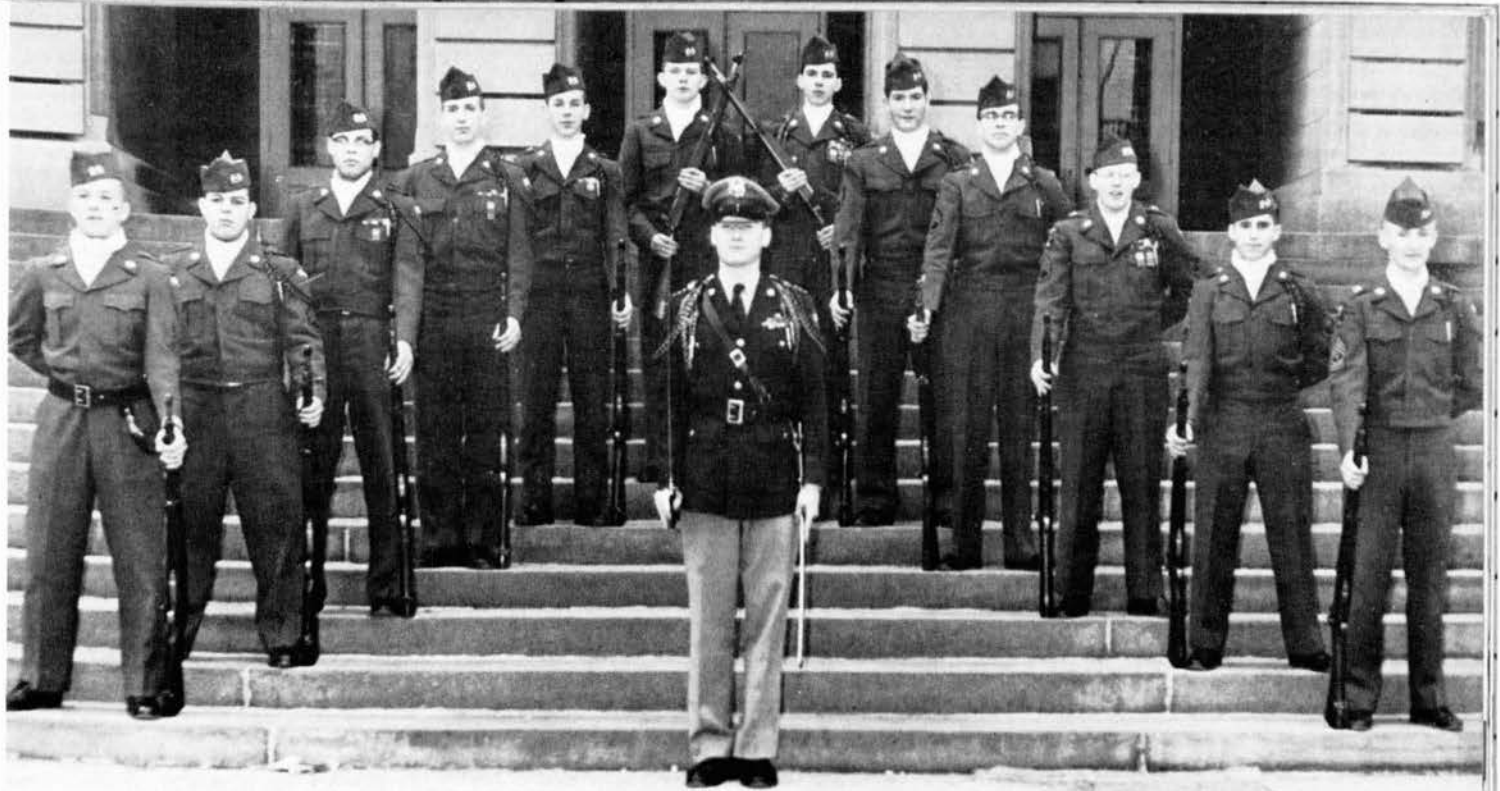

Math Club

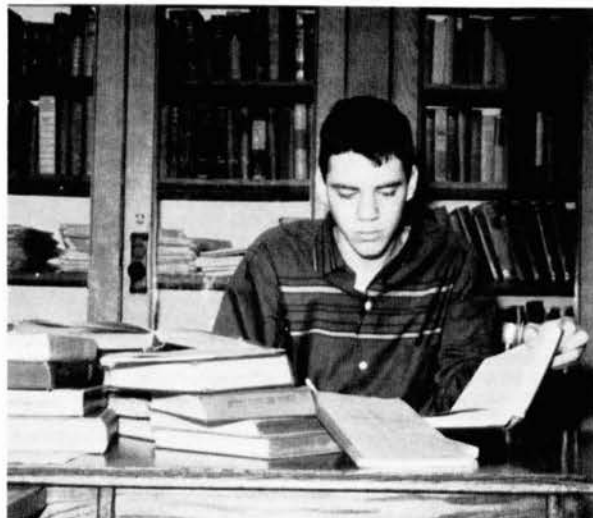

