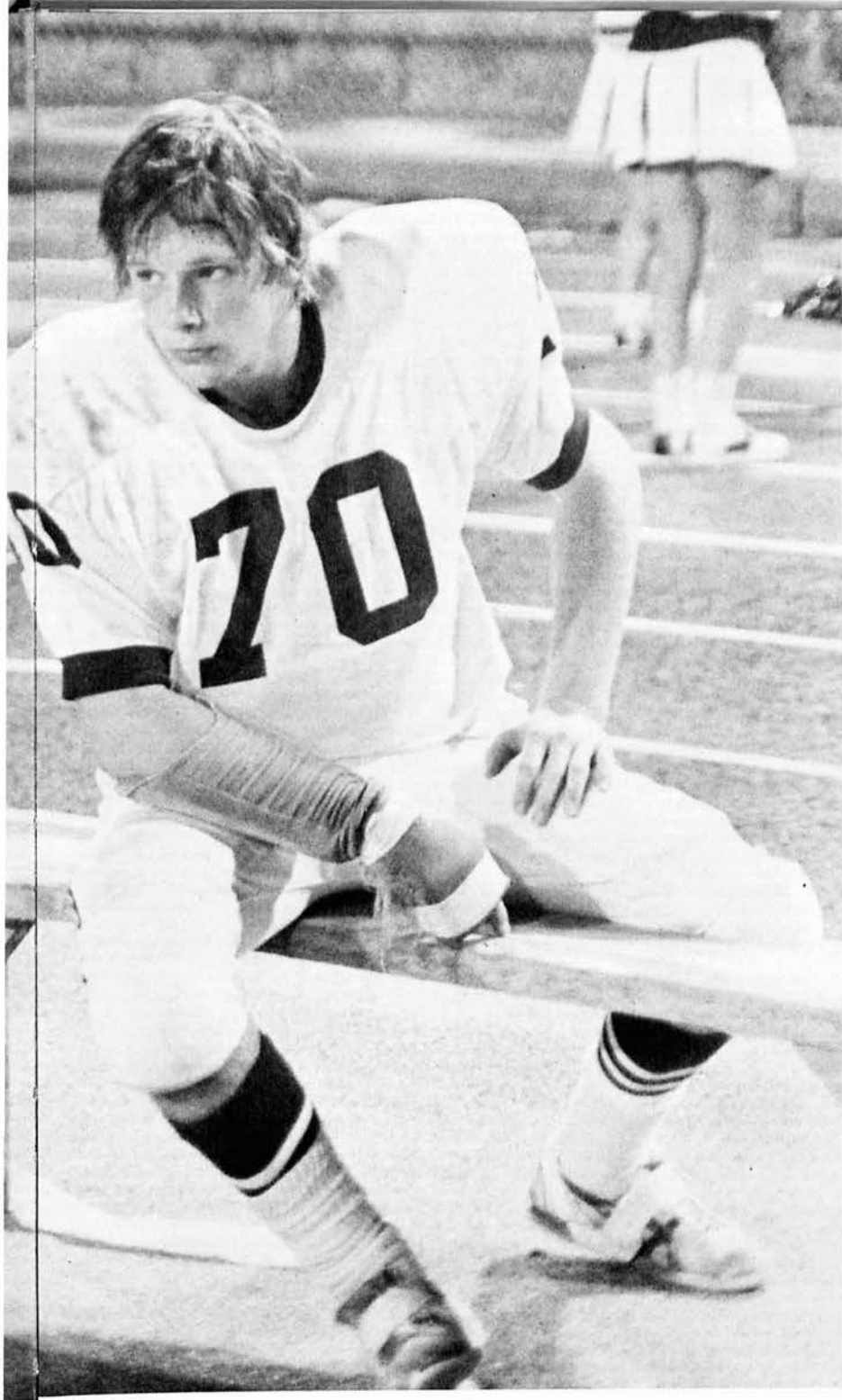


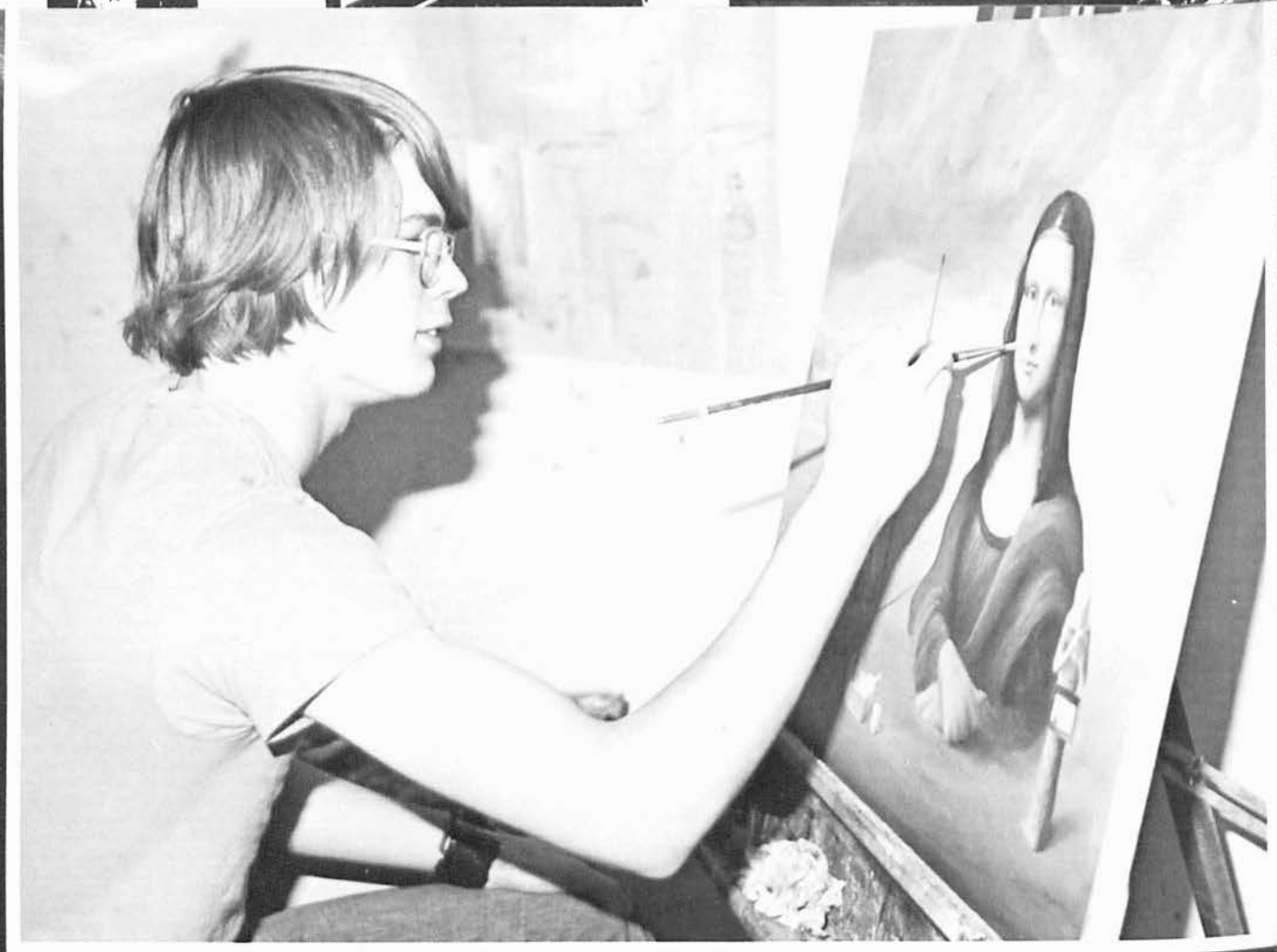


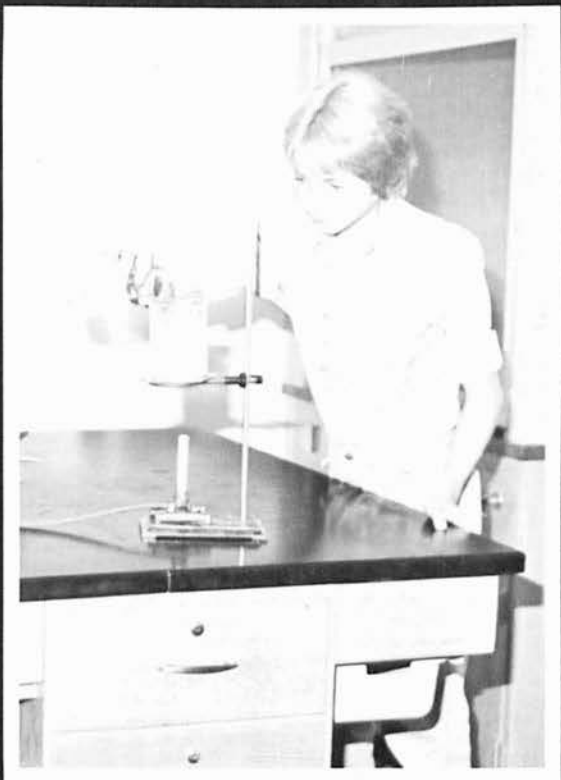
Our generation has already seen many social, political, and cultural changes. Even within the scope of our everyday lives many things have happened.

