National Honor Society was originated by Joseph G. Masters, a former Central principal. In 1921 he suggested to the National Association of Secondary Principals that a society be set up to honor outstanding seniors in each graduating class.

Since then, remarkable seniors in all 48 states, Canal Zone and American schools in South America and China are honored by this selection.

Each spring a committee of Central High teachers and the principal, J. Arthur Nelson, meet to consider all seniors on the basis of scholarship, leadership, service and character. A select group of students, not to exceed the upper 15 per cent of the class, is then elected to the society.

The 33 students listed were chosen early in the spring; 14 of these competed in the National Scholarship Examination given March 20. Approximately 20 students were selected later.

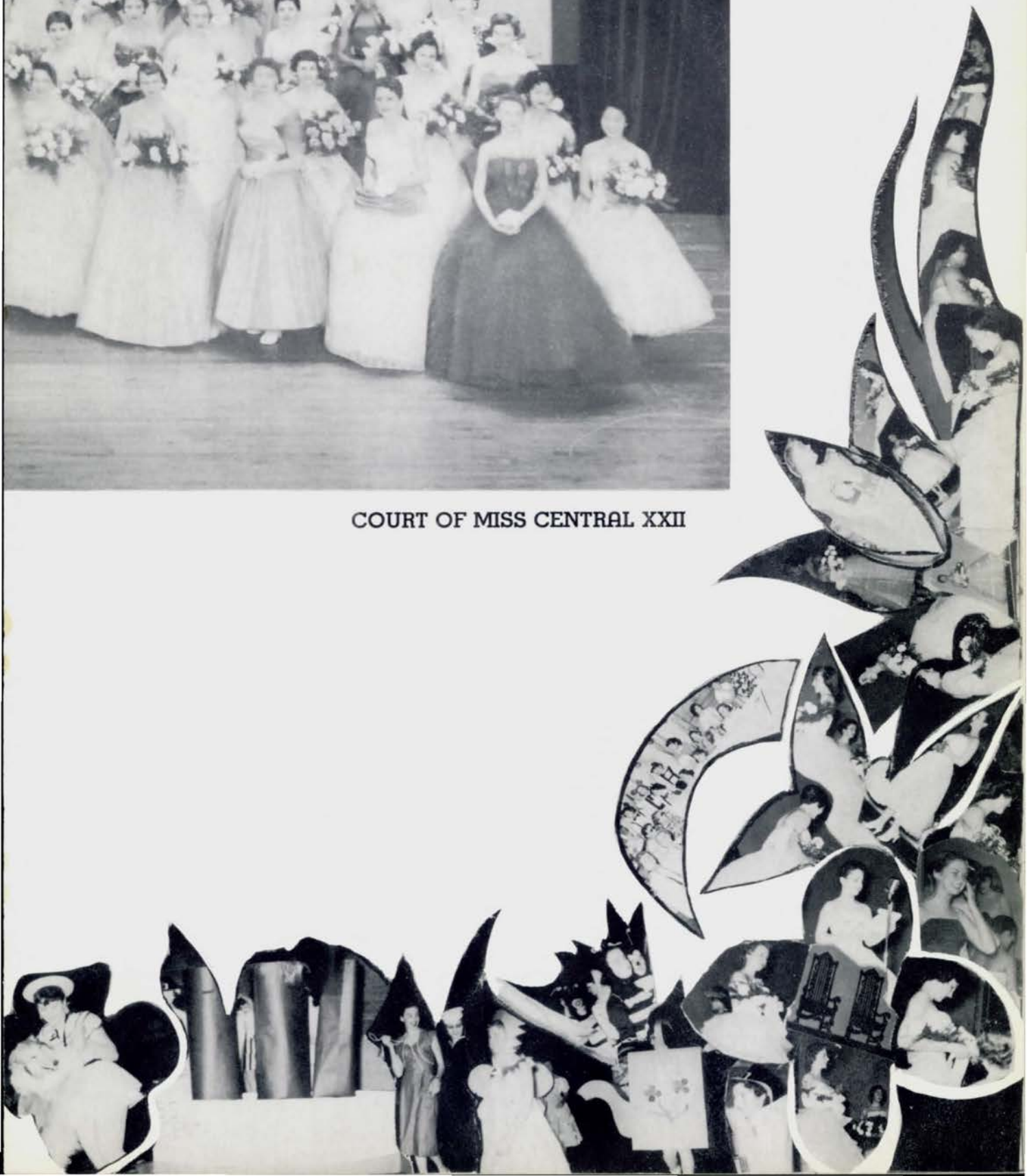

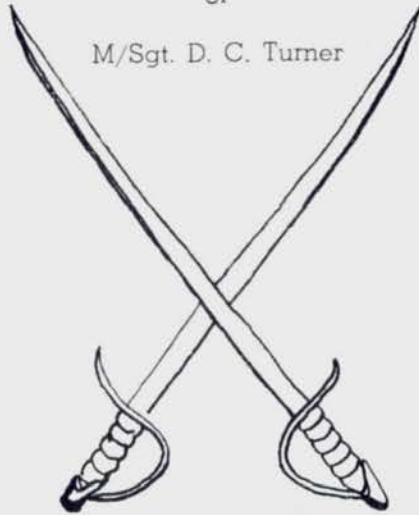

Crack Squad

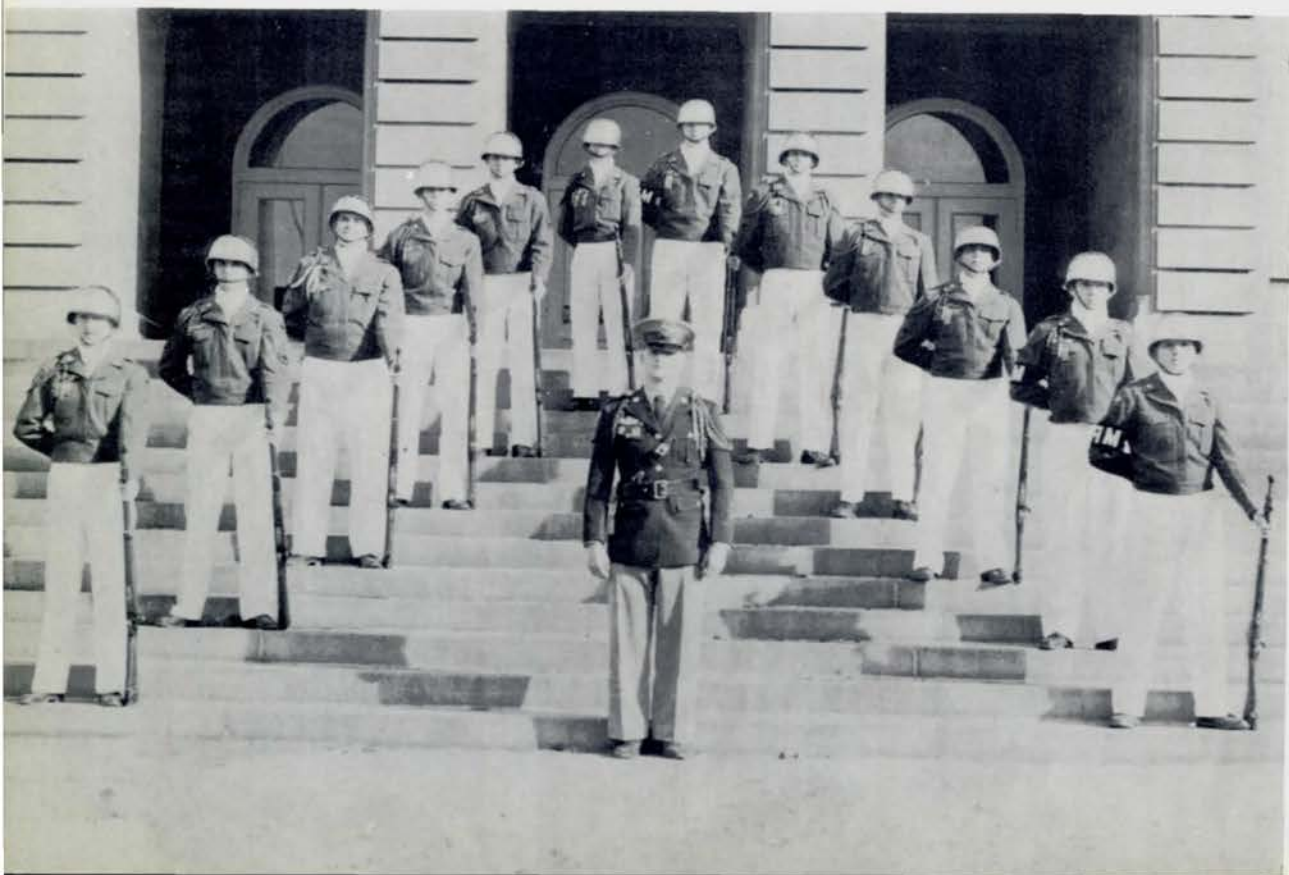

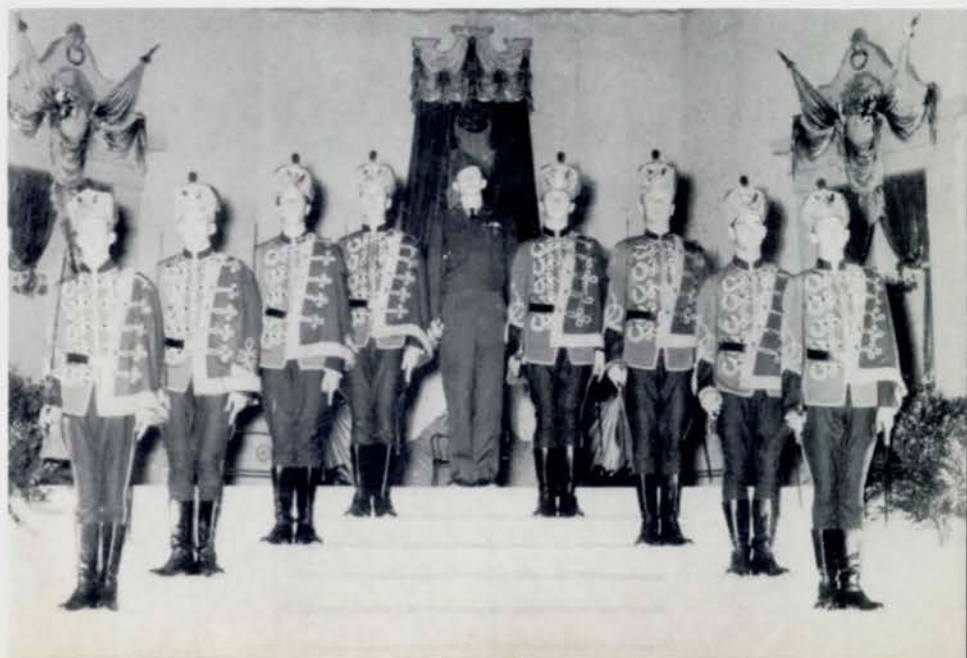

Lora Franklin, concert master of Central's orchestra, was one of the four city concert-masters when the Omaha high schools com-

