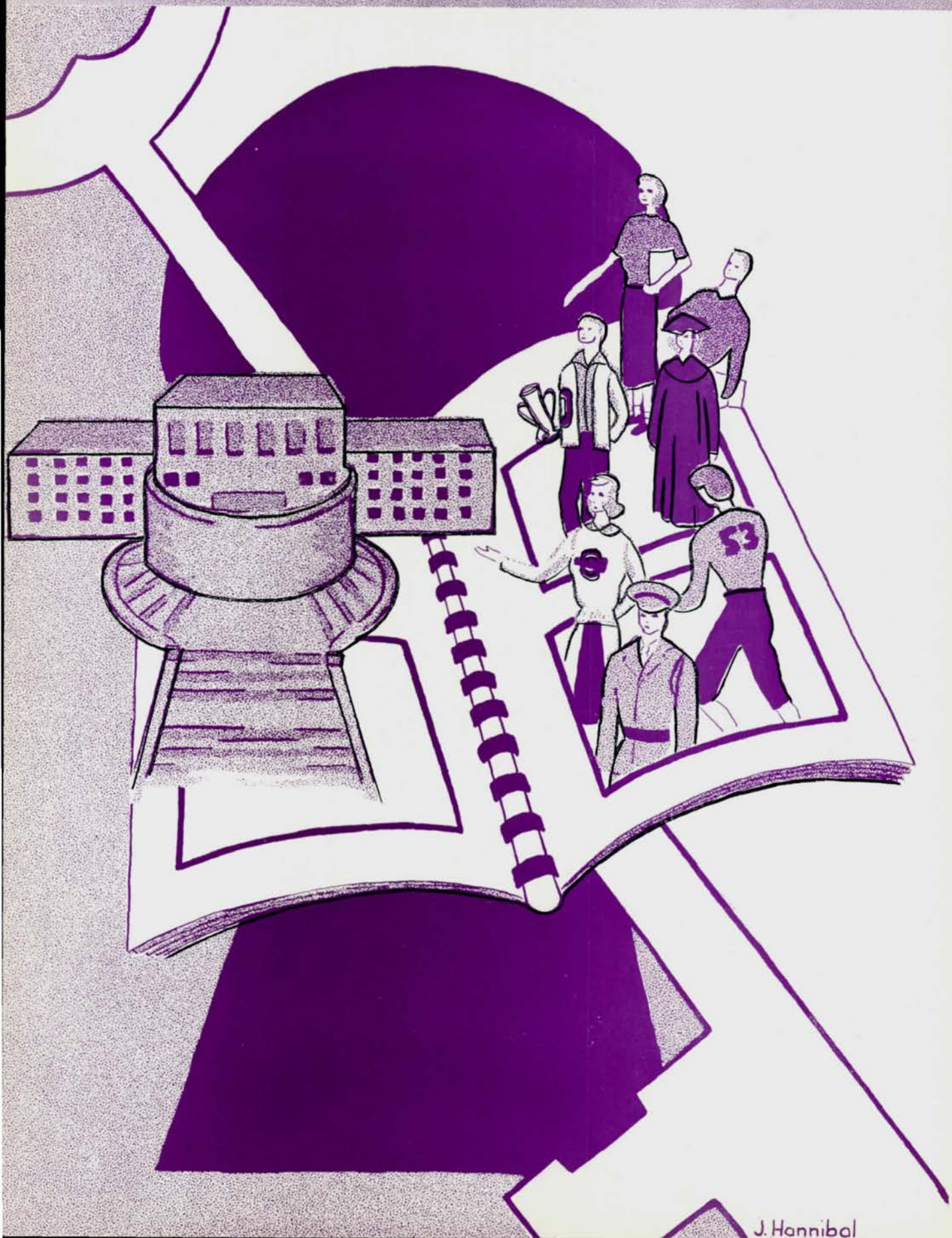


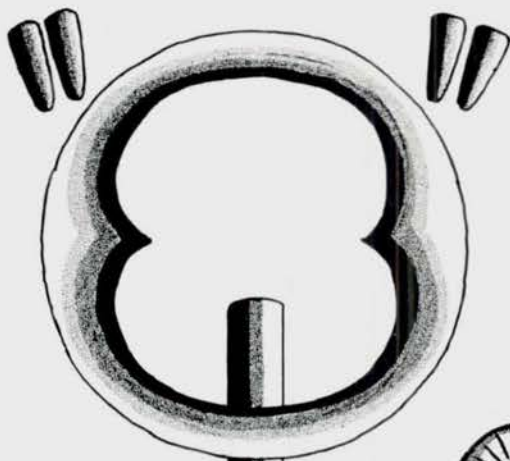

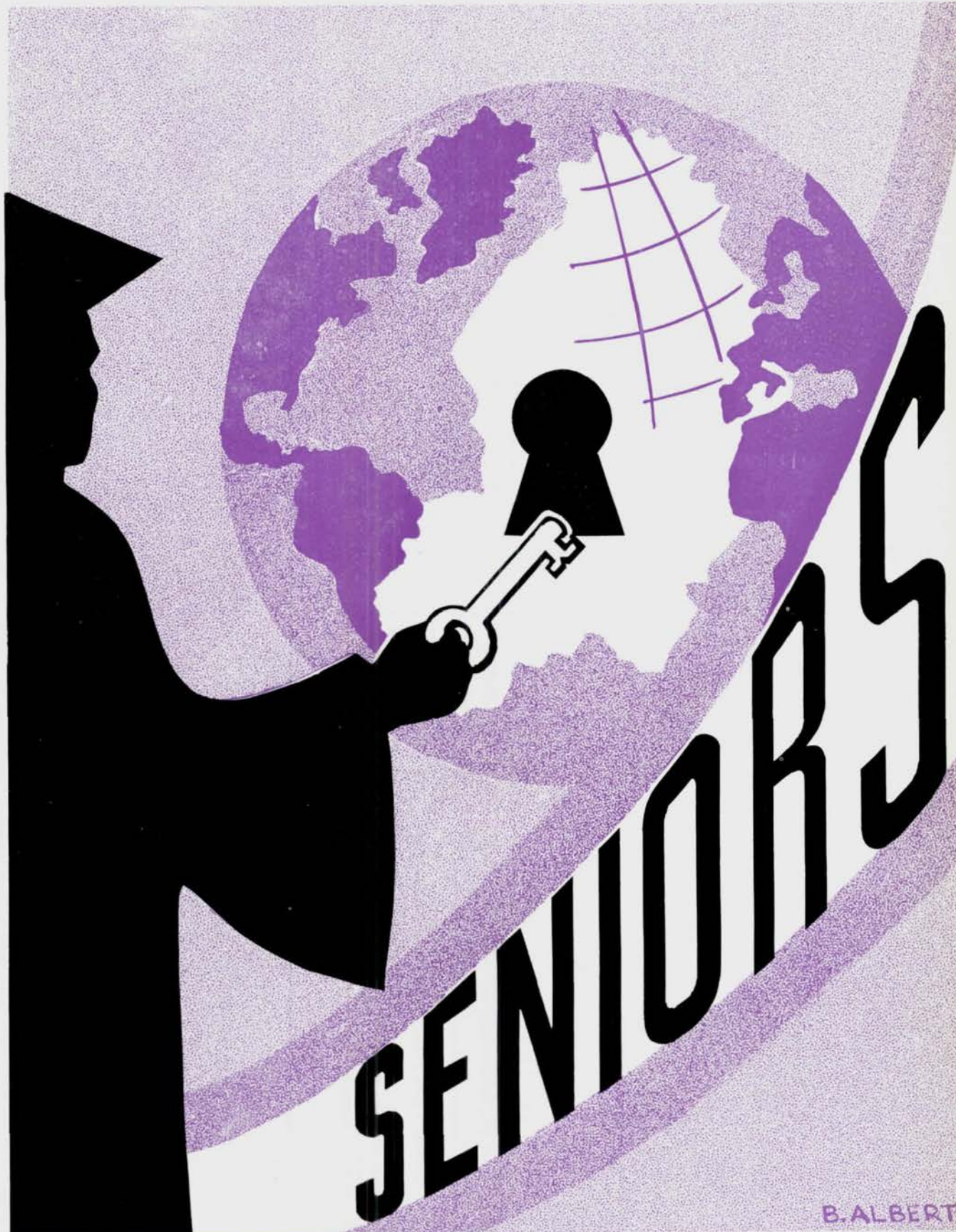

Honor Societies

The Junior Honor society, founded in 1923 by J. G. Masters, former Central High principal, is one of the highest goals for which underclassmen may strive. Its purpose is the recognition of individuality and high achievement in both scholarship and school activities, the encouragement of leadership and the development of character. Three chapters—Epsilon for freshmen, Delta for sophomores and Gamma for juniors—compose the society.

Each year a committee under the chairmanship of a faculty member selects those on the Junior Honor society. This year 90 girls and 69 boys were elected to the various chapters. The junior group with 54 members was the largest; the freshman and sophomore classes each named 52 to the society.

