicine, bringing together art and medicine. Mindrup's work has been shown nationally and internationally including the Queens Museum in Queens, NY, Creighton University, Georgia Regents University, Positive Exposure in NYC, Vanderbilt University and Washington University Medical School.



### RODNEY MULLEN Distinguished Educator

Mullen made his mark during 24 years at Central as an award-winning history teacher. After the OPS and UNO graduate joined Central in 1999, he showed dedication to both his profession and students. Particularly passionate about African-American history, he helped uncover lost history of Omaha's minority communities as part of the OPS Making Invisible Histories Visible program. Before

retiring in 2022, he was honored as Central's teacher of the year (2019), with the Alice Buffett Outstanding Teacher Award (2020) and History Nebraska's Excellence in Teaching Award (2022). "I know I'm not the smartest teacher, and I'm not the most gifted teacher, but I pride myself on being the hardest-working teacher," he said.



### HAROLD "ART" REYNOLDS Class of 1958

Reynolds served his country in the U.S. Marine Corps before retiring to mentor youth in California. As a senior at Central, Reynolds was a standout and leader on the school's state runner-up football team, state runner-up basketball team, and city champ baseball team, making for one of the most successful athletic years ever at Central. Reynolds then enlisted in the U.S. Navy. To be closer to the action,


he volunteered for the Marines. He served three combat tours in Vietnam, twice wounded and awarded Purple Hearts. He spent 23 years in the corps as a gunnery sergeant and drill instructor. Upon retirement, he coached and mentored youth in Santa Ana, California, including serving as a volunteer probationary counselor for at-risk youth.



### DAVID SLOSBURG Class of 1970

After graduating from the Wharton School at the University of Pennsylvania, Slosburg returned to Omaha to help expand the family real estate development company into one of the region's largest, with multifamily and commercial developments in six states. Slosburg has been an active contributor and advocate for significant civic developments including the Holland, Do Space, Steel House and the new City Library. Slosburg currently serves on the boards of the Omaha Symphony (Chairman), Heritage Omaha, Omaha Performing Arts (Vice Chairman) and National Committee for the

Performing Arts of the Kennedy Center. His extensive involvement with Central includes being both Principal initiator and Co-Chair of the committee that spearheaded fundraising for the Central library and arts addition. Slosburg also served as the Chairman of the Penn Alumni Committee in Omaha for 30 years. Honorariums include Inclusive Communities Humanitarian of the Year, Mary and Richard Holland Leadership Award, induction into the College Squash Association Hall of Fame, and he received the National "2013 Star of Touring Broadway Award" from the Broadway League.



### RICHARD ZACHARIA Class of 1961

Zacharia has been a prominent figure in Omaha accounting circles and a strong advocate for Central. After graduating from Penn's Wharton School of Business, he returned to Omaha, and in 1969 joined the firm now called Frankel Zacharia. He served as managing partner for 25 years and grew it into one of Nebraska's biggest independent firms. While at Penn he was Head Cheerleader, elected to Phi Kappa Beta Junior Honor Society, and elected to the Sphinx Senior Society. He served for 10 years on the state board of public

accountancy. After retiring in 2015, he received a distinguished service award from the state's society of CPAs. Zacharia has served as an active member and officer in the Central Alumni Association. He also has served as a volunteer and officer for several community organizations, including the Jewish Community Center Board of Directors, the Jewish Federation Board of Directors and the Johnny Rodgers' Jet Award Foundation.

## The Legacy of Carolyn K. Orr

**O**n the first day of class in 1962, students rushed the hill to Omaha Central High School. After locating their lockers and saying hello to friends they had not seen all summer, they filed into their first class of the semester. Some of those students entered the classroom of a teacher new to the capitol hill high school – Carolyn Kay Orr. That morning, in fact, was the start of a 34-year

long career as a business, typing, accounting, and marketing teacher at Central. Throughout her career, Carolyn would become known as the “teacher’s teacher,” dedicating her many years of service not only to the quality education of hundreds of students who passed under her tutelage, but also to the fellow educators who worked alongside her.

A native Nebraskan, Carolyn grew up on her family’s beloved farm outside Dakota City, Nebraska. Her parents, Jack and Charlotte Orr, had three girls: Jackie, Carolyn, and Sharon. She graduated from South Sioux City High School in 1955 and pursued her bachelor’s degree in education from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. While in undergrad she developed her love of education, music, and piano. She also became a member of Phi Beta Kappa in 1959.