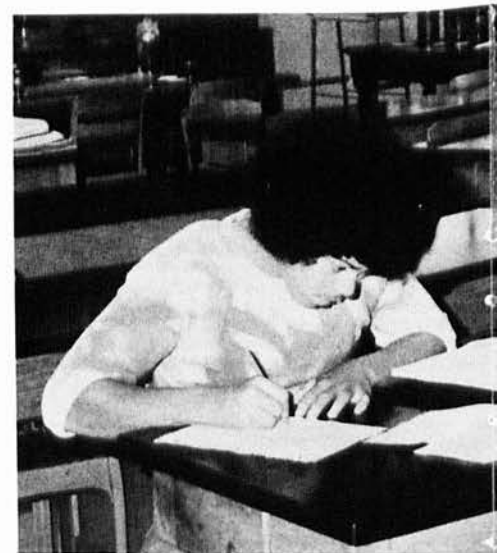


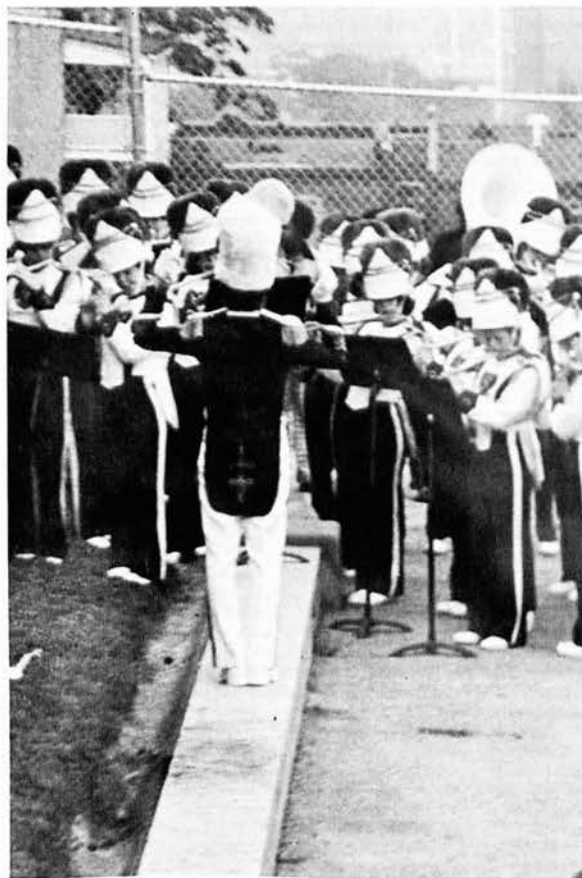




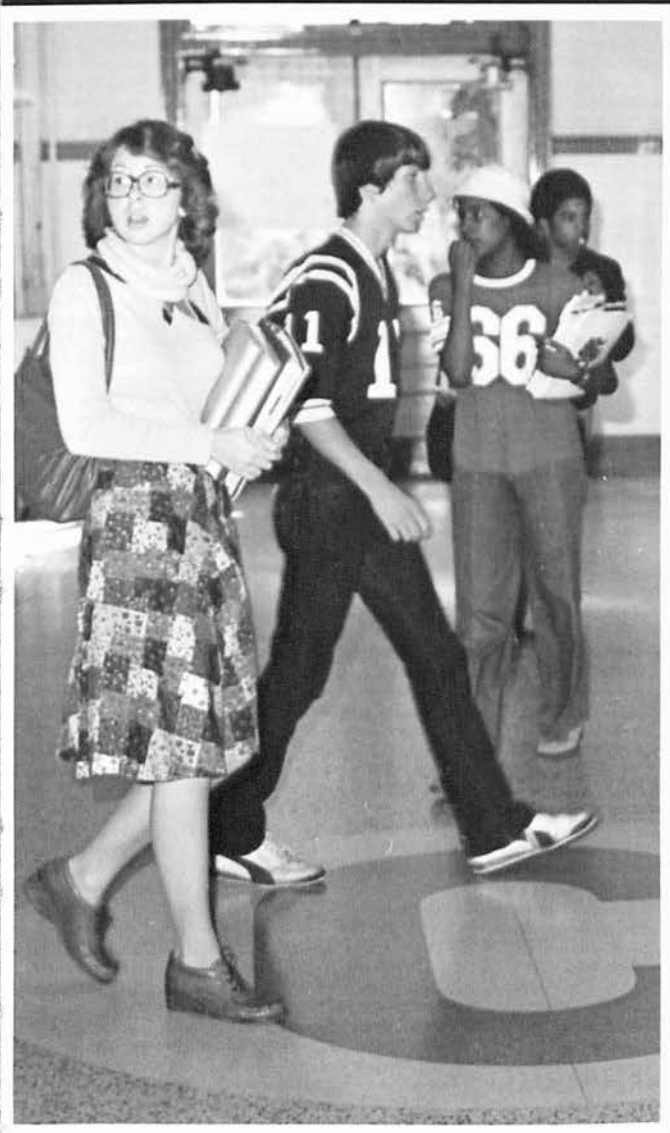

In junior high, we developed new interests. Pierced ears, football games, and "going together" were important. We were anxious to become adults.





