Central mathletes fare well in city tournaments

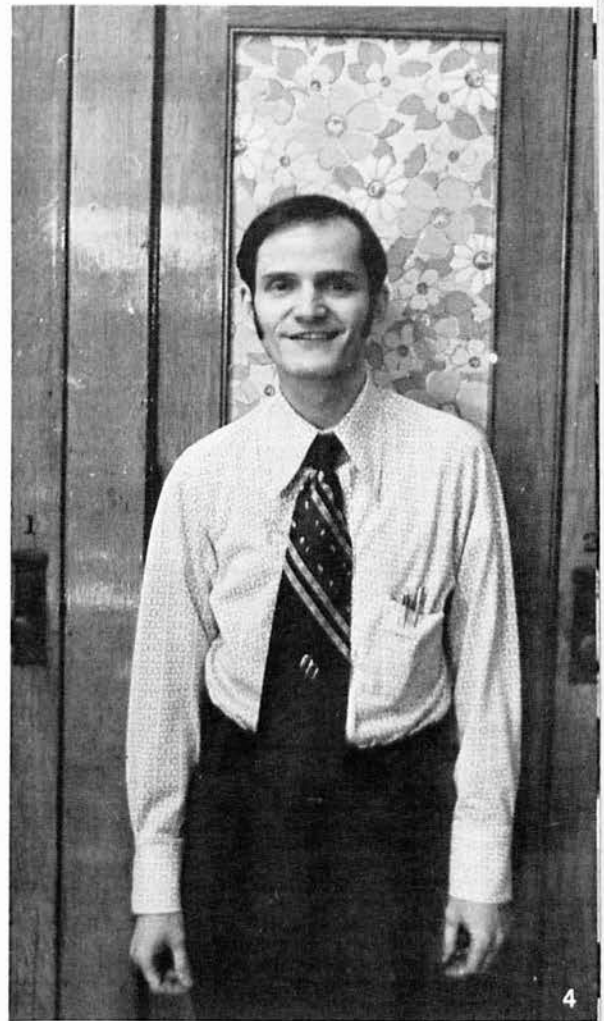

Central High School continued to prove its academic excellence with twelve National Merit Semifinalists and two National Achievement Scholarship winners for Outstanding Negro Students. This was the highest number in the state. The seniors who achieved this honor scored high on the PSAT-NMSQT tests in the fall of their junior year. National Merit Semifinalists have a chance to win a \$1,000 scholarship to the college of their choice.

Central sent four delegates to Boys' and Girls' State. The week long gathering included high school students from all Nebraska High Schools. Central delegates Betty Moses, Jean Ogborn, and Bruce Rips were all elected to their unicamerals. Betty also placed first in the current events test and was chosen an alternate to Girls' Nation.