After college, Carolyn began her teaching career in Beatrice, Nebraska. After three years teaching, in 1961, she returned to the University of Nebraska at Lincoln to earn her Master’s in Education. It was after she finished her master’s degree, in 1962, that she moved to Omaha

and began her career at Omaha Central. Carolyn held such a deep love and dedication to Central that she made it the home of her career, teaching 34 years before retiring in 1996.

During her years at Central, Carolyn dedicated considerable time to uplifting the educators she worked with. She was described as a “pillar” of the Business and Marketing Department. Understanding that public education is only as good as the quality of educators, she was known as someone who was ready to provide assistance, support, and encouragement to fellow teachers. Most notably, she organized the first Annual Teachers Luncheon at Central, a tradition which is still going strong today.

While at Central, Carolyn met her significant other, Jerome Gillogly, who taught American and World History for many years. Together, they lovingly cared for their pet dog, Gus, whom Carolyn called “her best friend.”

## A LOVE FOR CENTRAL

Carolyn held great love for her Central students and the community they created, not only within the walls of Central High School, but in the wider community as well. She was instrumental in forming the Central High School Alumni Association in 1996 and, in retirement, was a beloved client of many of her former students who became professionals in law, medicine, and other business professions. Seeing their progress and success firsthand brought her incredible joy.

Carolyn passed away on February 10, 2021, at Omaha Methodist Hospital from COVID-19 complications at the age of 83, and was survived by her five nieces and one nephew. In 2022, her estate established a scholarship to honor her love of music. An avid piano player herself, Carolyn wished for her estate to be used to assist in the education of Eagles who pursued degrees in music. This renewable \$20,000 scholarship will be awarded annually to an Eagle who will study music as a part of their post-secondary degree.

Through Carolyn’s generous commitment to Central High School – both in life and in legacy – her spirit will continue to live on in the lives of generations of Eagles to come. 🦅

## Giving Society Levels

### **EAGLE SOCIETY** \$500,000+ Plaza

The Eagle stands for leadership, strength, courage, wisdom, and knowledge. After originally being known as the Hill Toppers and the Purple and Whites, the Eagle became the mascot in 1926. The Eagle has soared over Central for the past 95 years and provides a majestic focal point for Omaha's oldest and finest high school.

### **NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY** \$250,000+ Walkway

The National Honor Society was formed in 1919 after a proposal by principal J.G. Masters. Within the proposal, character, leadership, scholarship and service were chosen as the "fundamental virtues most worthy of encouragement" in young people. Central is the second NHS chapter chartered.

### **REGISTER SOCIETY** \$100,000+ Garden

*The Register*, Central's student newspaper, is the oldest continuously published high school student newspaper west of the Mississippi River. The first issue of the paper was dated December 2, 1886. *The Register* has been recognized throughout the decades as one of the finest high school newspapers in the country.

### **ROAD SHOW SOCIETY** \$50,000+ Pier

The first Road Show was produced in 1914 and quickly became a favorite Central tradition. This talent show annually showcases the diverse and unique talents of Central students. Past and present Road Show acts that have entertained generations of Eagles include music, comedy, acting, dancing and so much more.

### **EAGLE BATTALION SOCIETY** \$25,000+ Bench

The Military Science program at Central began in 1892, predating the JROTC program. It became the most popular activity at the school, and at one point all male students were required to participate. Today, the Eagle Battalion continues to be recognized as one of the finest JROTC programs in the country.

### **STYLEBOOK SOCIETY** \$10,000+ Plaza Paver

In 1921, English department chair Sara Vore Taylor copyrighted her Stylebook for Theme Writing and Revision. Her creation provided for a common language for writing instruction that is the foundation of Central's unique writing curriculum. Students still revise their themes using the Stylebook.

### **O-CLUB SOCIETY** \$5,000+ Walkway Paver

Organized in 1920, Central's O-Club was created with the purpose of intensifying school spirit and promoting good sportsmanship. Still in existence today, every Friday O-Club members wear their purple cardigans or pullover sweaters with the distinctive letter "O" to show their school spirit.
