

The Story of 'Old Central'

Public schools in Omaha began in 1855 when the territorial legislature provided for a system of free public schools.

In March of 1859, Howard Kennedy was appointed superintendent of education by the Omaha Board of School Directors. Kennedy was to organize the Omaha Public School system.

In November of 1859, Kennedy opened his school for all grades in the old State House at Ninth and Farnam Streets.

At this time, Omaha was a small prairie town with a population of 4,000.

Howard Kennedy, after teaching a year, was replaced by John Kellom. Kellom taught Kennedy's classes from 1860-61.

After the depression following the panic of 1857, the city was unable to support the public schools, and with the outbreak of the Civil War, public schools had to close.

Samuel D. Beals opened his own private school in the old State House in April of 1861. His school became quite popular and was moved to several locations throughout Omaha because of overcrowding. Beals closed his schools in 1867.

In April of 1869, Beals was appointed State Superintendent of Public Instruction. Beals required teacher examinations to improve the education quality of the state. He also helped raise the number of public schools from 74 to 301.

The year 1976 not only signifies our nation's two-hundredth year as a free country, it also signifies the one-hundredth year since the first graduating class of Omaha High School, the original Central High.

The "O-Book" has attempted to present an accurate historical account of the changes that have taken place and traditions that continue at Central High. Through each section, brief historical facts have been mentioned along with the information concerning each group or activity.

The cover on this book is also a tribute to the past. It is a replica of the "O-Book" cover of 1921.

The "O-Book" staff wishes to emphasize the fact that the innovative and excellent academic standards of Central High School have been unsurpassed in its one-hundred year history.





In July of 1874, Beals was elected superintendent of the Omaha schools. Beals accomplished the task of grading the public schools from primary through high school levels. Beals became a teacher at Omaha's High School from 1880 to 1900.


The search for a permanent site for the high school was headed by S.D. Beals and later by John Kellom. The problem was solved when, in 1869, the Legislature donated the old Capitol building at Twenty-first and Capitol to Omaha with the condition that it be used for high school purposes. The Legislature also appointed a Board of High School Regents. The Legislature had given


the Regents \$25,000 to repair the old Capitol building. The building, however, was declared unsafe and was torn down in 1870.

At a cost of \$225,000, work on the new high school building began in the fall of 1870. The red brick building stood on a tenacre campus, and when completed it was a source of pride to Omaha residents.


The school faced east and consisted of a main building with north and south wings. It had four stories and a basement. There were fifteen school rooms and four recitation rooms. The spire rose one-hundred fifty feet above the ground.

Changing times. . .

By 1897, the problem of overcrowding became very serious. Inadequate ventilation was a threat to the health of teachers and students alike. In the school board's annual report for 1897-98, the President of the Board wrote in favor of building a larger building on the same site. Although there was some opposition, the construction of a larger building began in 1900.


The cornerstone of Central's present building was laid on November 16,1900. The east wing of the building was completed in 1901. The construction continued, encircling the old high school building. Classes were held in both buildings until all but the north wing of the new building was completed. Then, the old high school was dismantled and removed. The north side was completed in November, 1912. The total cost of the new school was \$750,000.

Through the efforts of principal Kate McHugh, the heating and ventilating plant was removed from the space in the center of the building. The ground left vacant was converted into the courtyard.







More changes

The year 1920 saw a change of scene for Central. As a result of the petitions of motorists, the grade of Dodge Street was lowered from twelve per cent to seven per cent. Traffic was banned in the once busy area for more than a year while work was in progress. This construction left Central on a cliff with a sheer twenty foot drop. New terraces and flights of stairs restored the grounds to their present condition.








Central High School has changed in many ways through its one hundred years. The people inside the school have changed also. The photos on these pages present a glimpse of what constituted the Central of yesterday.








1. Principal Kate McHugh at her desk. 2. The old auditorium which is now rooms 145 and 245. 3. The east corridor of Central, 1921.




Also in 1876, on July 4, electrical engineers rigged lights up in the high school tower. This arrangement gave Omaha its first demonstration of electric lights.

Important visitors were inevitably given a tour of the high school. These visitors included Presidents Grant, Hayes, and Harrison.

High school in 1876 was not all studying. A graduate of the 1876 class recalls the boys in the high school. "They used to slide down the steep, curving bannisters, four flights at once! The boys contrived a dummy figure of a man. Attached to a rope, this was dropped down the opening of the staircase. How we girls shrieked as it hurtled past and fell with a sickening thud on the floor below!"



Scholars receive Merits






The first National Honor Society was established at Central in 1921 by former principal Joseph G. Masters. It was a plan to honor those graduating seniors who have made outstanding scholastic records during their years at Central.

Today the honor society still recognizes outstanding seniors. There are 10 semifinalists for the National Merit Scholarships and 4 for the National Achievement Scholarships for Outstanding Negro students.

Boys and girls state representatives are elected to attend a state convention in which their knowledge of our government is enhanced. There were 4 representatives from Central and 4 alternates.

62nd year for Assembly



The Student Assembly originated in 1914. It was first recognized as the "Student Council," and was created for the purpose of "supplying a means of interchanging ideas between principal and faculty on one hand, student body on the other."

The Council of 1914 consisted of twentytwo members, including the midterm graduating class. They were elected by the student body, and the meetings were held in the library.

In comparison, the Assembly of 1976 consists of a total of thirty-six members including second semester entrants, and a faculty adviser, Mr. Steven Nelson. They too, are elected by the student body. However, they are allotted a special Student Assembly room for their meetings.














A Cappella Choir adds 'note' of tradition



An attempt at organizing the first Glee Club was made in 1903 by the Organization of the Orpheus Club. In 1912 it was considered the most successful Glee Club of the time, and in 1915 it was favorably compared with many colleges.