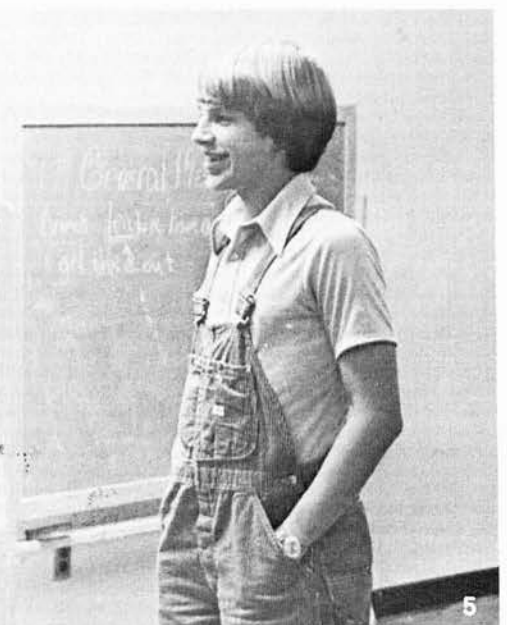

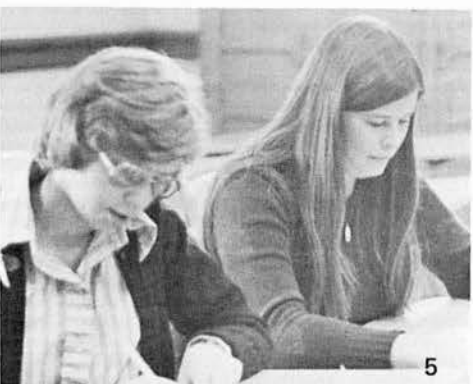

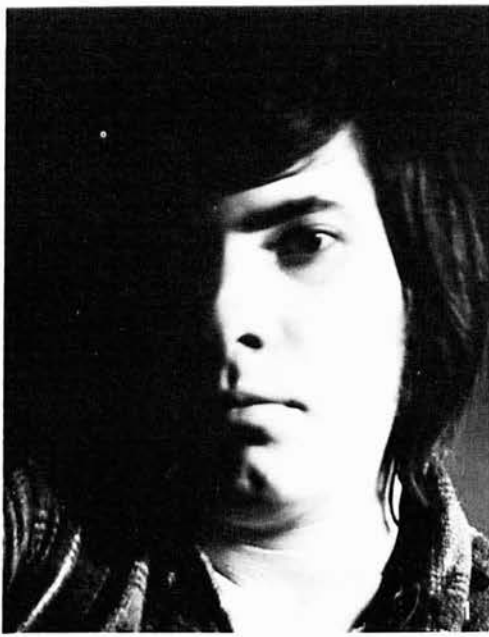
'Register' staff writes good news

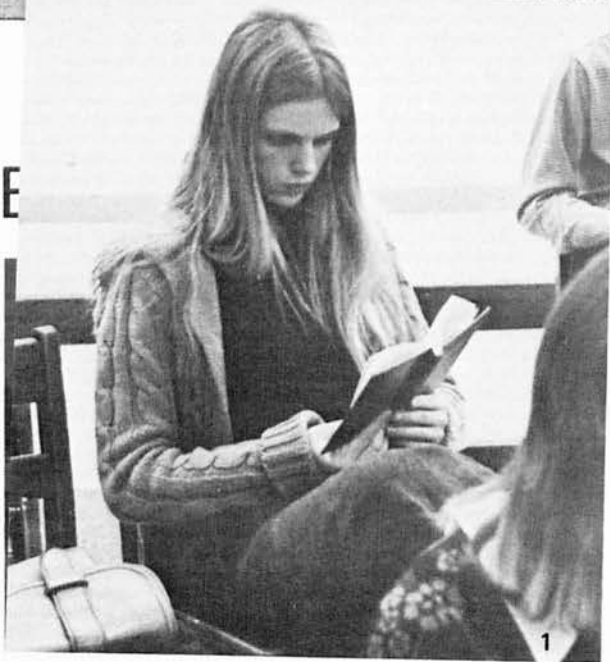
Eagles have colorful Homecoming