Active membership in the society ceases at the end of one year, but graduates who have belonged to the Junior Honor society are considered honorary members.

The National Honor society honors those seniors who have good scholastic records and who are active in school enterprises.

Every spring a committee with Principal J. Arthur Nelson as chairman meets to elect those seniors from the upper third of the class who are best qualified for membership in the society. The committee considers what the seniors have achieved in their years at Central in both scholarship and in willingness to help fellow schoolmates and teachers. The number chosen is restricted to 15 per cent of the senior class.

Student Council

The Central High School Student council was organized in 1939 to exchange ideas among students, to create a friendlier relationship between students and faculty members, to crystalize student opinion and to encourage student participation in the school's extra-curricular activities.

The council is comprised of 18 outstanding students—five seniors, five juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen—elected by the individual classes. Elections for the 14 upperclass members of the 1952-1953 group were held last year, while the freshmen delegates were elected early this fall. In order to qualify for membership in the council, a student must maintain a "2" average and file a petition signed by 50 members of his class.

The officers—Alfred Curtis, president;

Annie Lou Haried, vice-president; Patsy Gordon, secretary; Kaywin Tomes, treasurer, and Kay Jorgensen and Eugene Zweiback, sergeants-at-arms — were elected from the council by its members. The president leads council meetings and school assemblies, the vice-president conducts homeroom representative assemblies, the secretary takes minutes of the council meetings and the treasurer works with O. J. Franklin, school treasurer, in charge of all ticket sales and financial matters. The Student council members also ushered at school productions and sponsored the annual all-girls' party.

