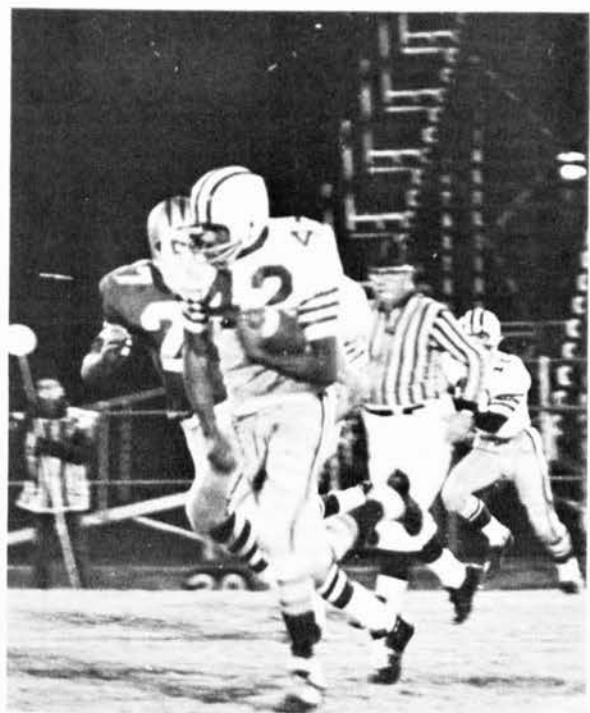

Boys' and Girls' State

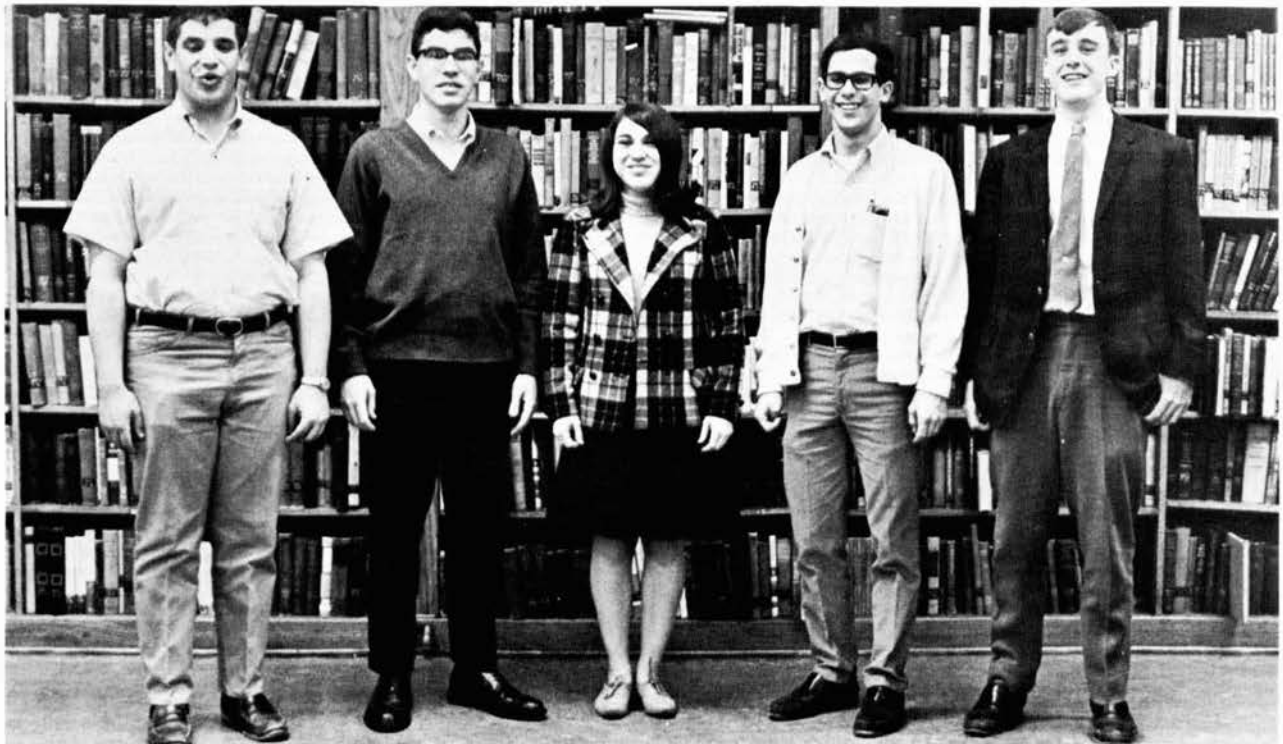
Boys' and Girls' State is an annual institute in American government, sponsored by the American Legion. It was held June 11, 1966, through June 17, on the University of Nebraska campus.

