



We, the members of the yearbook staff, dedicate this edition to Mr. Duane M. Perry, former mathematics instructor and Head of the Central High School Math Department.


During his years of teaching, Mr. Perry exhibited both the ability of communication


It is, then, to Mr. Duane M. Perry, and in gratitude of his service at Central High School, that we dedicate this, the 1964 O-Book.








# Reserve Officers Training Corps


Quarterback Rick Peterson and Guard Dean Hokanson were honored for their leadership and sportsmanship at a Kiwanis Club luncheon.





With only one of last year's starters returning, Coach Warren Marquiss built a team which finished seventh in state and sixth in the Intercity League.

The courtmen dropped their first four tilts, but they gained valuable experience which enabled them to develop into a strong ball club.

The young team demonstrated its potential as it placed third in the Intercity Holiday Tournament. Junior Arthur Allen was named to the Holiday Tournament team.

Beginning with the February 1 victory over Thomas Jefferson High School, the Eagles were a new ball team. They piled up six consecutive victories, including an upset over Creighton Prep, rated the number one team in Nebraska.

The World Herald took notice of the improvement when junior Greg Butler was named Cager of the Week.

The 67-62 victory over Bishop Ryan in the District tournament insured Central of receiving a runner-up trophy. The Eagles missed going to State by a mere four points as the cagers lost to Boys' Town 63-59.

Two Central players earned post-season honors. Junior Arthur Allen, 6-1, whom the World Herald said could out-jump 6-7 Wally Anderzunas, landed a spot on the Intercity team. Sophomore James Hunter received honorable mention.

Central's varsity basketball team consisted of high scorers. Among Greg Butler, Arthur Allen, and James Hunter 549 points were tallied.

Since all but one starter is returning, Central should be in contention for the title in the new Metropolitan League. However, Coach Marquiss will have to find a replacement for James Grigsby, 6-3, Central's tall man who is graduating.



The Eagles placed fourth at the State Meet. Dennis Tibbetts broke the record in the butterfly event with a time of 55.8 seconds.