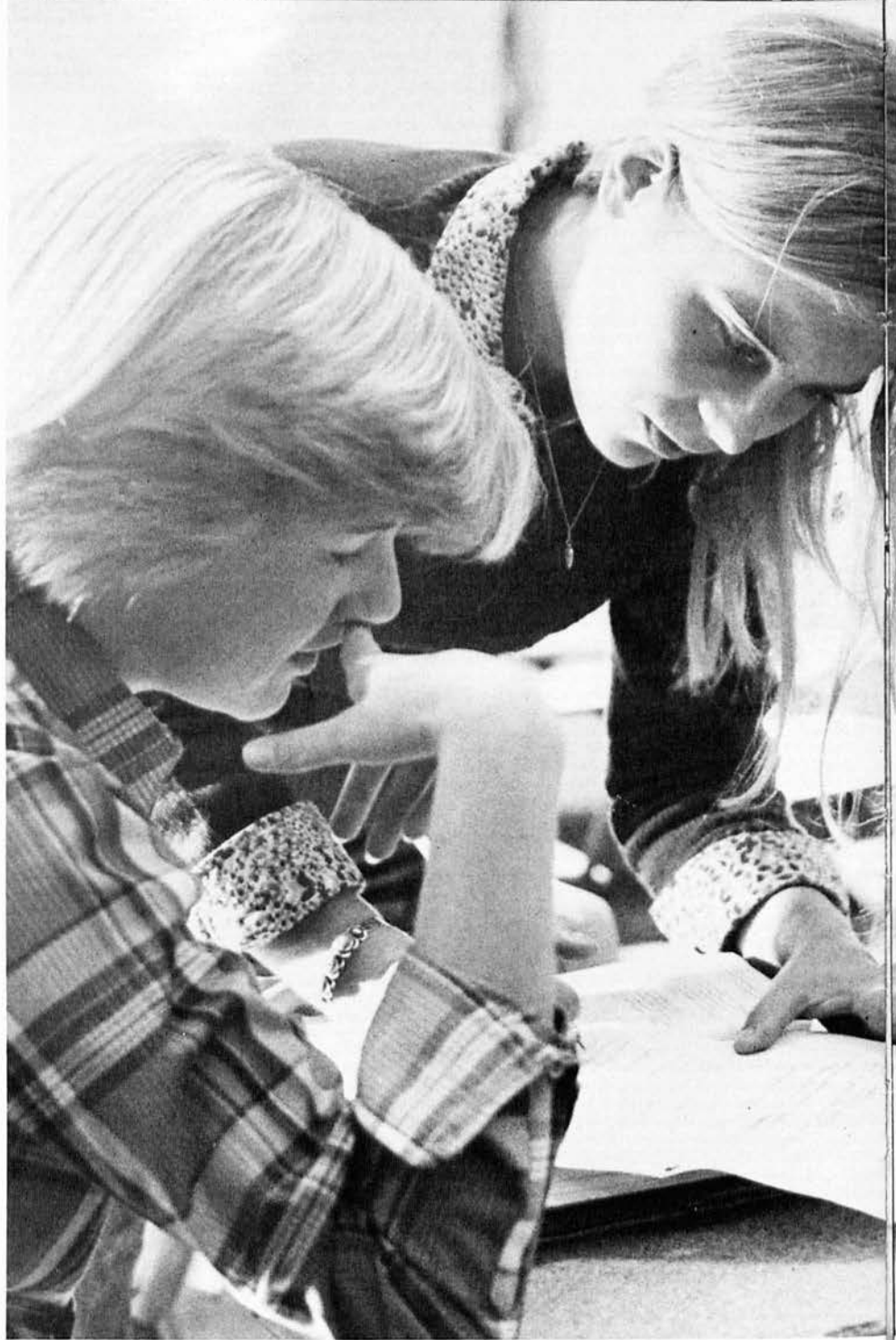


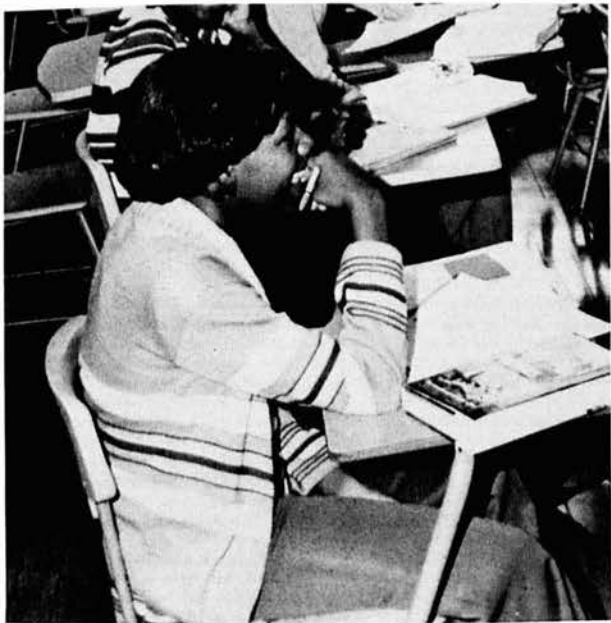
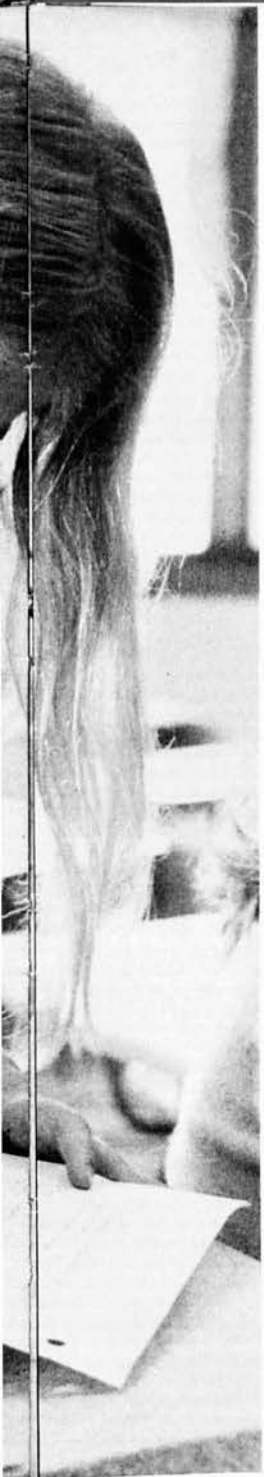