Seventeen Central High students qualified as finalists in the National Merit scholarship competition this year. The students were chosen on the basis of their scores in the National Merit Test taken in March of 1966. Actual scholarship winners will be chosen from the group of finalists without regard to financial need.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation was established in 1955 on grants from the Ford Foundation and the Carnegie Corporation. Central's Phyllis Weinroth ranked first among all participants in the state of Nebraska.

Through Debate, interested Central students are first taught to think logically, to research the debate topics carefully, to organize their material, and to speak with poise. They then enter into competition with other schools in both local and national tournaments consisting of twenty to fifty teams.

This year's Debate Team, composed of thirty students coached by Mr. Ronald McGuire, entered in twenty-five tournaments, including the William Chrisman Tournament, the Creighton Prep Classic, the Worthington Invitational, and the Nebraska State Debate Tournament. The team finished the season successfully with an eighty per cent winning record.

Math Team

Central High's Math Team, coached by Miss Virginia Pratt, consists of the forty-four members of the Experimental Math class. This class attempts to broaden the mathematical horizon of these students by extending normal classroom subjects and by exploring subjects, such as the Numbers Theory, not usually taught in high school math courses. It also teaches the students to make quick, accurate decisions while working under pressure, an important factor in test-taking.

One of the most important events of the year for Math Team was the National High School Mathematics Contest. Other activities of the Math Team included participation in the Creighton Mathematics Field Day and the Intra-City Math Contest, in which Central placed second.

