Girls' Choir



"So many funny things happened during the opera," commented one member of the cast of "Kiss Me Kate."


According to other cast members, the opera was "a blast," "fantabulous," "a riot," "a hound" or in simpler terms, "fun."

Talent . . . sincere effort . . . inspiration —these three qualities, as stated in the A Cappella Choir creed, make every choir performance outstanding and memorable.




Hussars


Central's rifle team competes with sharpshooters from the various schools in the area.



The slaves served gallinae parae (cornish hen), pais et mel (bread and honey), mala (apples), and other types of food which the Romans ate long ago.


To make the banquet more authentic,


Hi-Y certainly has lived up to its motto, "Renovating with Central." Hi-Y has not only enlarged its scope of activities but also doubled its membership this year.

Activities include meetings at the YMCA twice a month, inter-city basketball games, parties, attendance by eleven boys at the Lincoln model legislature and competitive bowling.




Then at midseason a lack of depth began to show. Second half rallies by Tech, Benson and Creighton Prep dropped the Eagles out of contention.







The 1959-60 version of Central's wrestling team had difficulty breaking the bonds of defeat and stumbled to its second consecutive losing season.


With a 2-4 league mark, Coach Norman Sorenson's mat crew finished fourth in the six-team Intercity conference.


Bottorff's conquest marked the 20th consecutive season that Central has had a state mat king.






When the basketball campaign came to a close, the Eagle cagers were perched on the fourth slot in the state rankings.