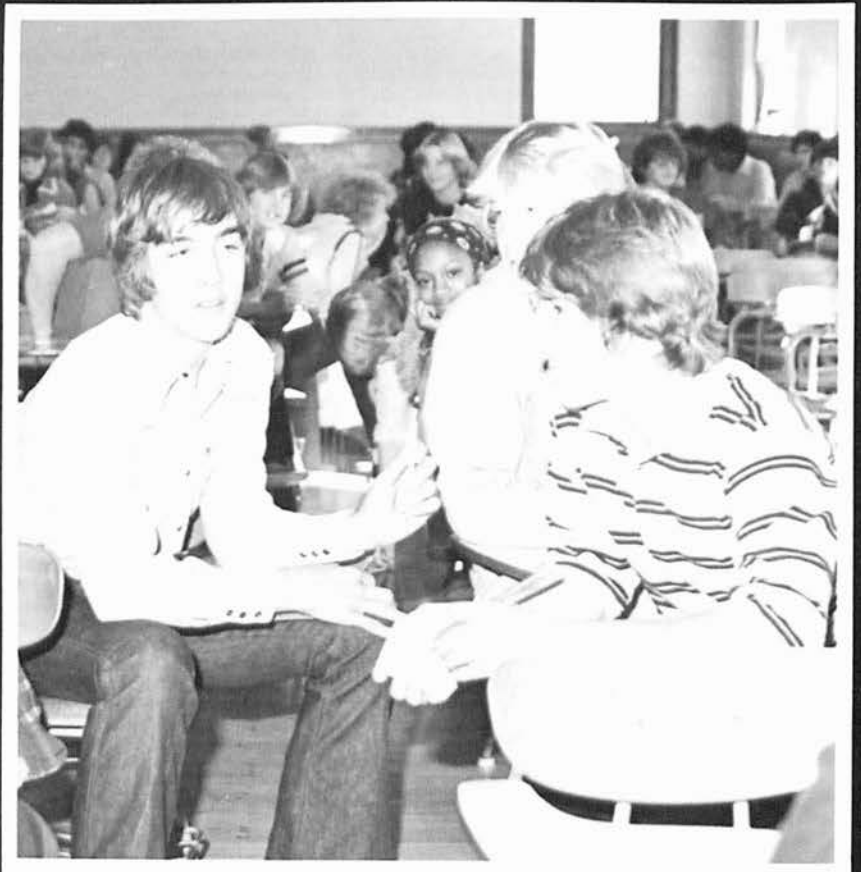
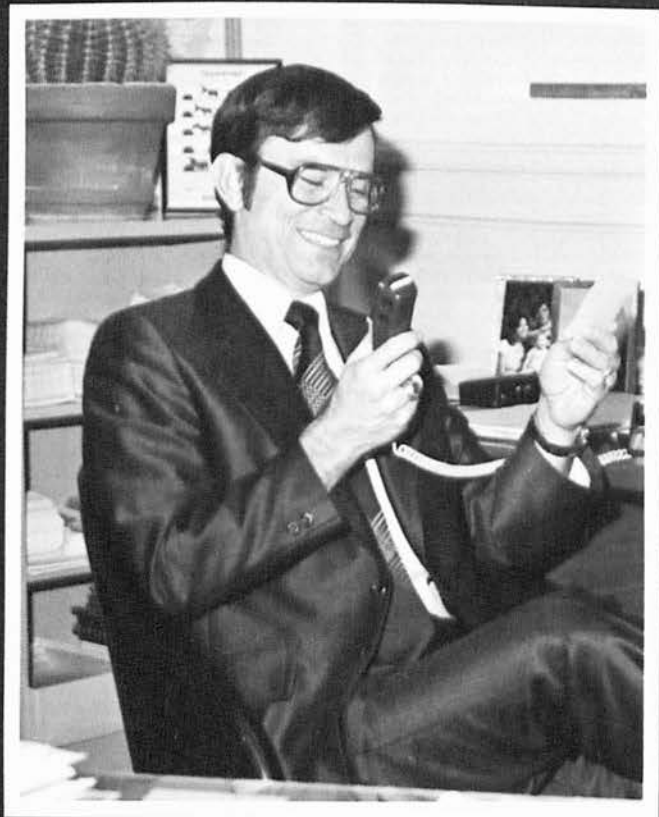