Concert Band

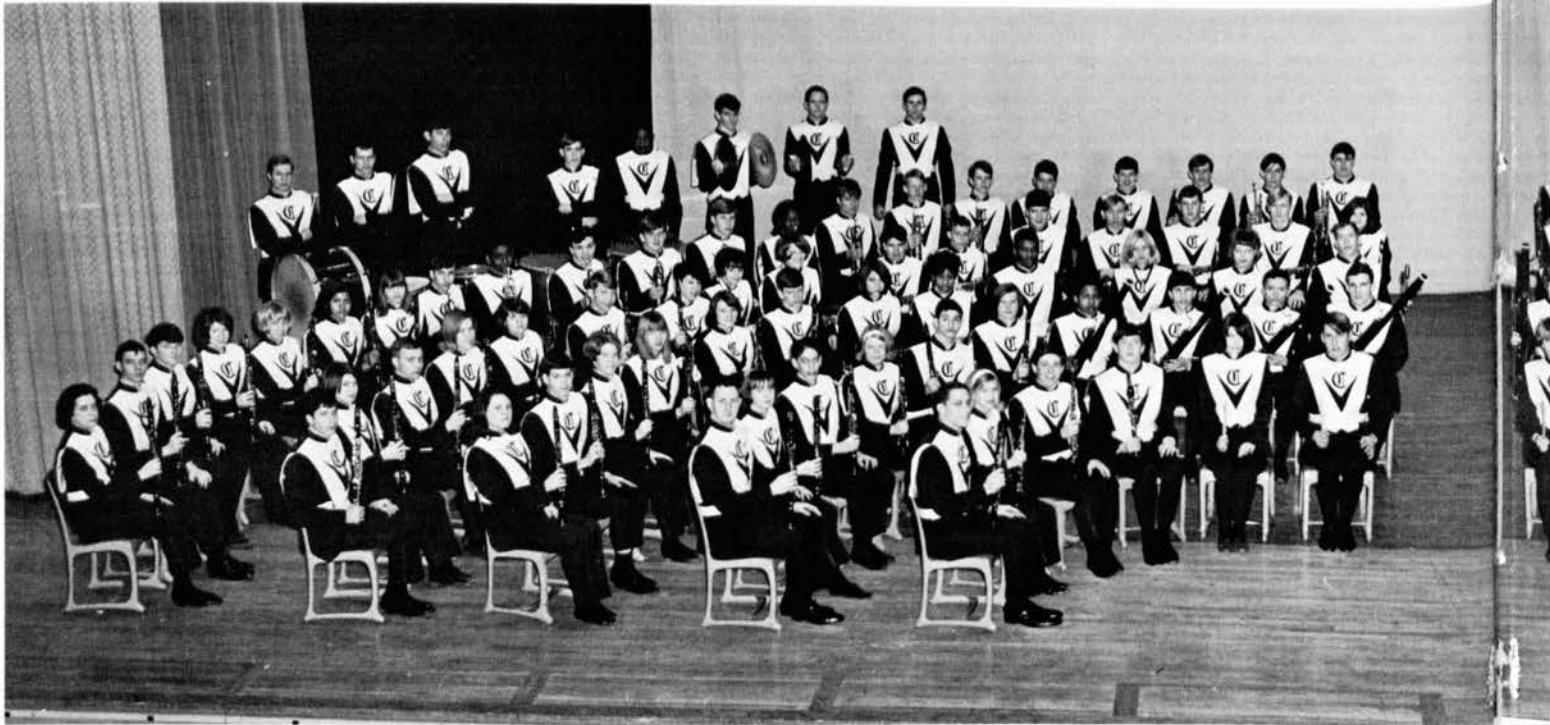

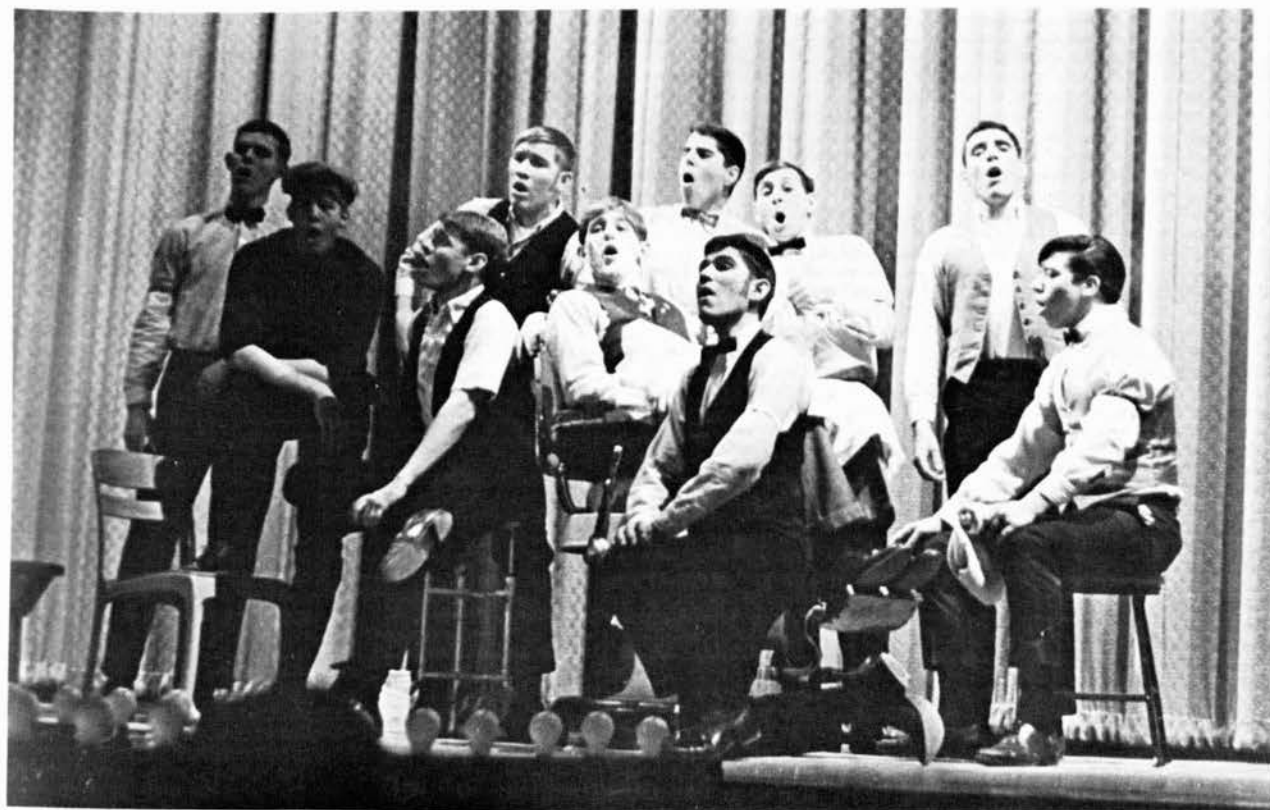

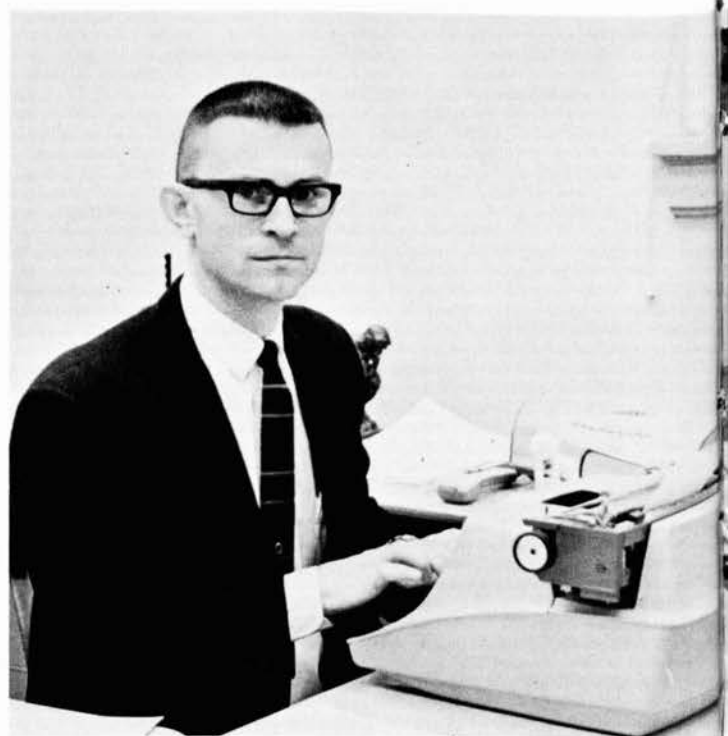


J. ARTHUR NELSON

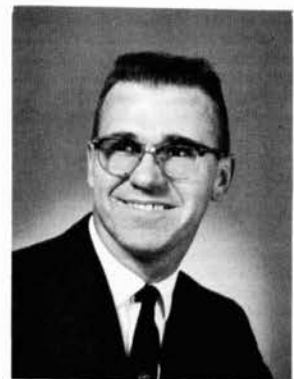

For the first time in four years, the Eagles finished in the upper-half of the National Division taking 2nd place honors. Head Coach Pat Salerno and his assistants, Thomas Dineen and Ken Allen, were responsible for the improvement in Central football status.

The Eagles experienced a case of first game jitters as Bellevue racked up 21 points in the first half. Late in the half, Central had a scoring threat, but time ran out for the Eagles. Final: Bellevue 21-Central 0.

Central routed South by a score of 40-0 in the second game of the season. The Eagles displayed a fine combination of aerial and ground assaults. Willie Frazier, Bob Gilmore, Elmer Reeves, Howard Starks, and Steve Watts all scored touchdowns.

A fumble and a blocked punt proved to be the downfall of the Eagles against North as the Vikings defeated Central 26-6. The Eagles lone score came on a 5 yard run by Tony Ross.

A fumble recovery and a great de-

fensive stand helped Central defeat Burke 27-6. The Eagles' touchdowns were scored by Reeves, Gilmore, Orduna, and Frazier.