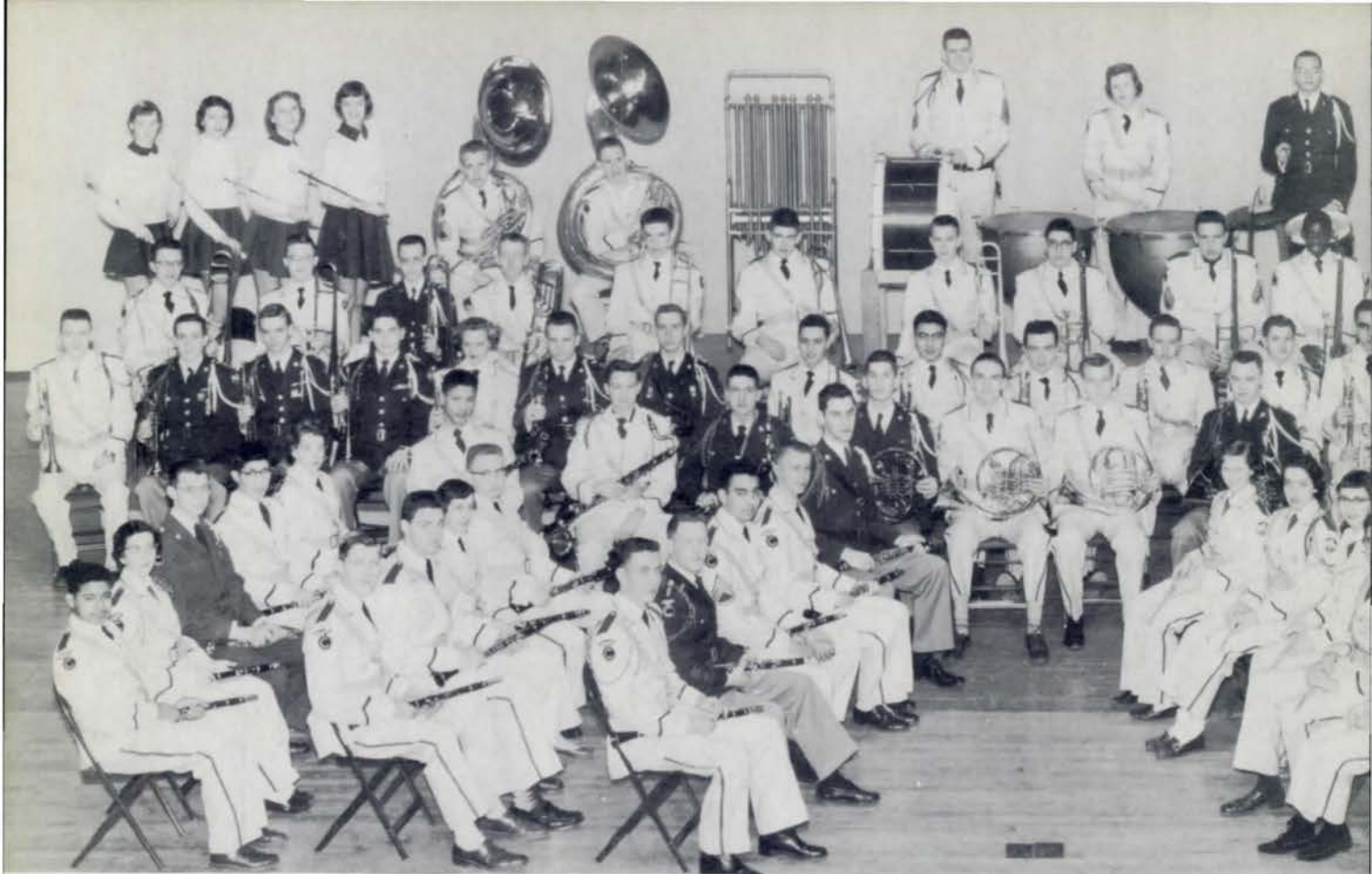
bined for the All-city music festival held in the civic auditorium.