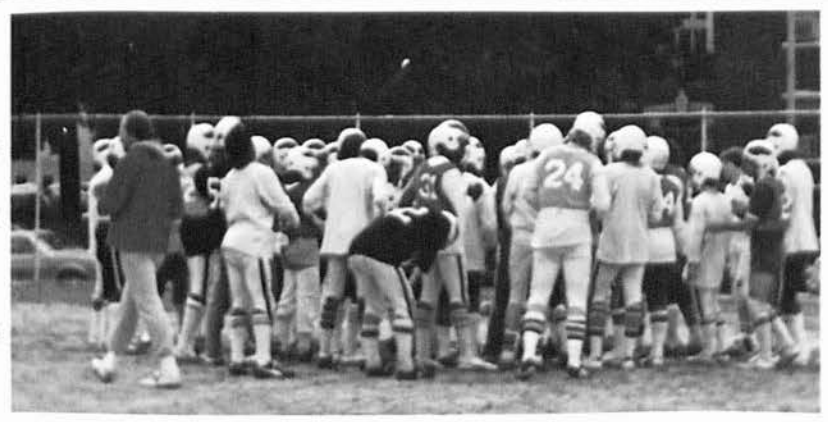
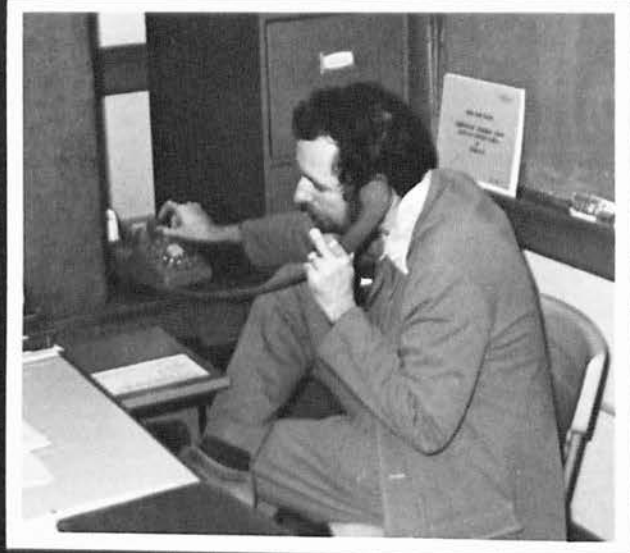
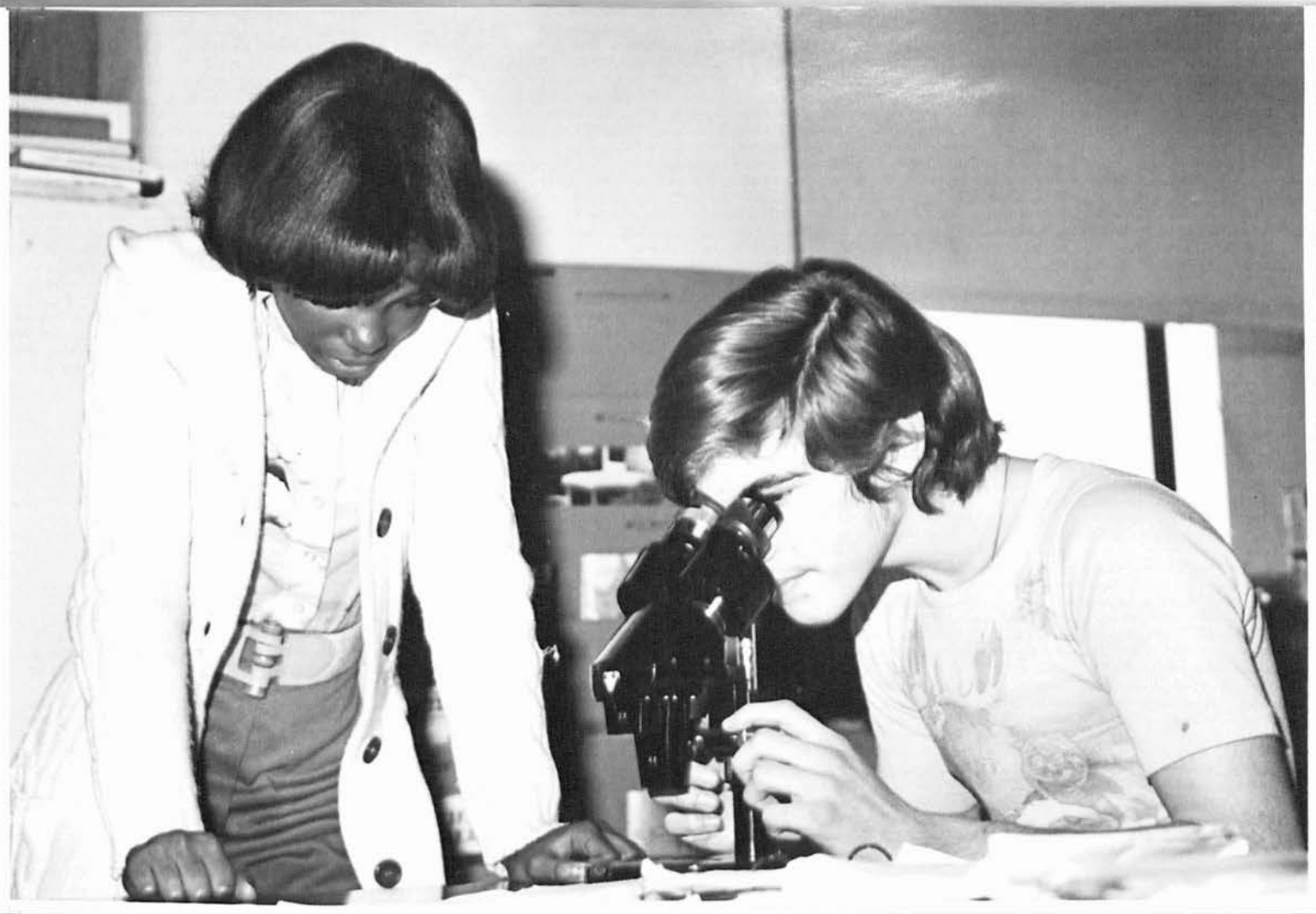
While at Central we have seen various changes. With the advent of integration, Central's total enrollment decreased, and the school lost its freshman class. Yellow school buses became a familiar sight.