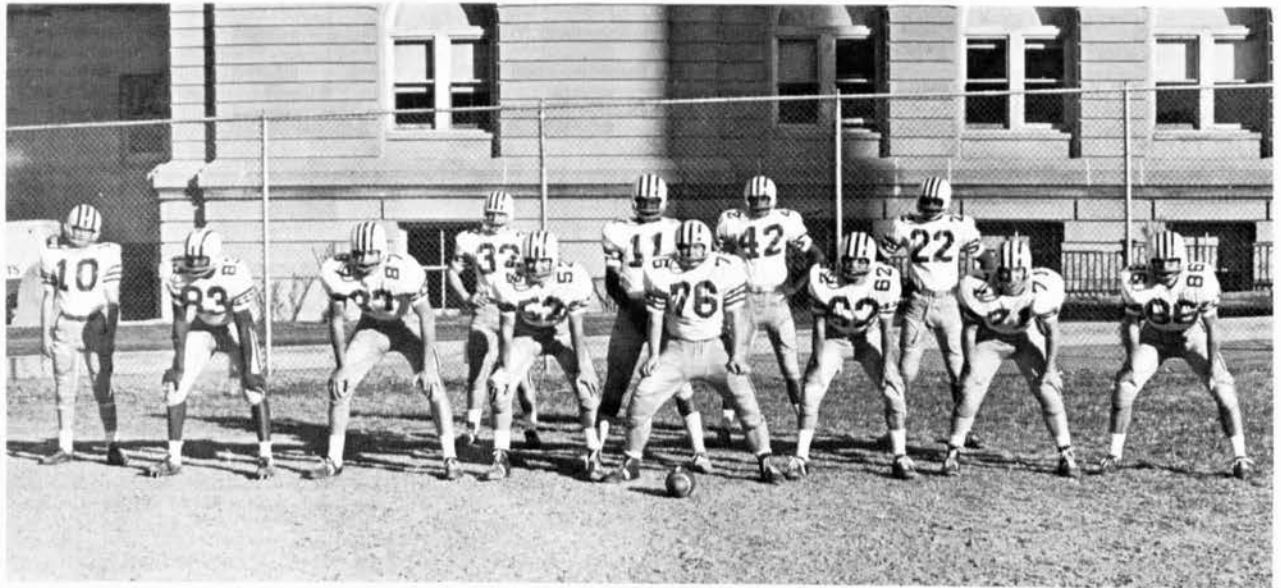
Boys Town downed Central 26-6 in a battle for first place. Long runs hurt the Eagles during the game. Steve Bunch scored the Eagles' touchdown.

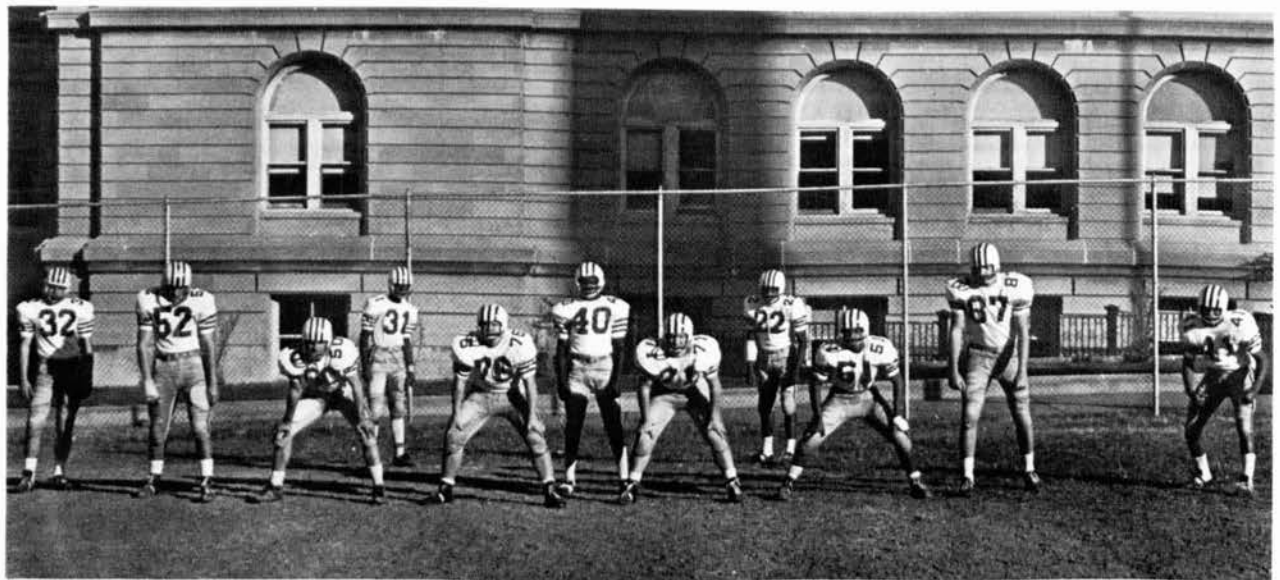

As the final buzzer sounded, saddened Central fans looked up to the scoreboard which read Northeast 64—Central 57; so ended the Eagles' cage season.