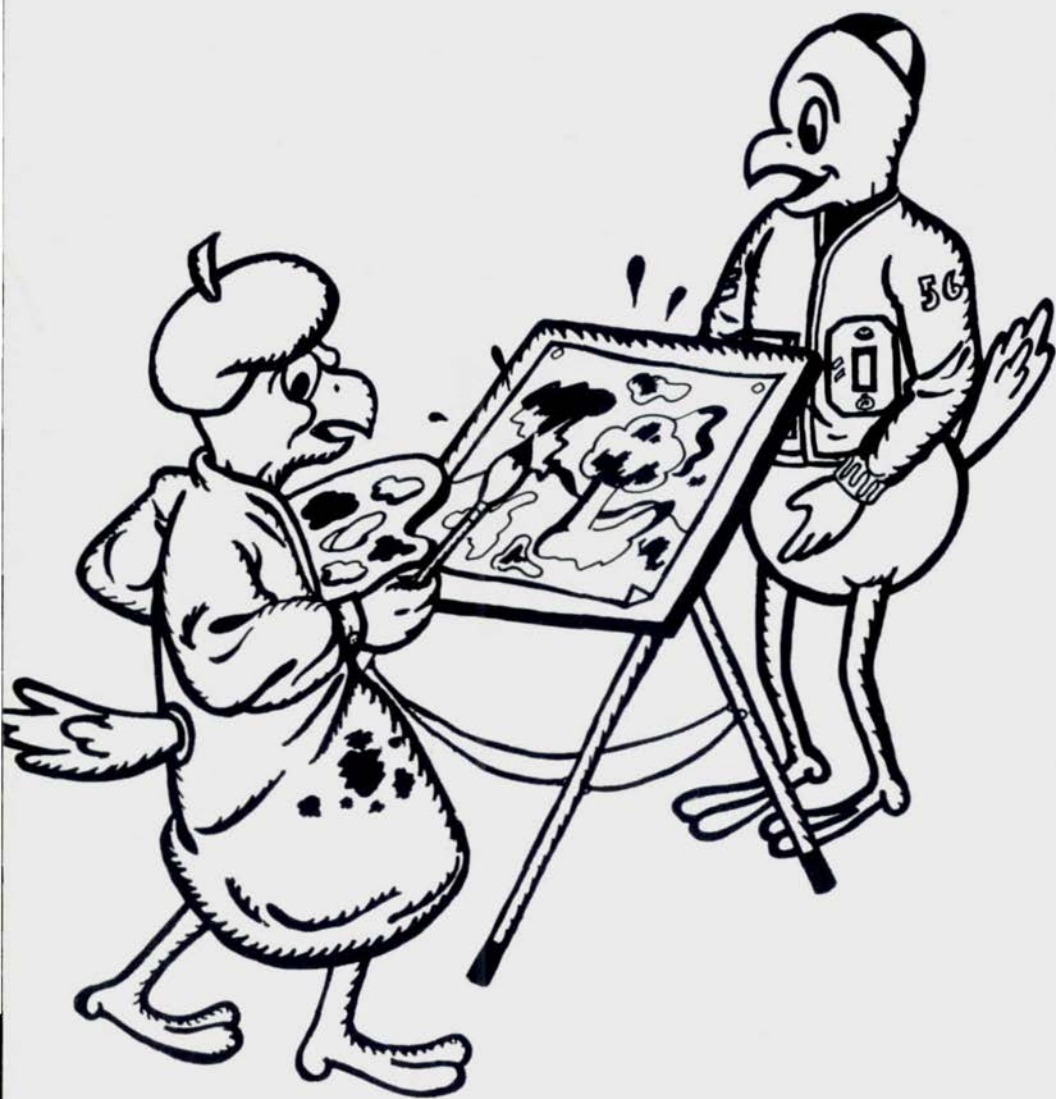

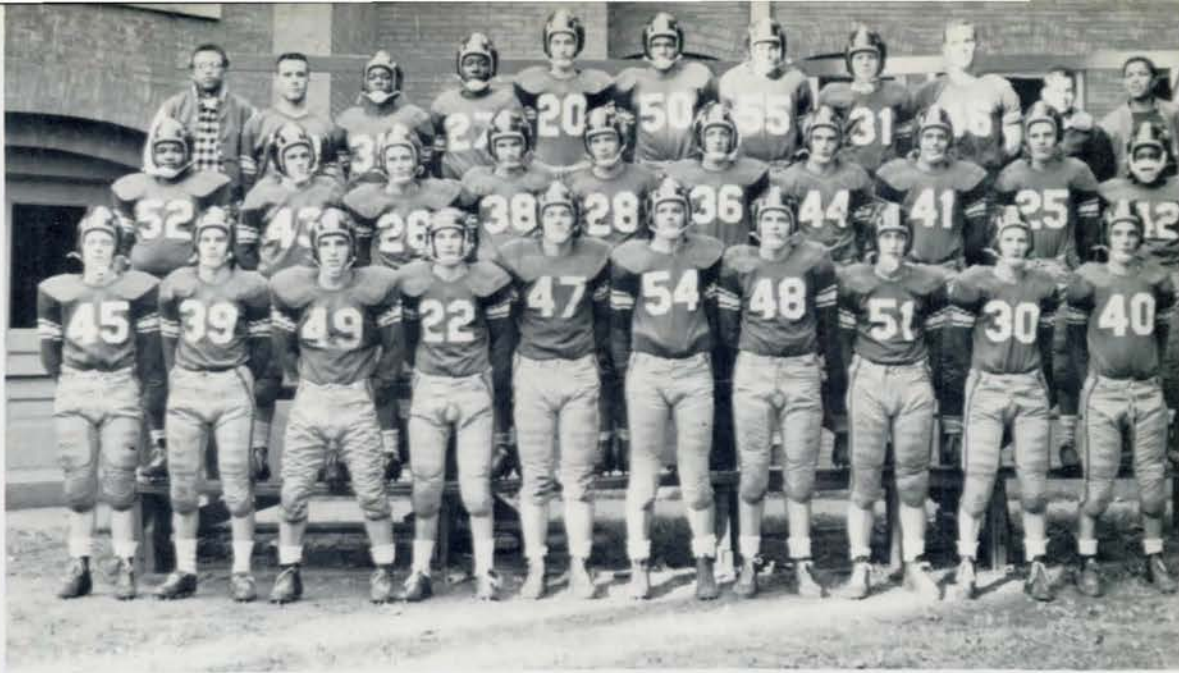

Central athletes are now looking to the future. After years of defeat, the Eagles developed into a basketball power with an 11-4 record, finishing second to South in both Inter-city and State standings.