In the fall, ground was broken for a new gym. The addition to the 78 year old building symbolizes the commitment that has been made to Central's future.

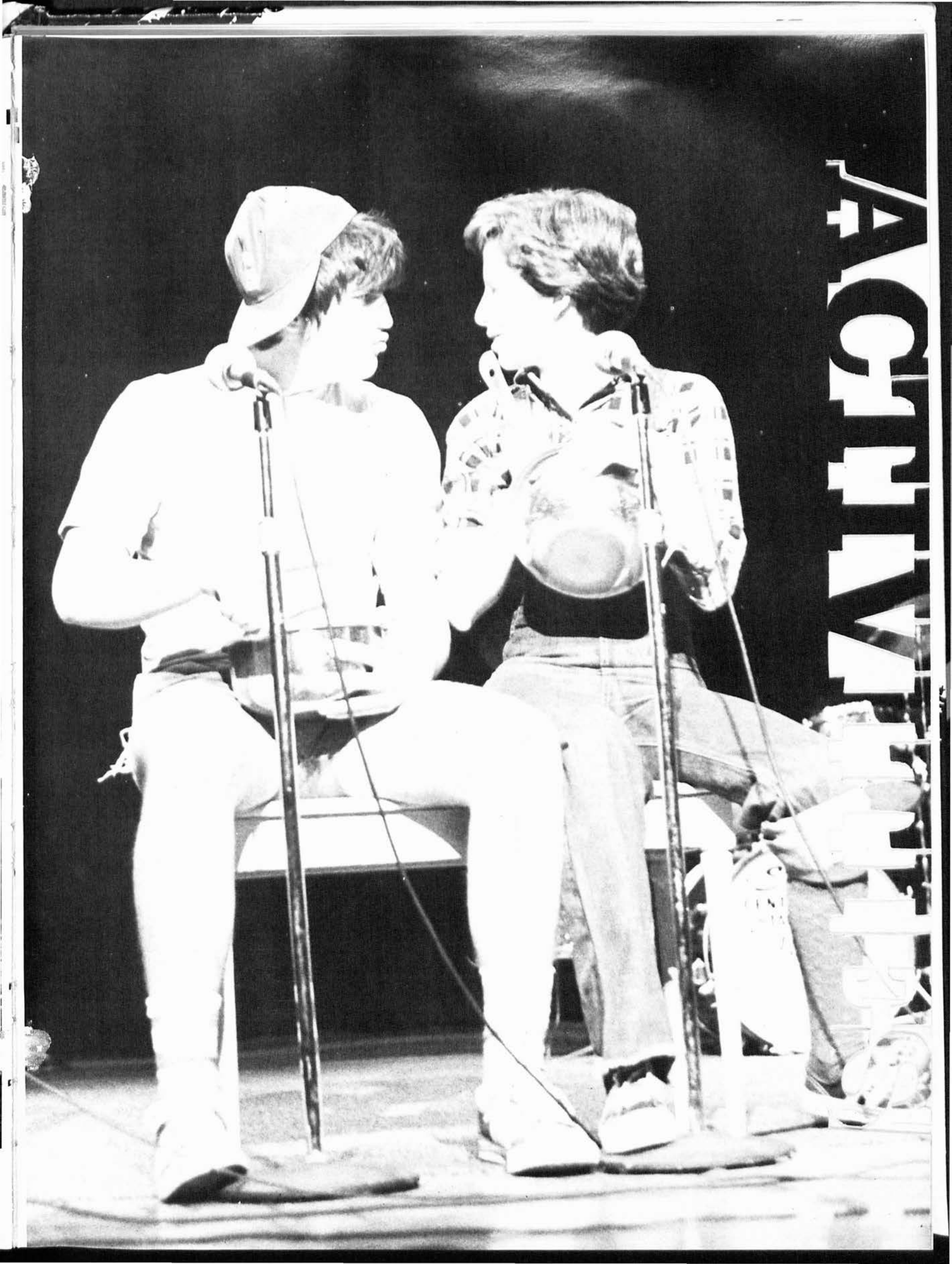


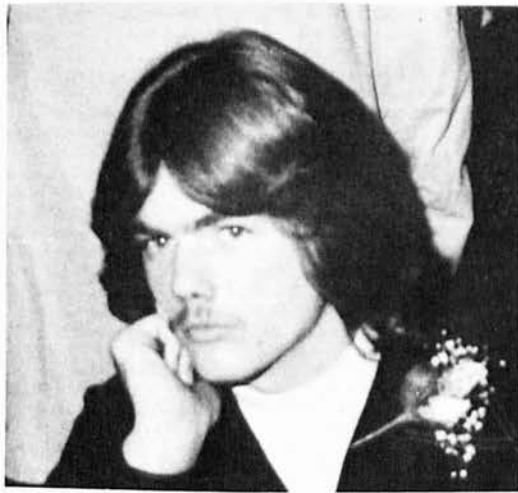

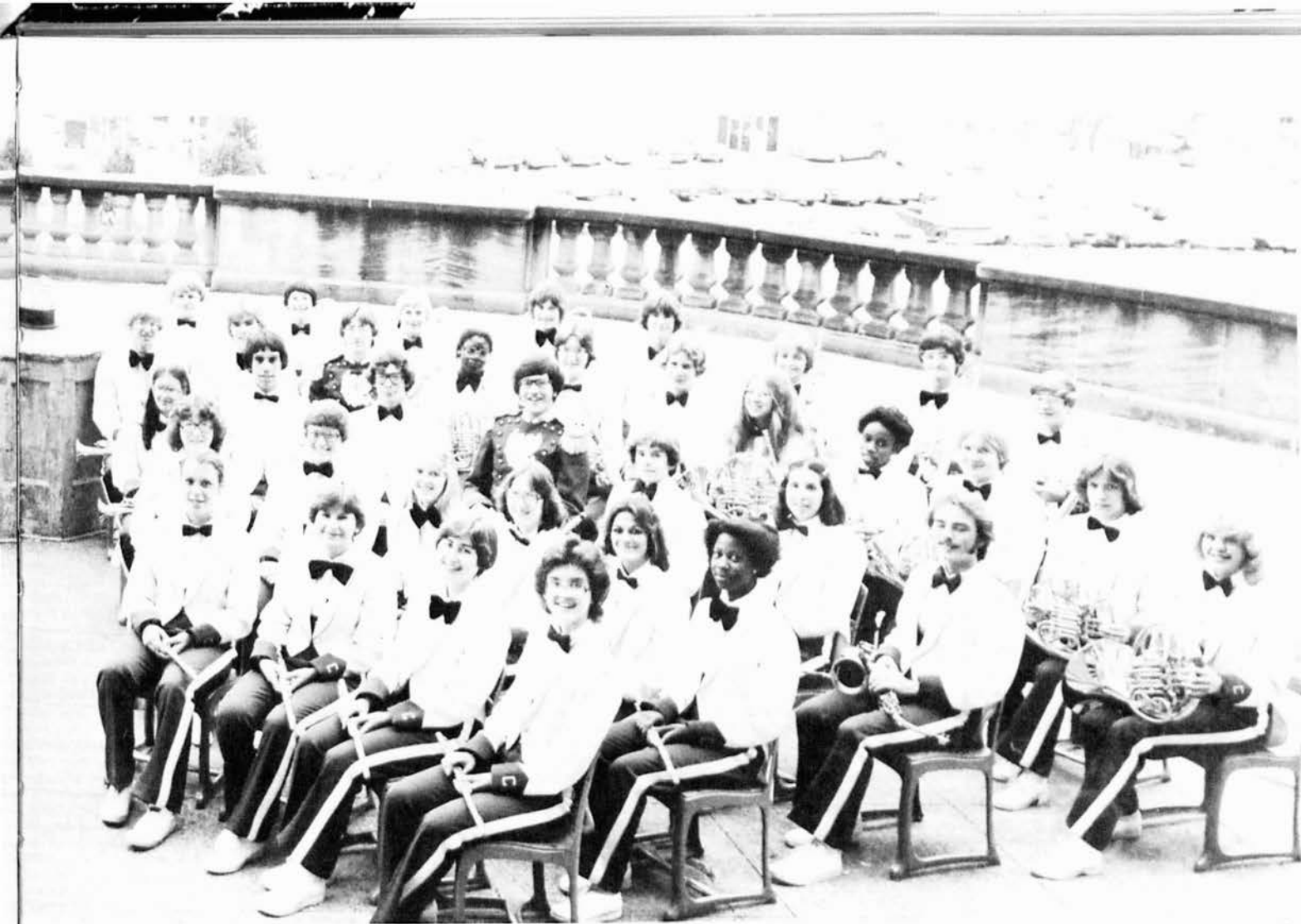


Band