But in review, let's take a look at how the Central Eagles won 22 games and lost only 2 games. Not enough could have been said about the excellent coaching job of Mr. Warren Marquiss and Mr. James Martin. Through their expert knowledge of this game, the Eagles were molded into a powerful basketball team.

The Eagles were led this year by All-Stater Dwaine Dillard, a 6-5 junior who provided the height for rebounds and excellent moves to score from underneath; Ben Brown, 5-11 senior whose outside shooting ability helped the Eagles all season; Mark Wilson, 6-1 senior who played fine defensive ball; Alvin Mitchell, 5-7 senior who was the playmaker of the team with a good outside shot; and Willie Frazier, a 6-1 junior who helped the Eagles' fast break and provided extra strength for rebounding.

The Eagles were victorious in their first three contests as they downed Lincoln 55-54, South 66-46, and Tech 71-63 in a comeback effort. Central beat Prep

71-51. Dillard and Brown provided the punch to pluck the Jays' feathers.

Central next entered the Metro Holiday Basketball Tournament and won the Championship as they defeated Prep 58-54, Benson 68-58, and Tech 68-52. Dillard and Brown were named to the All-Tourney Team.

The Eagles pushed their record to 10-0 when they were winners against Westside 66-53, Benson 63-60, and North 67-62.

Central continued to rack up triumphs as Benson, A. L., Rummel, T. J., and Ryan respectively fell to the cagers.

Boys Town did it again. The Cowboys upset Central 53-51 in a tight struggle. Bellevue gave Central trouble to the final buzzer, but the Eagles emerged the winner 60-58.

Next came the Districts. In District A-1, Central defeated Prep 66-51 as Dillard pumped in 30 points and also downed South 60-49.

Central was the favorite to win the State Tournament. The Eagles bagged victories against Fremont 61-48 and Alliance 70-57, but disaster came against Northeast in the final game of the 1966-67 season.

Wrestling

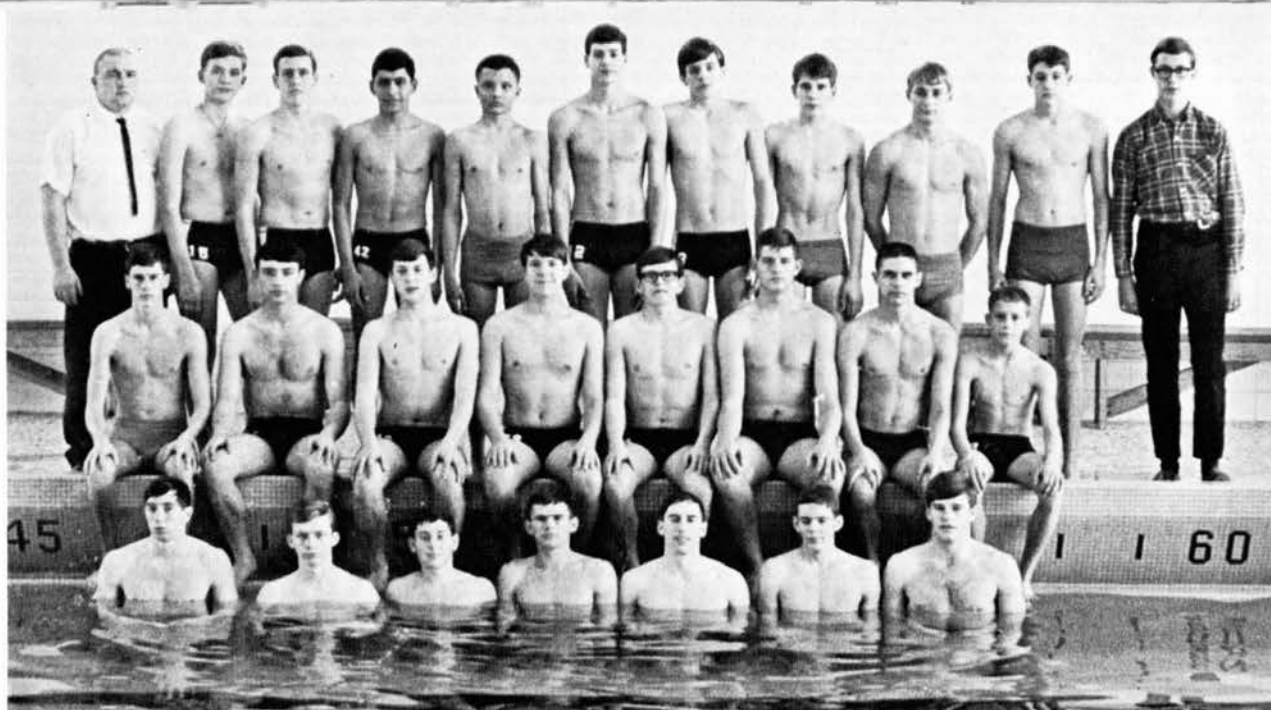
The 1966-67 Central High Wrestling Team, supervised by Coach Larry Snyder, had many bright spots during the grapplers' season.