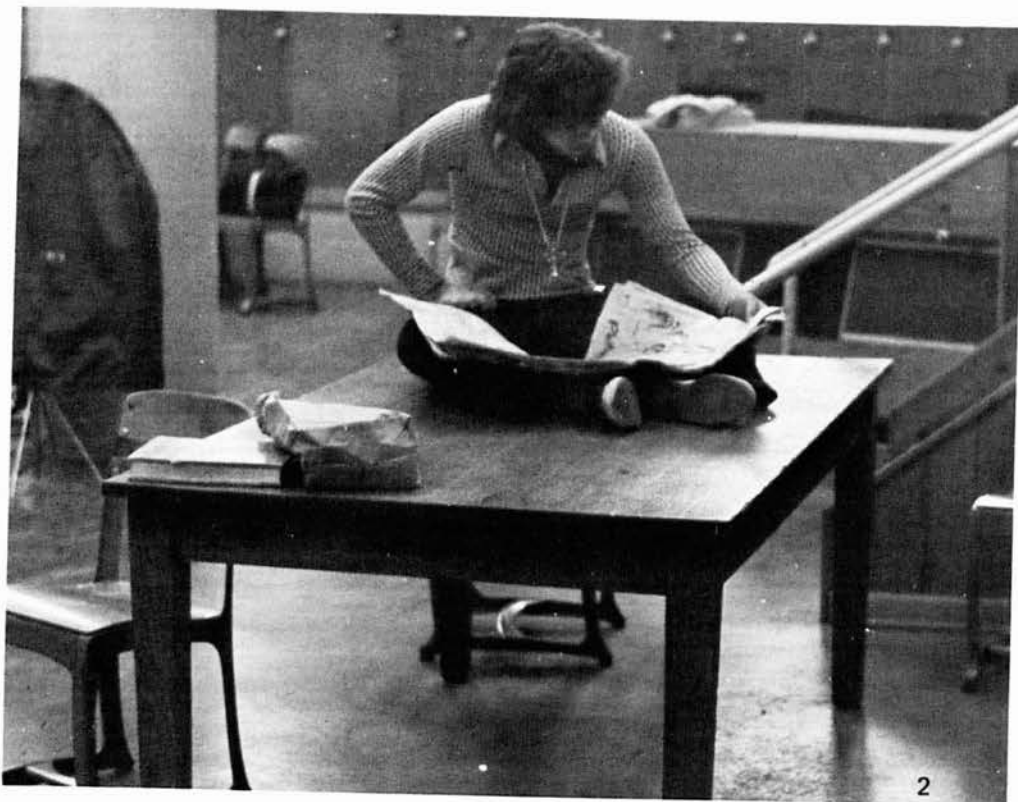

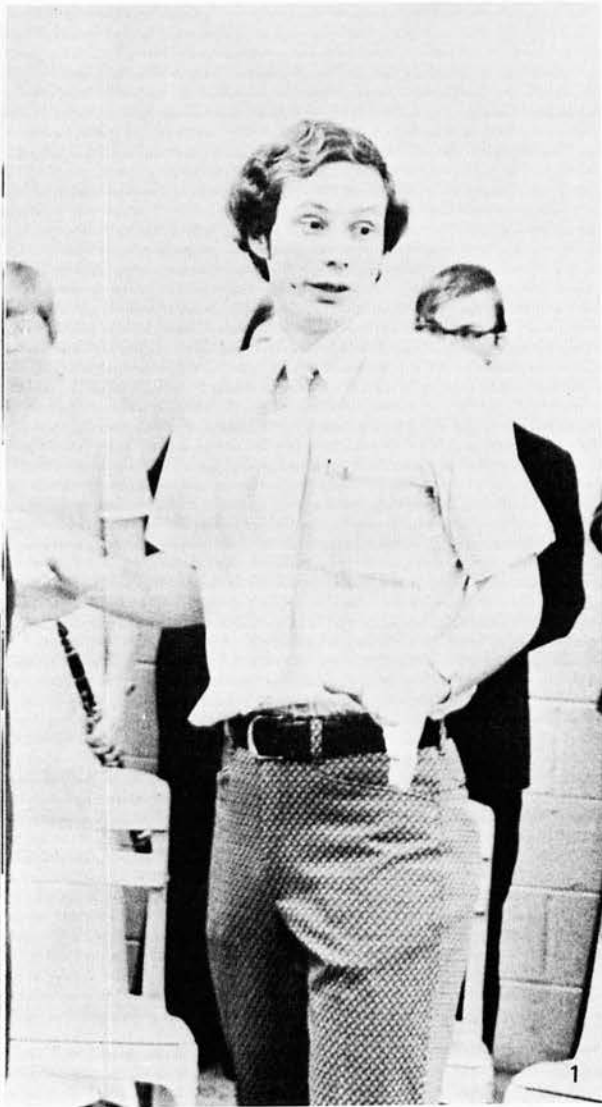

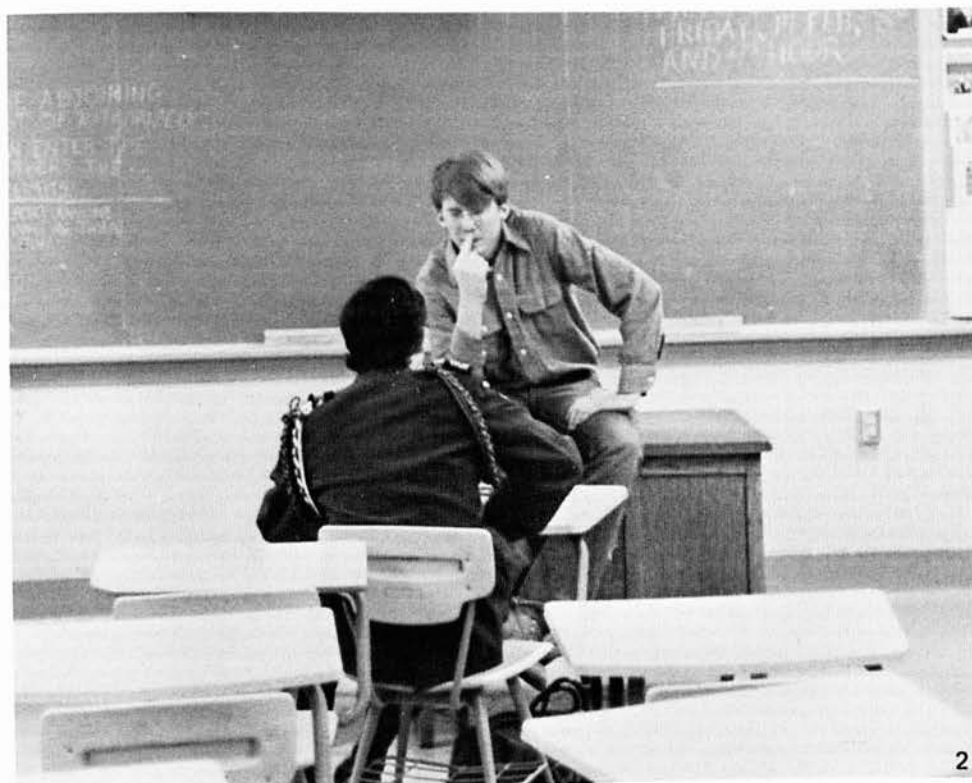

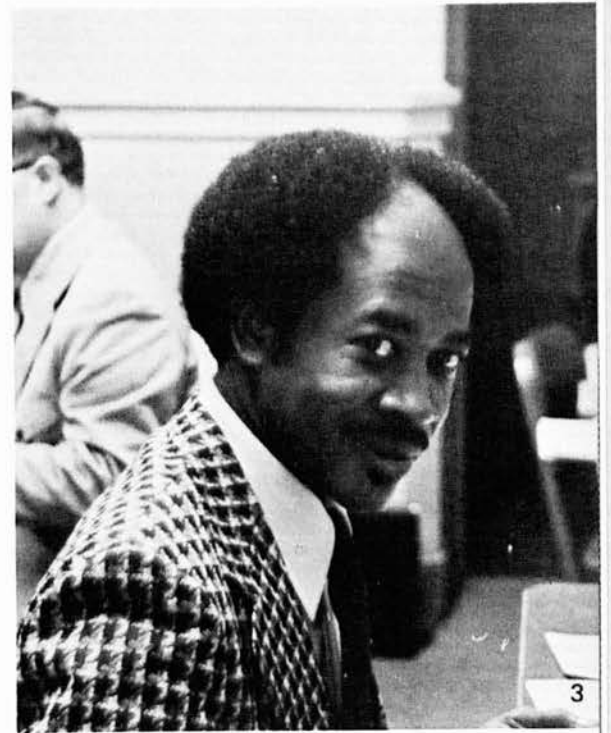
ROTC Hussars, Lancers perform at coronation