Tabbed by many as the best-balanced squad in the city, the Marquissmen won six of their last seven contests.

The team, with a starting five of Wally Bryans, Dennis "Moon" Mullins, Bob O'Toole, Larry Carmody and Phil Barth, played with the confidence and aggressiveness lacking in the past. Only the 54-50 loss to South, who was

defeated once by Central, kept the team from the city title.

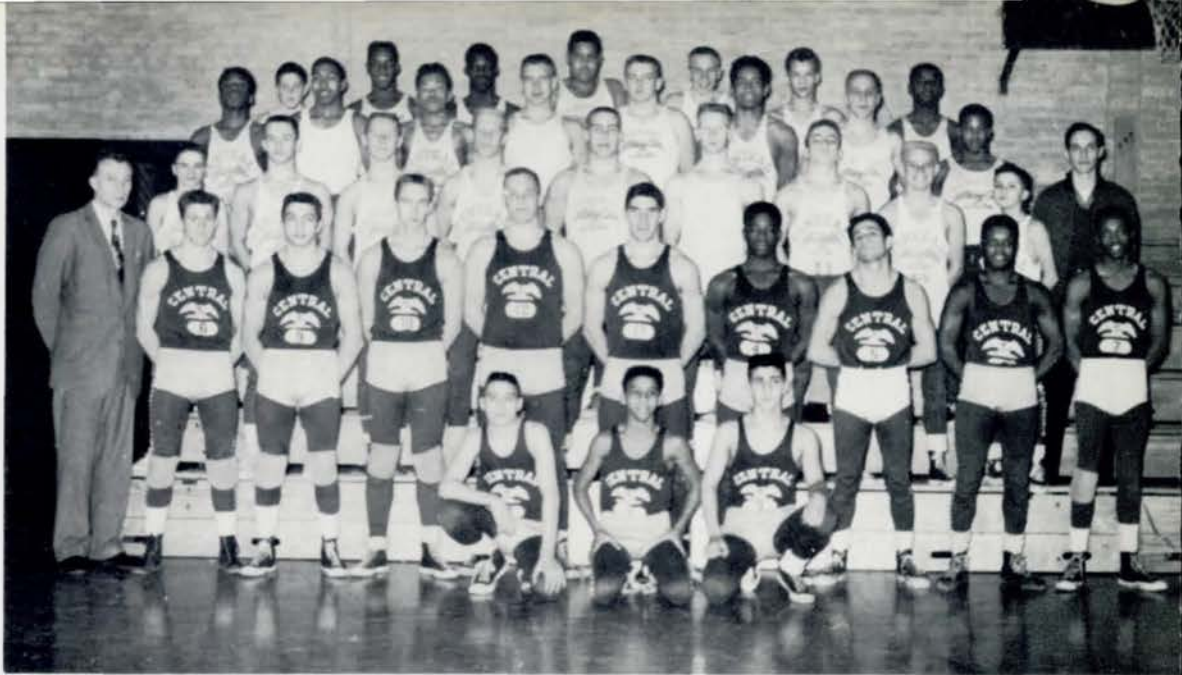

After winning 42 consecutive dual matches and garnering two state crowns in a row, Central wrestlers saw their domination in the mat sport ended by a powerful South squad.

Further indication that Central's strong arm was losing its grip—the team finished second to South in the pre-season tournament, the North High Invitational. Following victories 41 and 42 against Tech and AL, Central was jarred by a mediocre North squad when several wrestlers failed to make weight. Dropping only two other matches, both to South, the Eagles closed the season with a 7-3 record in the Inter-city league.

Coached by Norman Sorensen, Bill Hudgins, Louie Miloni and Jim Goermar won coveted individual state champion trophies at the State Tourney held at Central. The team again finished second to South in total scoring.

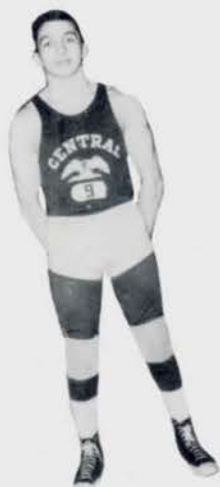