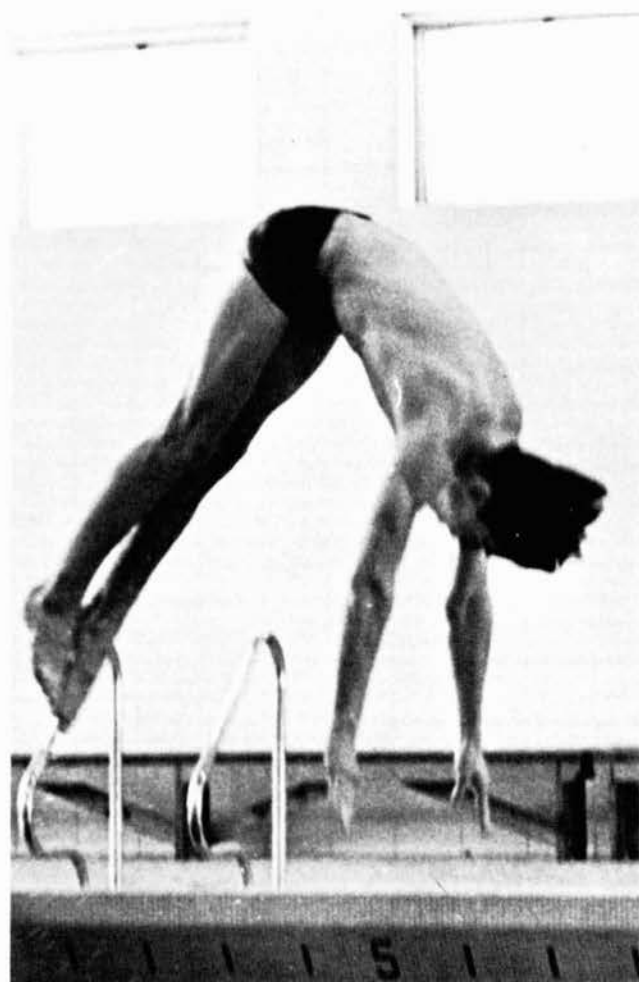

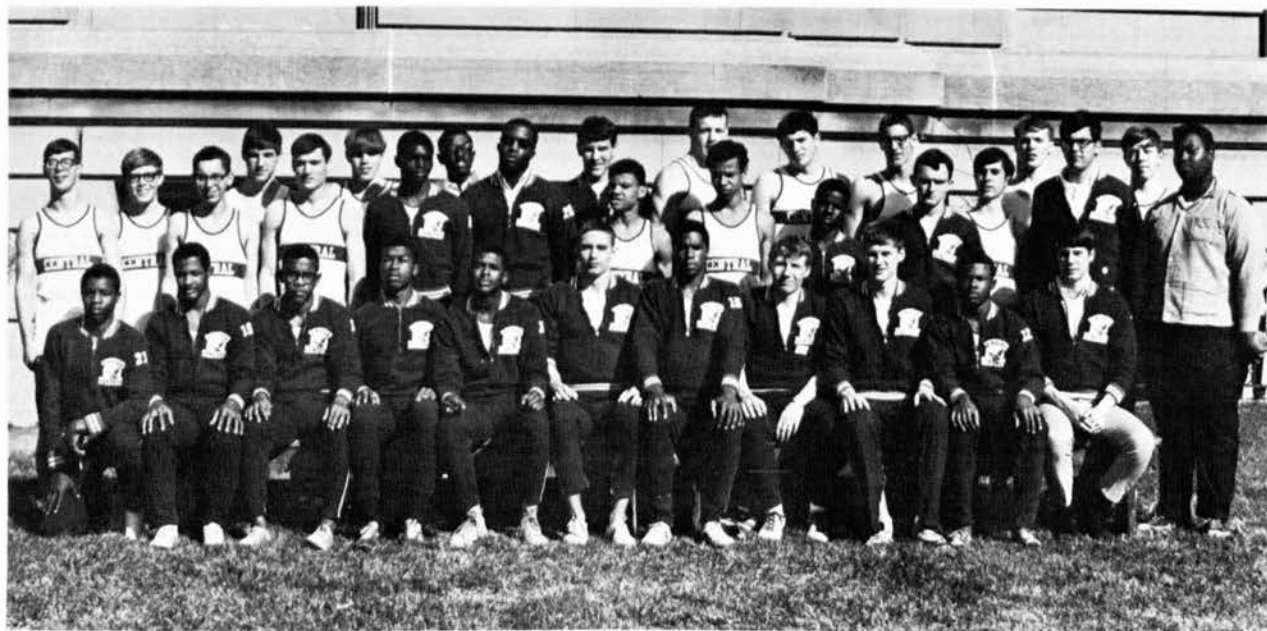

With fine trackmen such as Wilson, Butler, Reeves, and Orduna, the