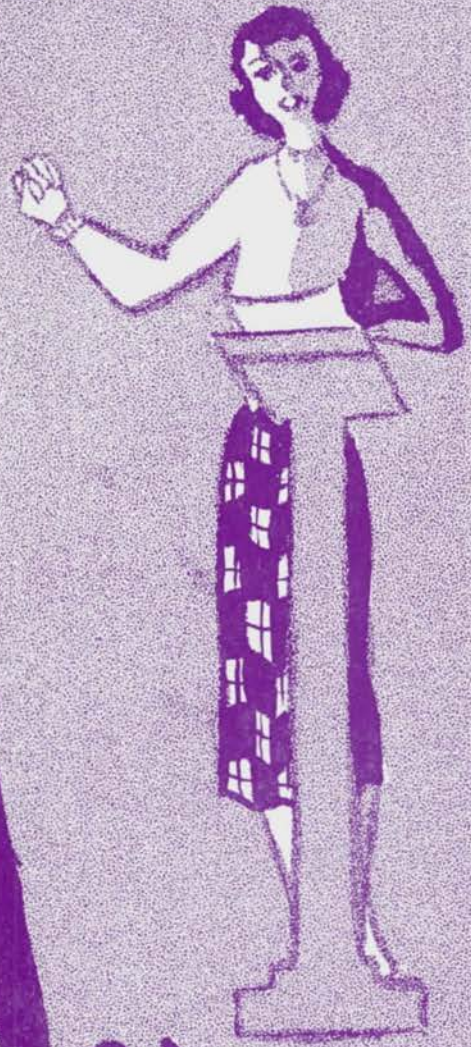

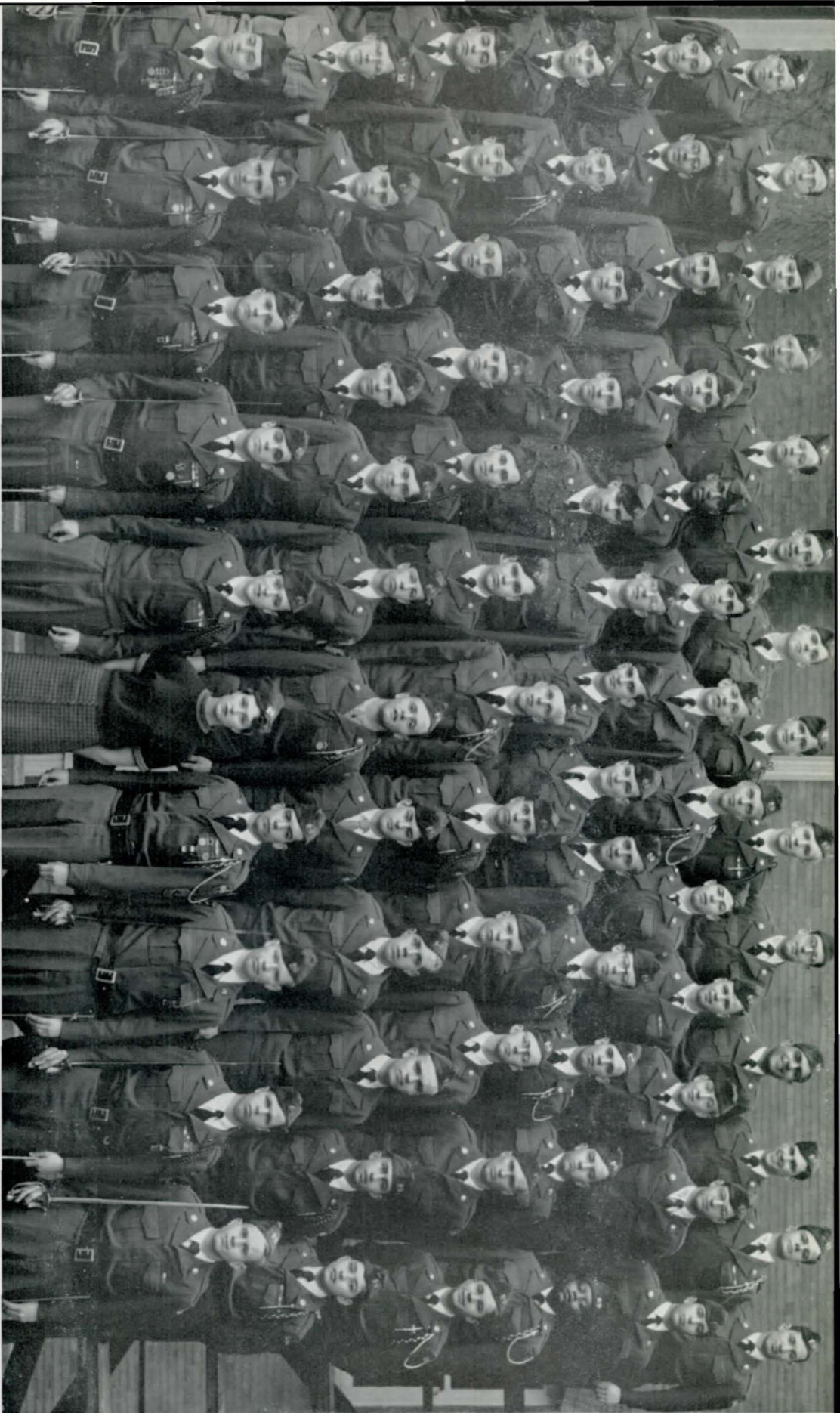

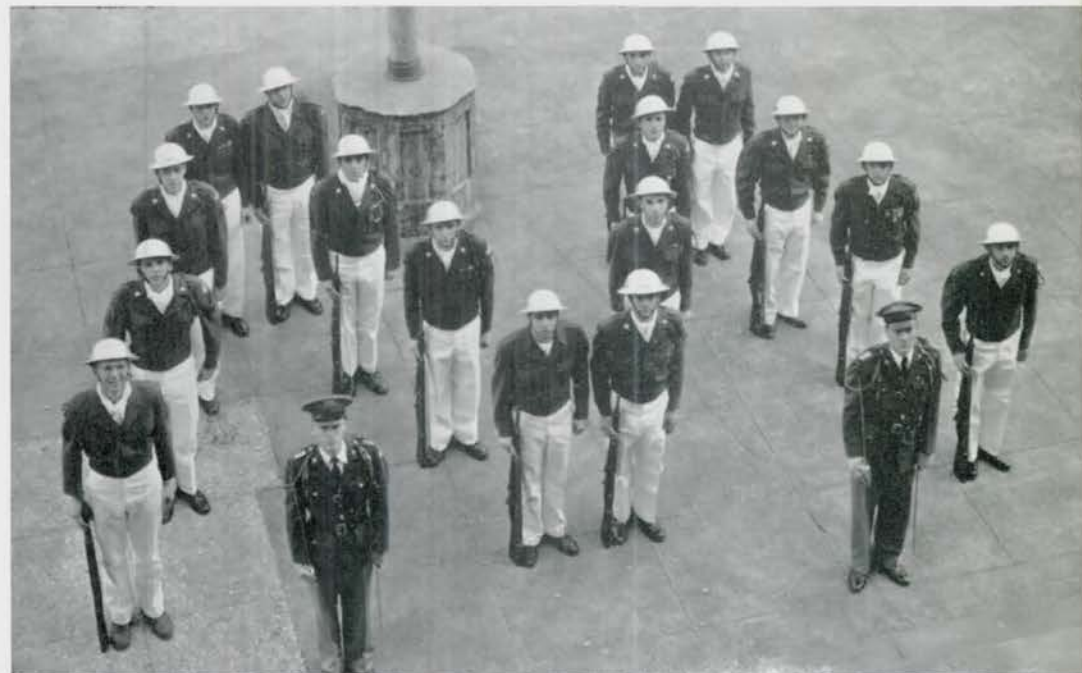
1953 Crack Squad, under the super-

In addition to school performances the choir participated in the All-City music festival January 17 and in the University of Omaha music clinic in April. The group also sang selections from the Road Show music on television.