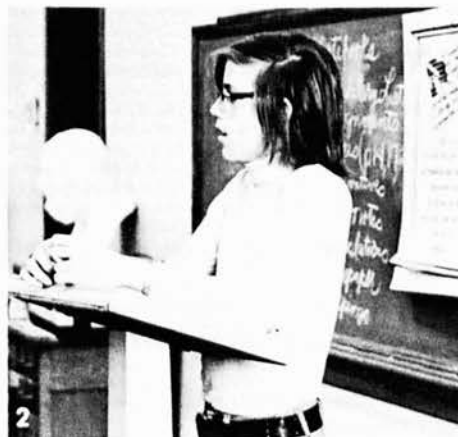

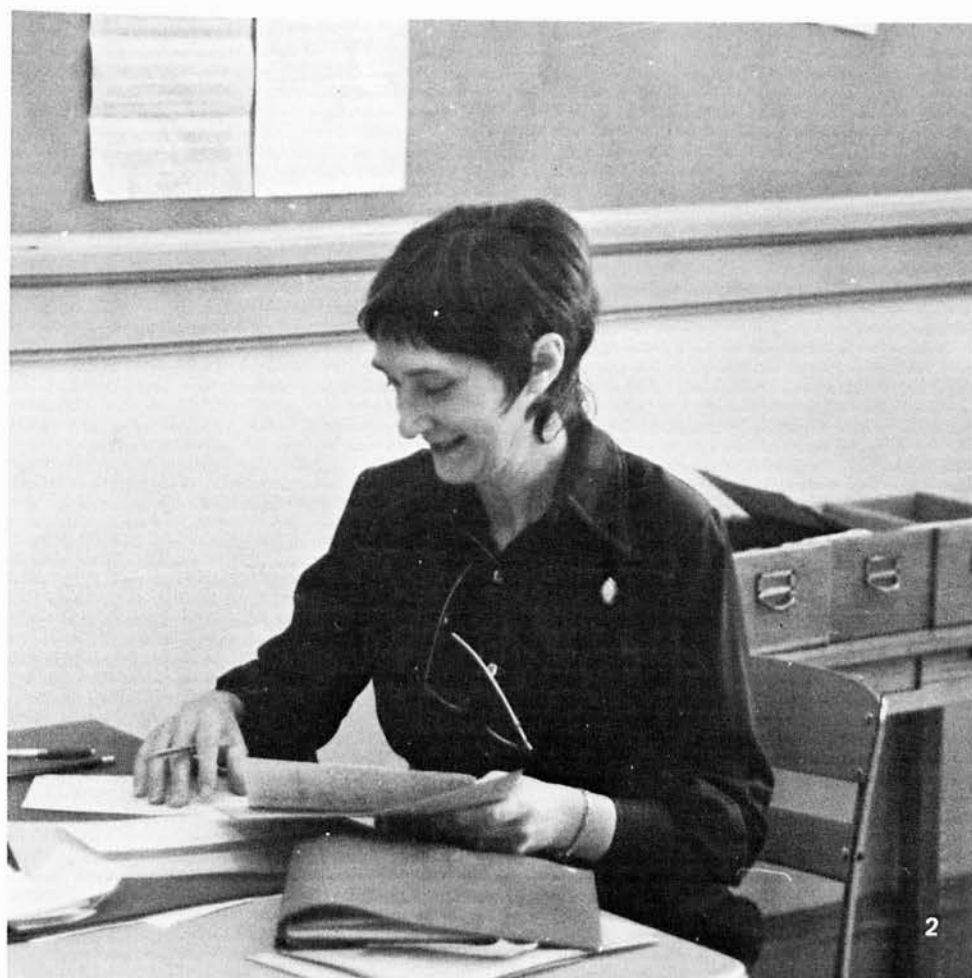
Miss Lee commented that "training students to do well in acting" is the main purpose of Drama Club. It also allows the students to come up with useful and imaginative ideas.

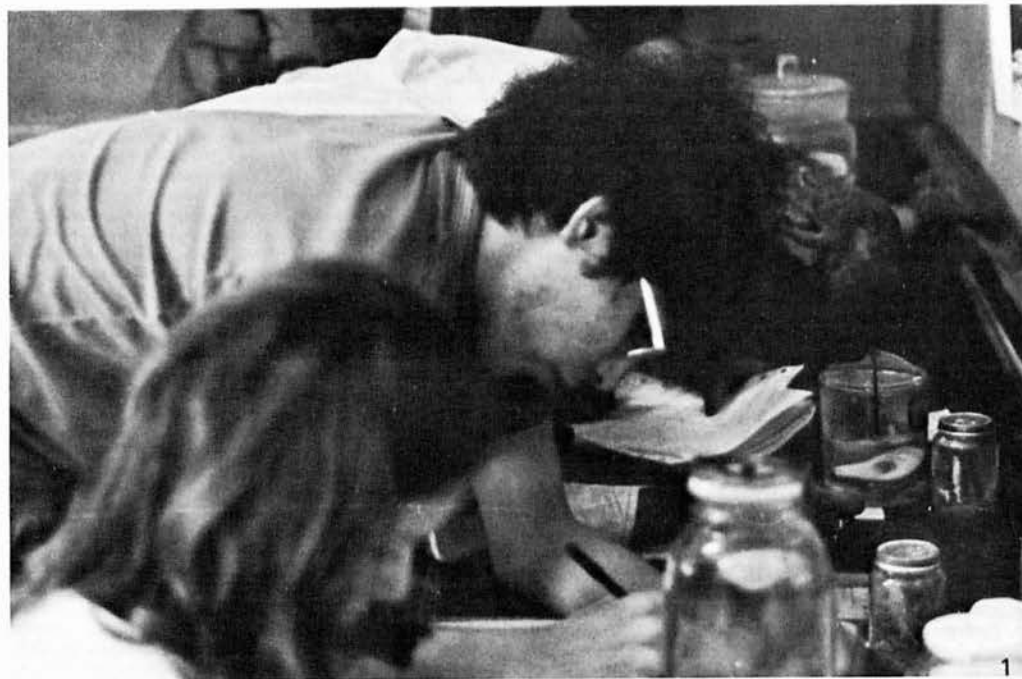
Social Studies grows new branches in old places