The varsity football team finished the season with a 5-3-1 record, the best Central has had since 1960.

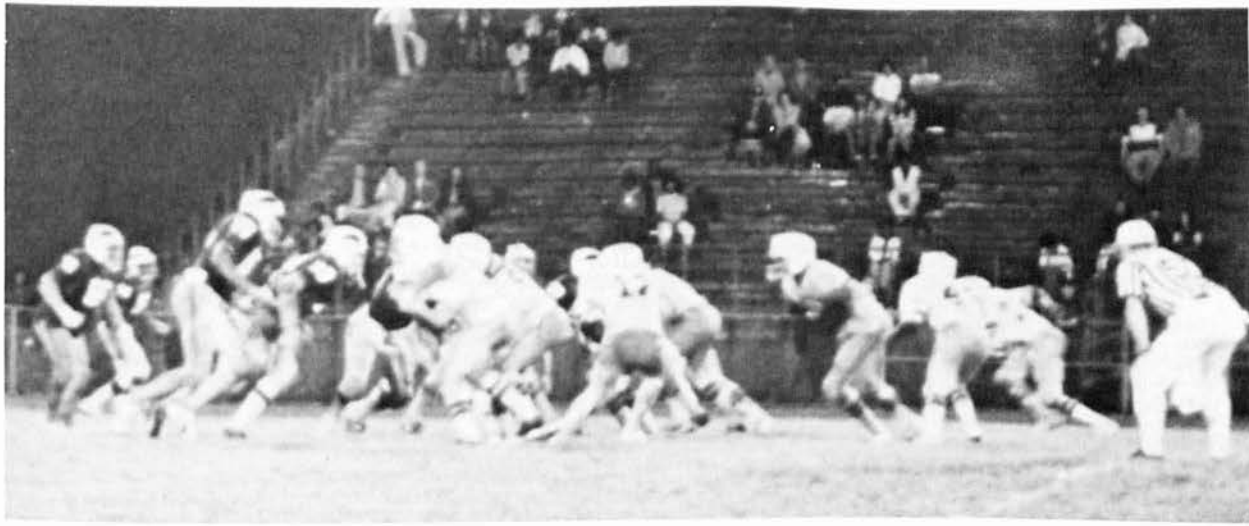

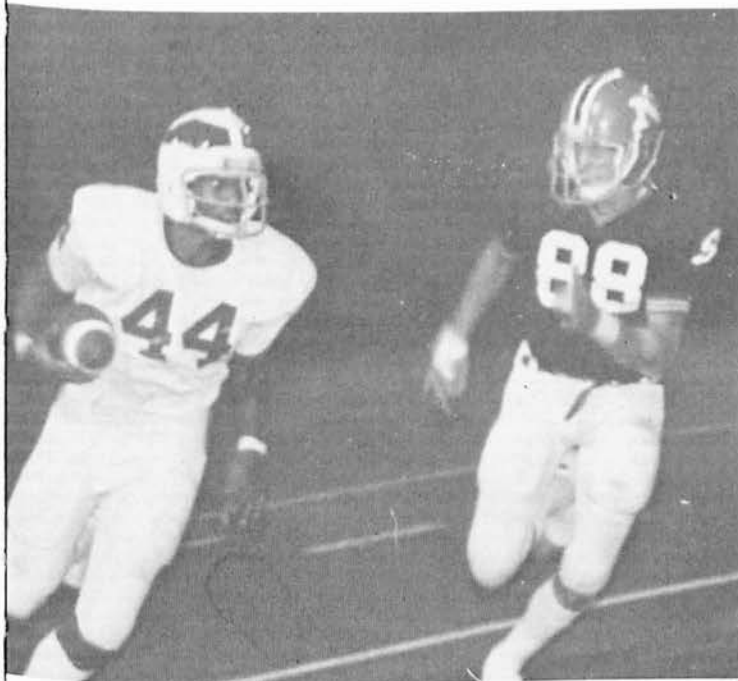
In leading yardage, Danny Goodwin took it with 802 yards. Kirk Curry and Perry Washington also led with 228 and 218 yards respectively.