The club met second period every day in one of two gymnasiums. The boys received a half credit per semester.

The Glee Club continued to flourish and in September of 1914 the first Girls' Glee was organized. Their first debut was made on December 17th, where they "made a favorable impression by their dainty interpretation of popular and classic selections."

Today our "glee club", A Cappella, continues to hold its importance and tradition by being one of the finest high school choral groups in the city.



REGIMENT

The origin of Central's present day military can be traced back more than eighty years ago to the year 1892. It was recognized as the largest and the most popular activity of Omaha High School.

At one time, it was a requirement of every male student of the school to become an active member of the Regiment. The men were divided into two major divisions: Battalions or Companies. The two divisions were then subdivided again. The men belonged to the 1st, 2nd, 3rd Battalion, etc., or Company A, B, C, etc. Each group had its own cadet commanders and its own unique drill procedures.

During the military's long existence at Central High, its name has been altered many times. It has been called the Cadet Regiment, the Military, and is presently referred to as the ROTC (Reserve Officers' Training Corps).

Today, Central's ROTC is strictly a volunteer program. One of the major changes within the last few years is the addition of women. Any girl is allowed admission to the military.

The school's military has changed tremendously through the course of years in name, size, and sex, but it certainly has yet to change in importance.














'Apple Tree' brings laughter to audience




The musical, "The Apple Tree", was a three part play written by Sheldon Harnick and Jerry Bock. It was presented in the school auditorium November 12-15.


The first play was based on a short story written by Mark Twain called "The Diary of Adam and Eve." It featured the life of earth's first man and woman and also, the problems they encountered.

Stage crew builds sets for productions





The stage crew has been in existence since the late 1920's.




The entertainment consisted of an eight act vaudeville performance put on by some of the students. It was called O.H.S. Road Show.


There's no end to Dr. Moller's work

Prior to becoming Central's principal, Dr. Moller was the assistant principal for five years.










The Future Farmers build for future




SPAIN

Latin Club first in United States



One of the unique clubs of Central is the Junior Classical League, better known as the Latin club. Established in 1903 by Miss Ellen Rooney and Miss Susan Paxson, the club was the first Latin club in the United States.

The club was originally organized to make the study of Latin interesting. The club was to help the students learn something about the Romans besides their language. The members decided to study about the Roman homes and home life, the political conditions, and the characters of the great men whose work they translated.

Through the seventy-three years of the club's continued existence, it has served for these purposes. In October of this year, the club members celebrated the 1045 birthday of Virgil, a great Roman poet. Other activities included the Saturnalia, a pagan holiday celebrated at Christmas time although it was originated before the birth of Christ.

Football has played a very important role in the development of Central over the years, ever since the beginning of Central in 1859 when it was called Omaha High School.

Central's teams of 1908 and 1909 won successive state championships under head coach W. Cherrington. Each championship boosted the school spirit and support among the students and faculty.

It has only been 75 years since such greats as Charley Hoffert and Ray McWhinney stalked the halls of "Old Central", and less than 20 years since such greats as Gale Sayers and Joe Orduna walked the grounds, both of whom have become pro football greats.

In this year, 1975, the Eagles suffered a winless campaign in coach Gary Bailey's third season. Numerous mistakes and costly penalties proved to be Central's downfall. Two errant punt snaps led to two early Eagle losses against Northwest; the Hunskies recovered the snap in their end-zone for their only score of the game. In the opening game loss to North, the Vikings recovered the errant snap on the Eagle's three yard line. North scored three plays later and held Central in check the rest of the night to win 7-0.

Veteran offensive tackles John Krowlikowski and co-captain Chris Sorensen led the Eagle's drive for victory. Both played equally well on the defensive front line. Cocaptain Herman Badgett led a handful of backfield mates including Central's leading rusher and scorer, junior, Phil Bates.

A tough Eagle defense, led by seniors Terry Slattery, Darrel Teamer, and Tim Austin, kept most of the Eagle's games close.









Reserves prove competitive in 4-4 season

Gymnastics, legacy in its own time














Cagers hampered in winning season




















The popularity of basketball at Central is high above any other single sport, but popularity does not come overnight.




"With both Bennett and Burch returning plus several good players coming up from J.V., improvement in our record will depend on defense and pitching," said Coach Pennington.

In 1890, Central joined with other schools in the area and formed the Athletic Association. Later this became GAA, Inter-school sports, and Cheerleading. Central joined the National Athletic Honor Society shortly after 1900, and remained a member until the 1940's. Central students formed the O-Club, the boy's letterman's club, in 1920; it was rejuvenated in 1927, and is due for another.

Between 1890 and 1927, Central participated with other area schools in an annual Field Day of sporting events. Events included the 100-yard dash, hurdles, the running and standing broad jumps, the running high jump, the triple jump, the pole vault, baseball throw, and tennis doubles. These athletic contests were for men as well as women athletes.

Among the Varsity sports no longer active in the Omaha Public Schools once offered at Central are boxing and fencing.

Varsity cheerleaders remain number 1 in spirit







Cheerleading has been a spirited tradition at Central High since 1925 when the squad consisted of four male cheerleaders. In 1931, girl cheerleaders were introduced and by 1949, the cheering squads at Central were made up of girls alone. This year, however, males were once again eligible to try out for cheerleading. Under the direction of Mrs. Barbara Tegt, the co-ed squad was a great success.

It all started back in 1931 when the first girls' swim team was formed. Now, as it was then, swimming is a very popular sport among the girls at Central.



Girls volley to an impressive season








Gymnasts finish year of good competition






Tennis players rally to win in meets




Dear Sophomores,