Central High Track Team provided plenty of excitement at each meet.



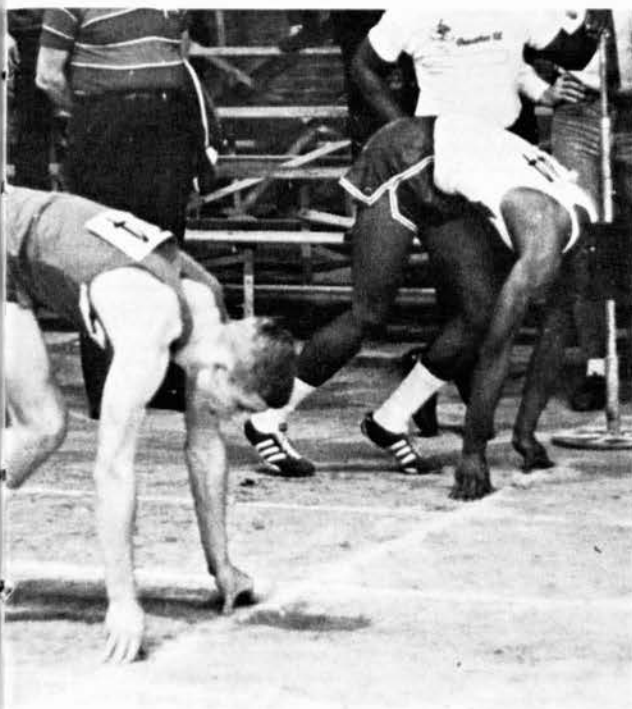

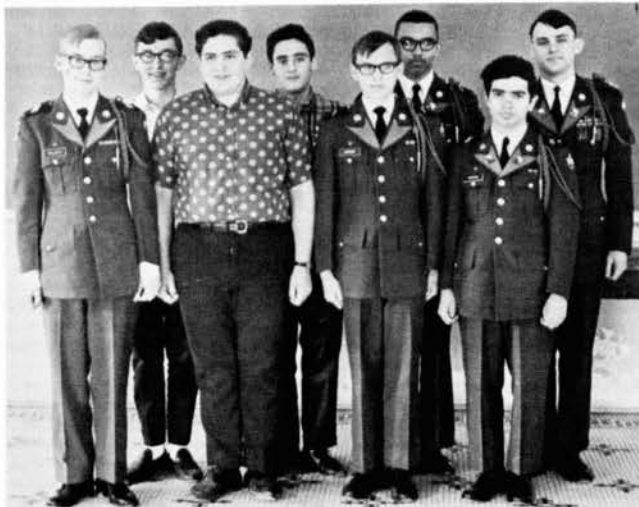