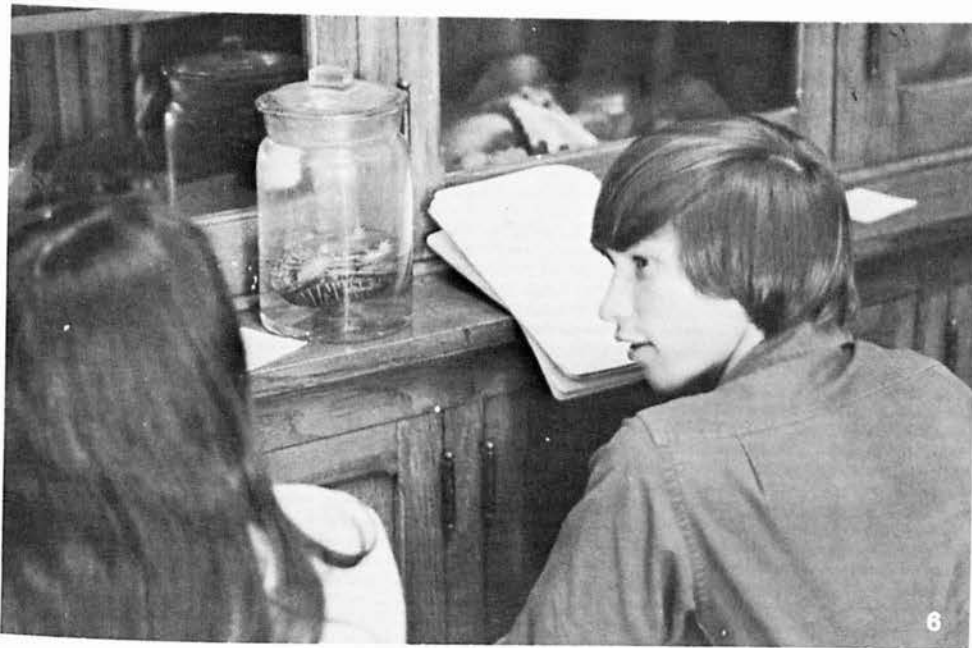

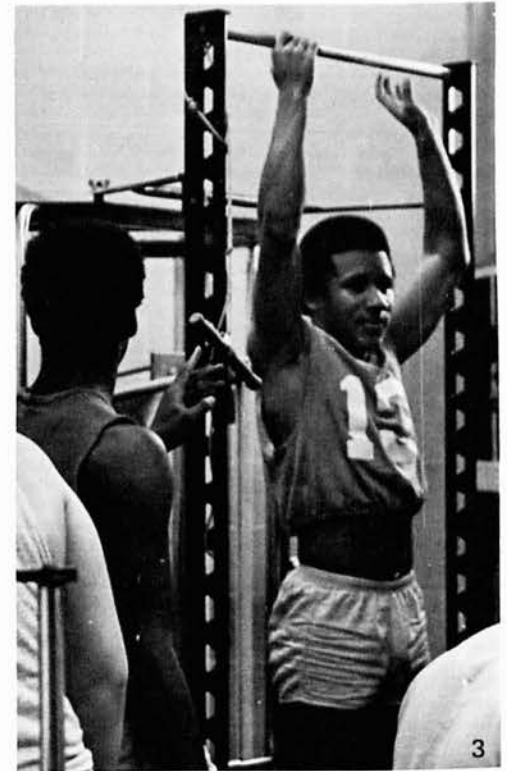
Business Education sets learning tree goals high