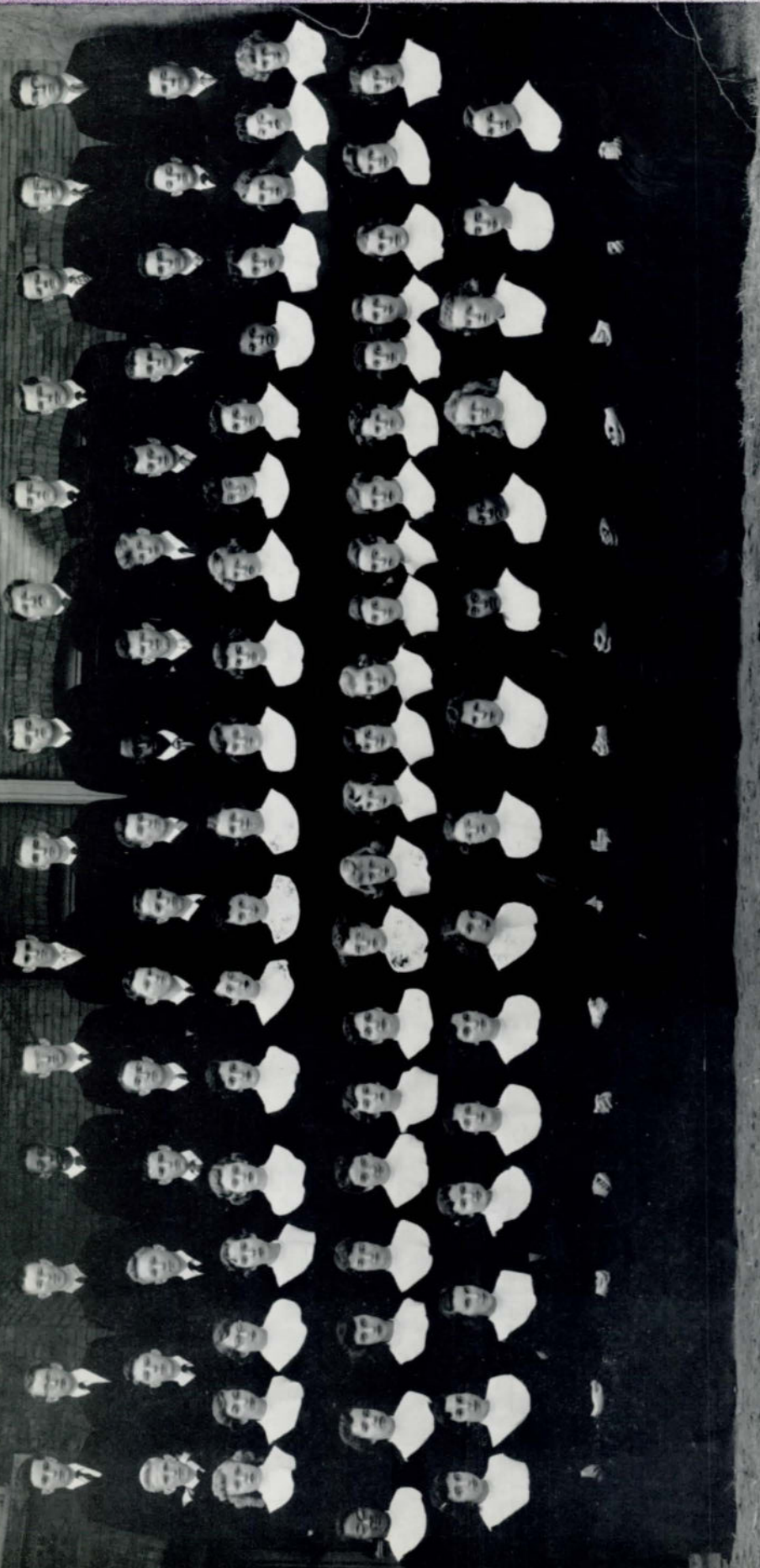