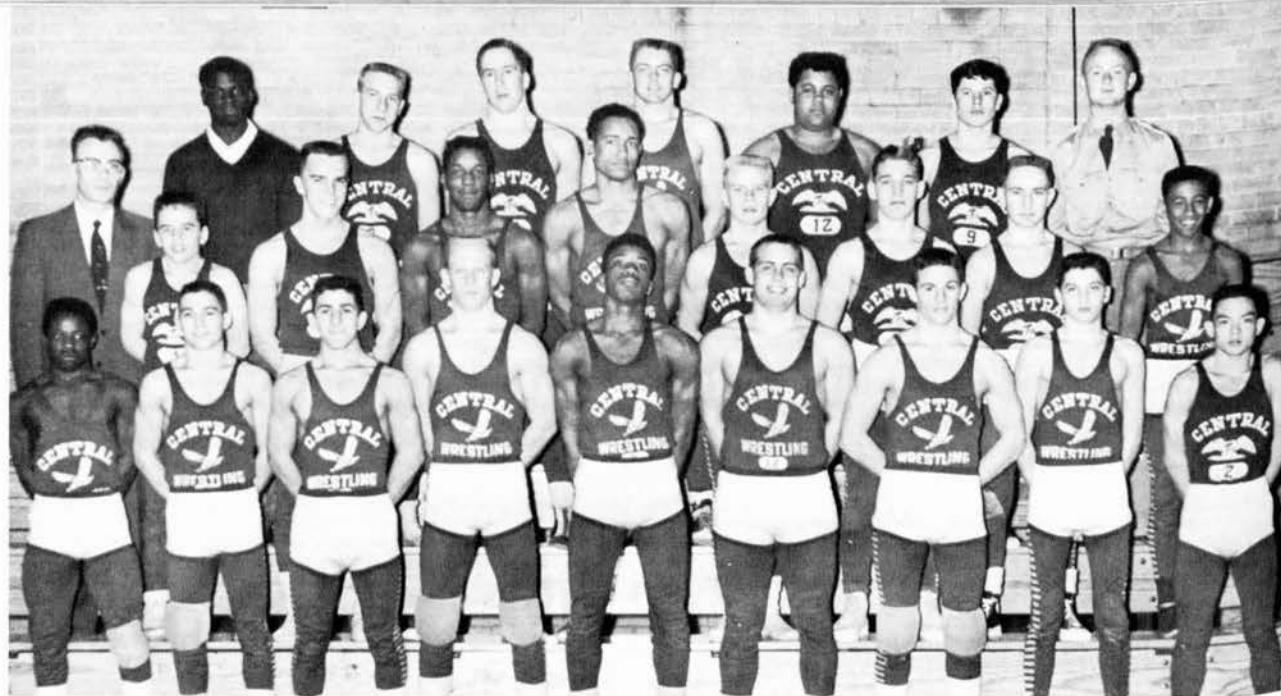

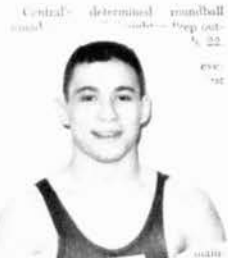