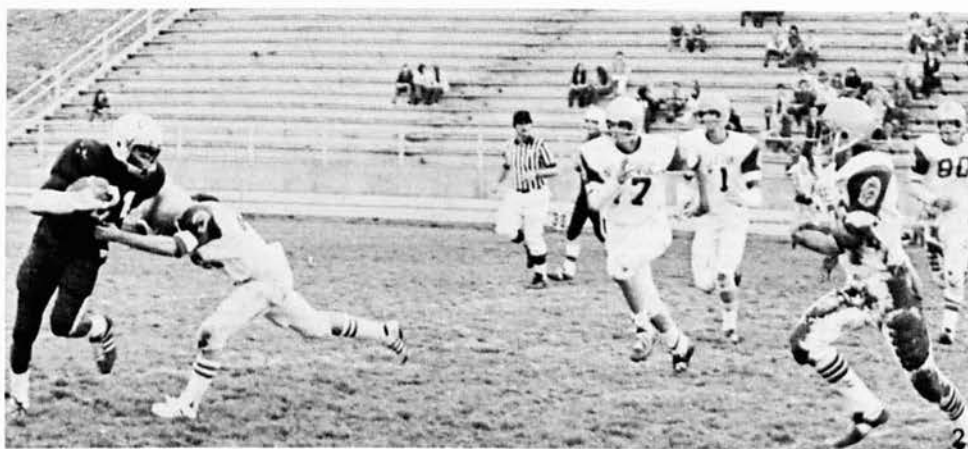


Reserves suffer flawed season; only one victory

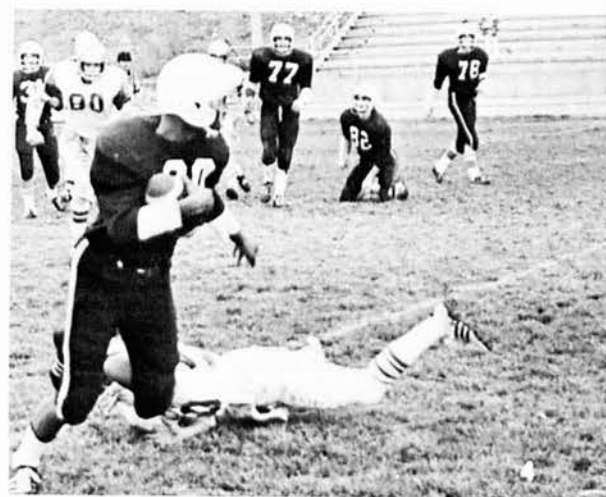

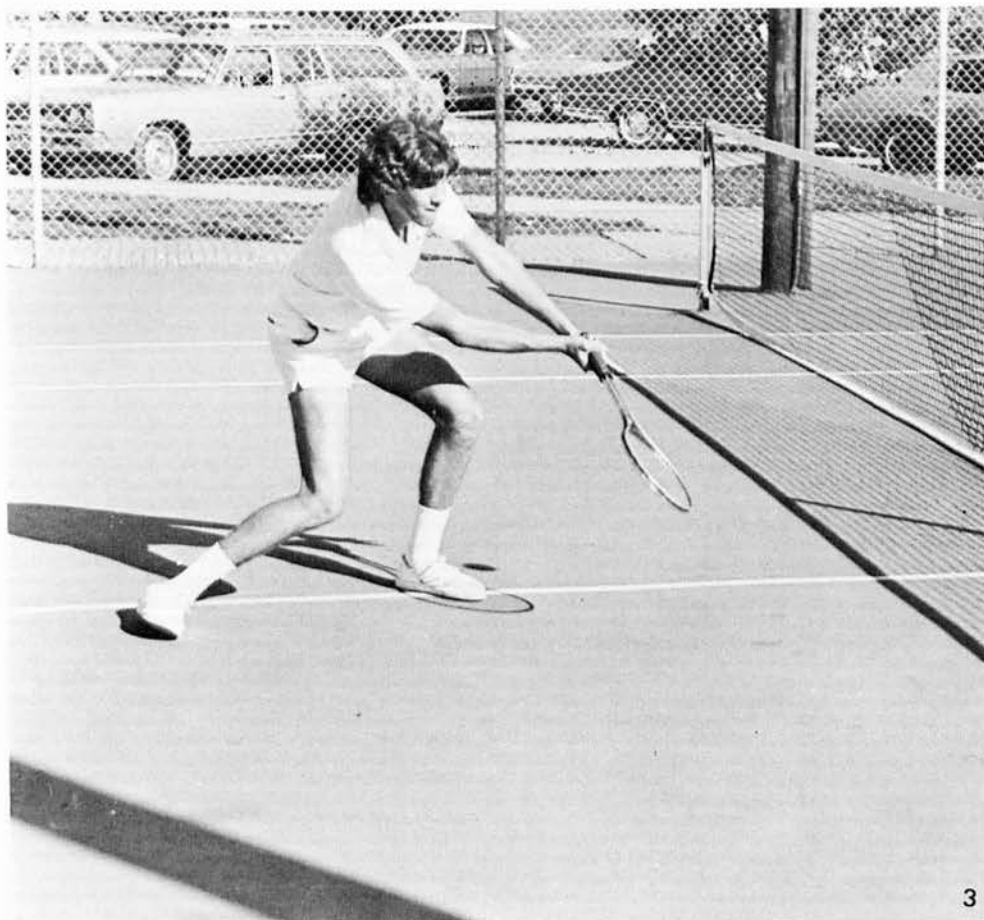


Tennis team builds for future

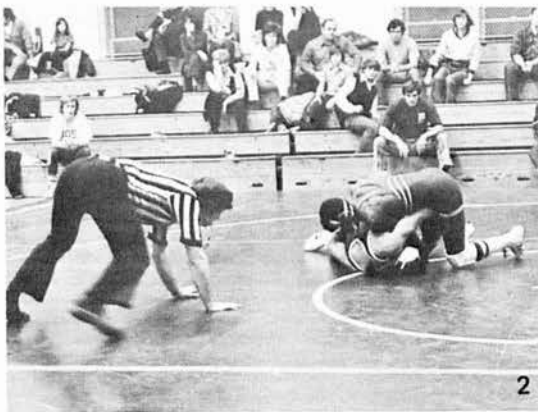
Swimmers qualify for second in National division

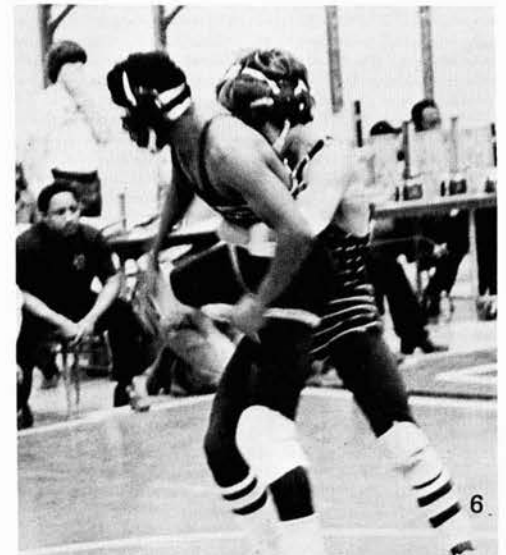
Wrestling team's effort is equal to individual skills

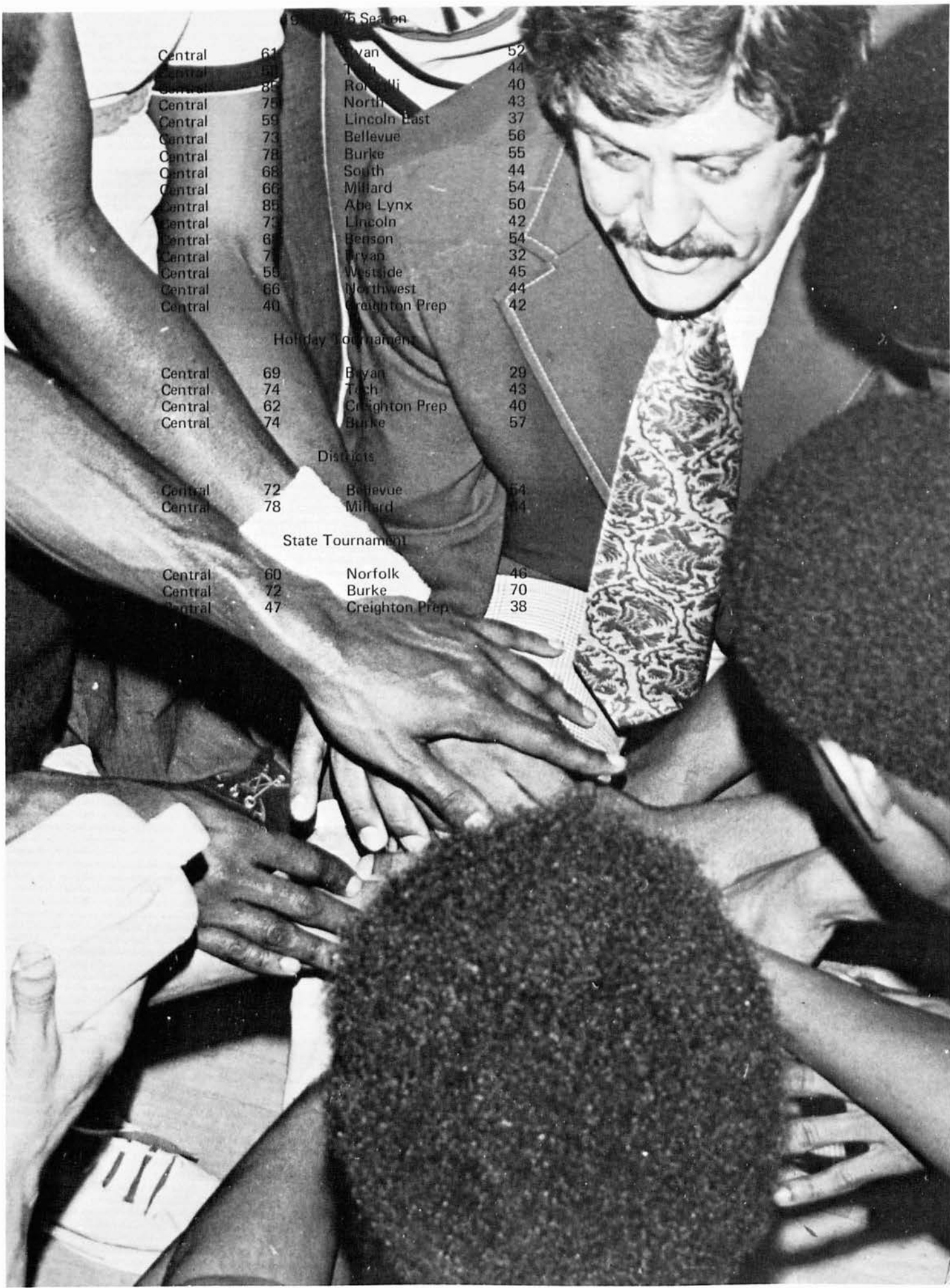

Baseball team to try to fulfill last year's promise



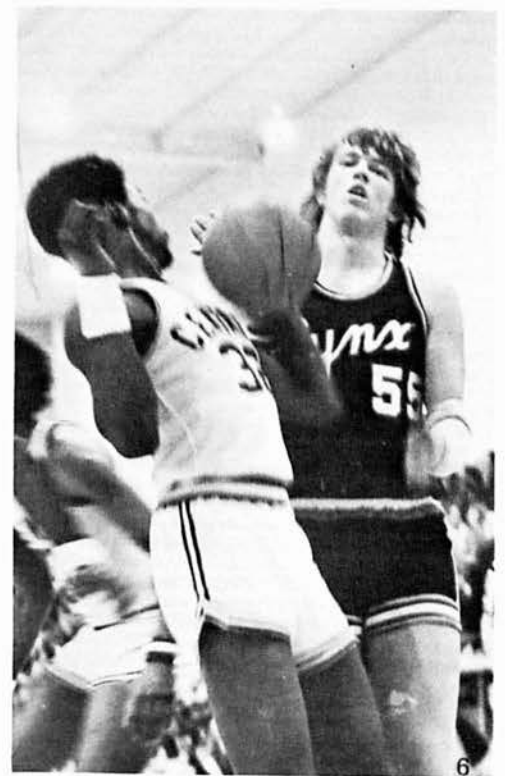

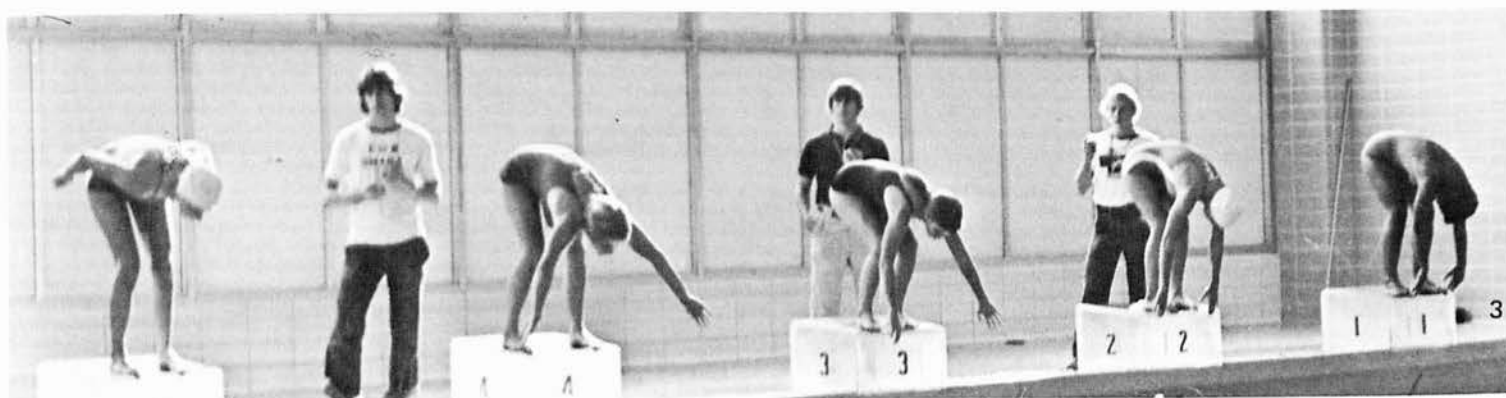

Girls' basketball becomes Central's latest addition

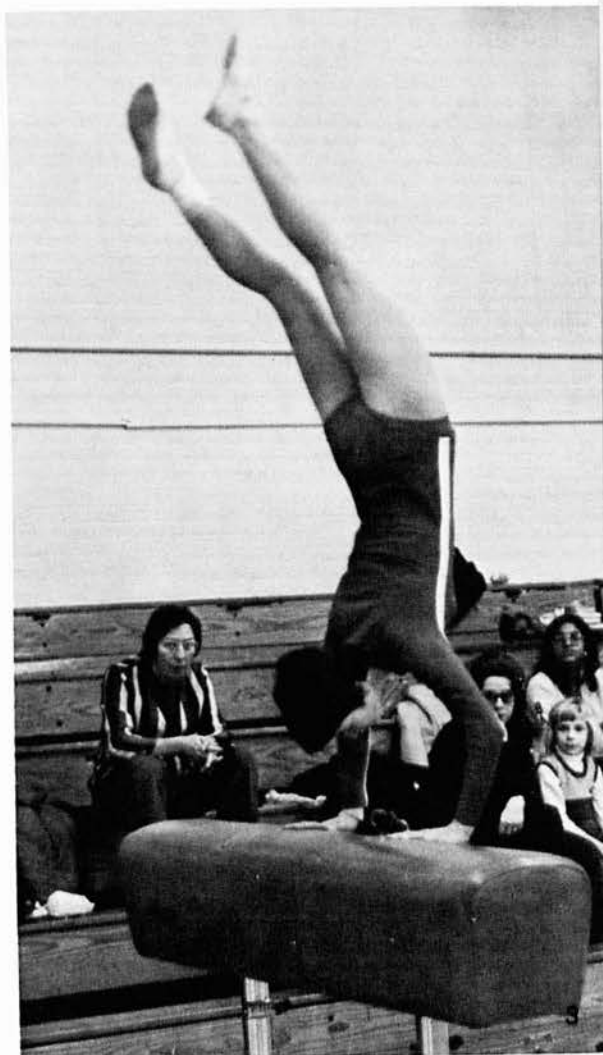

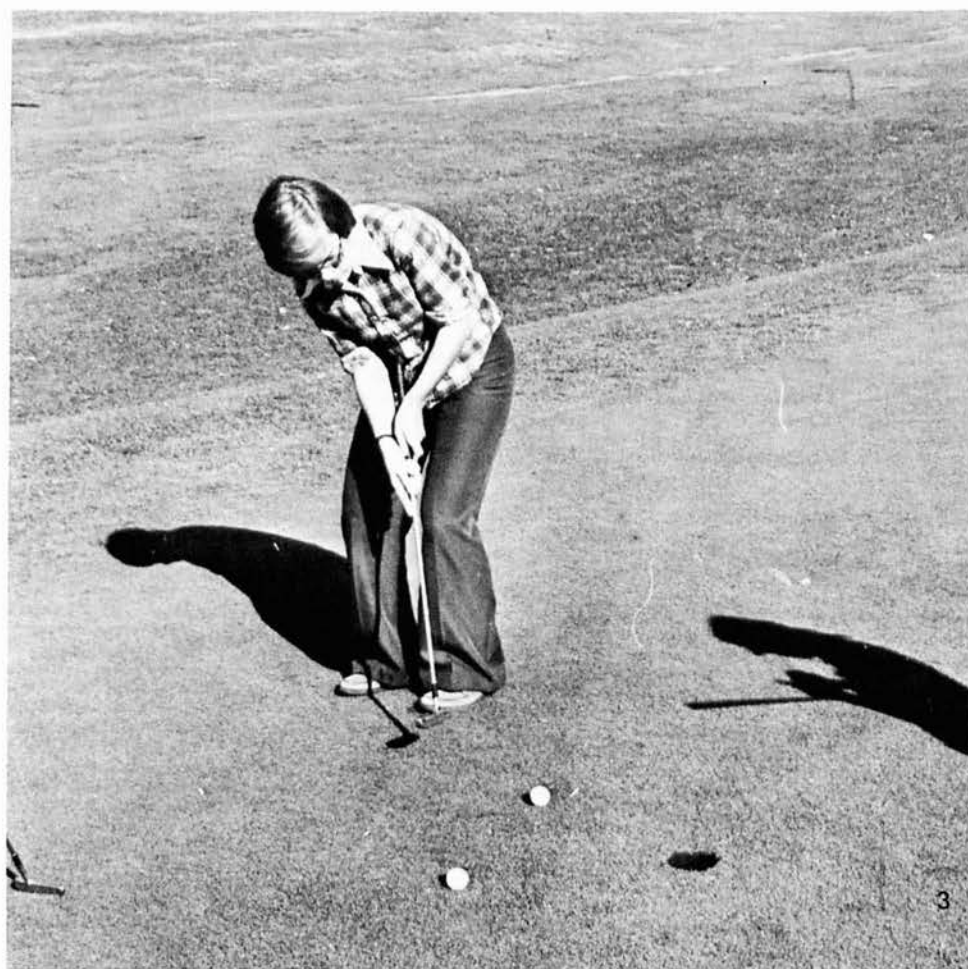


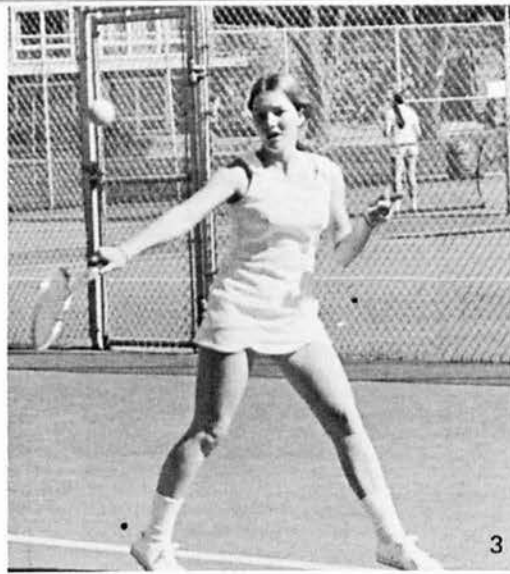
Golfers work their way up to thirteenth in State