Next year's team will be set. There will be five returning starters, all with a lot of talent.

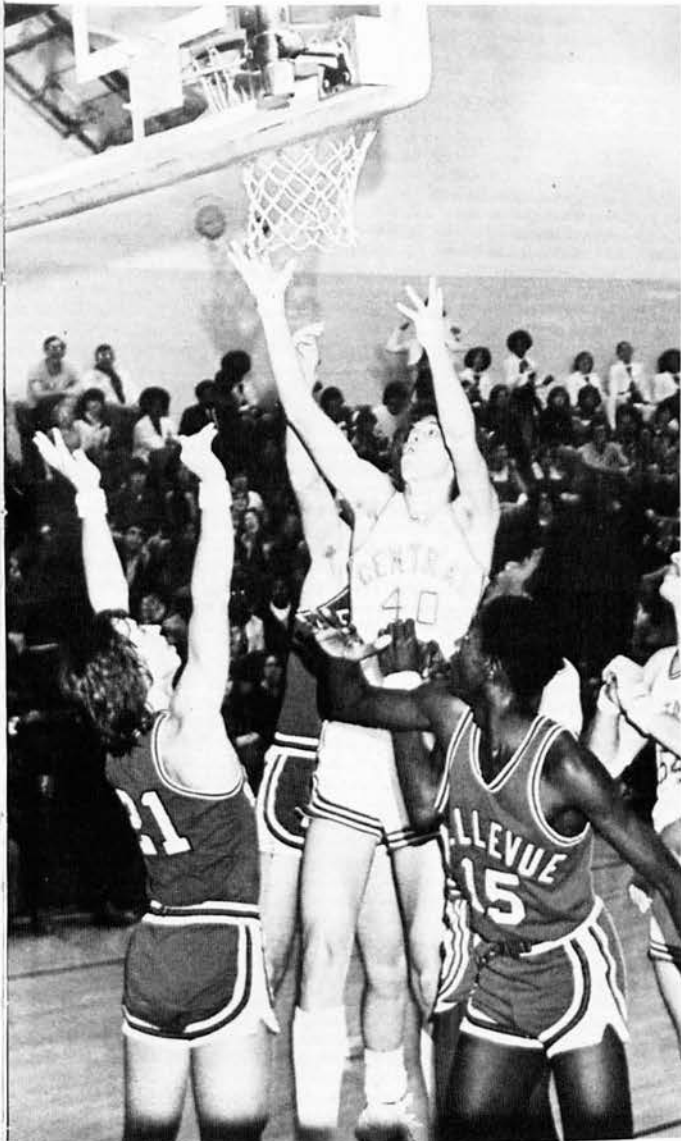

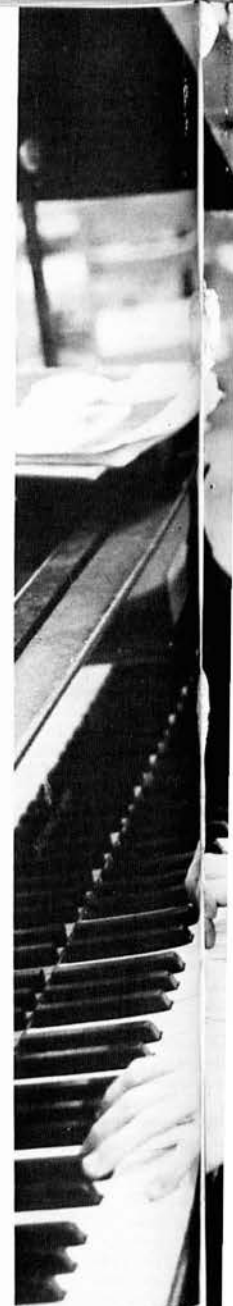
Now upon us are the last days of this school season. Underclassmen are making last minute changes on their prospective schedules and preparing for the coming summer.

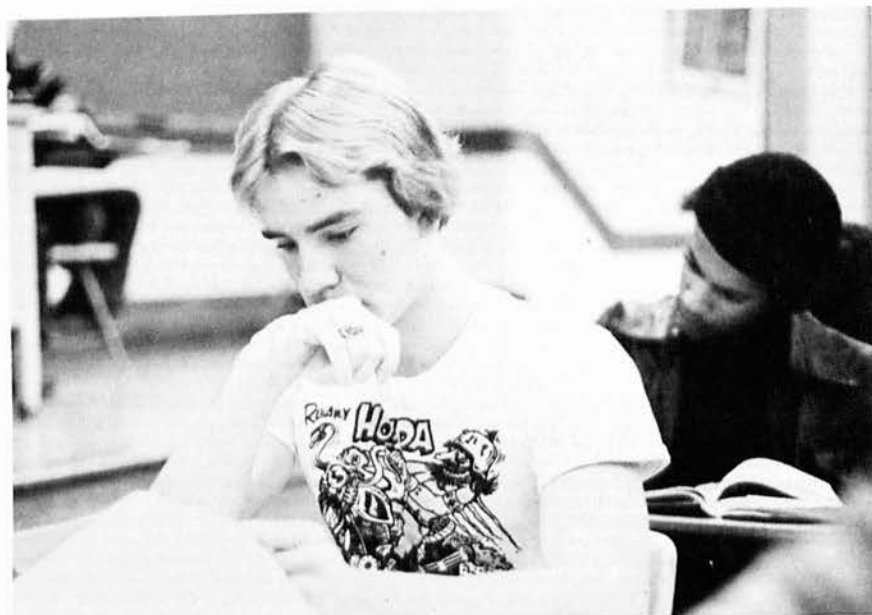
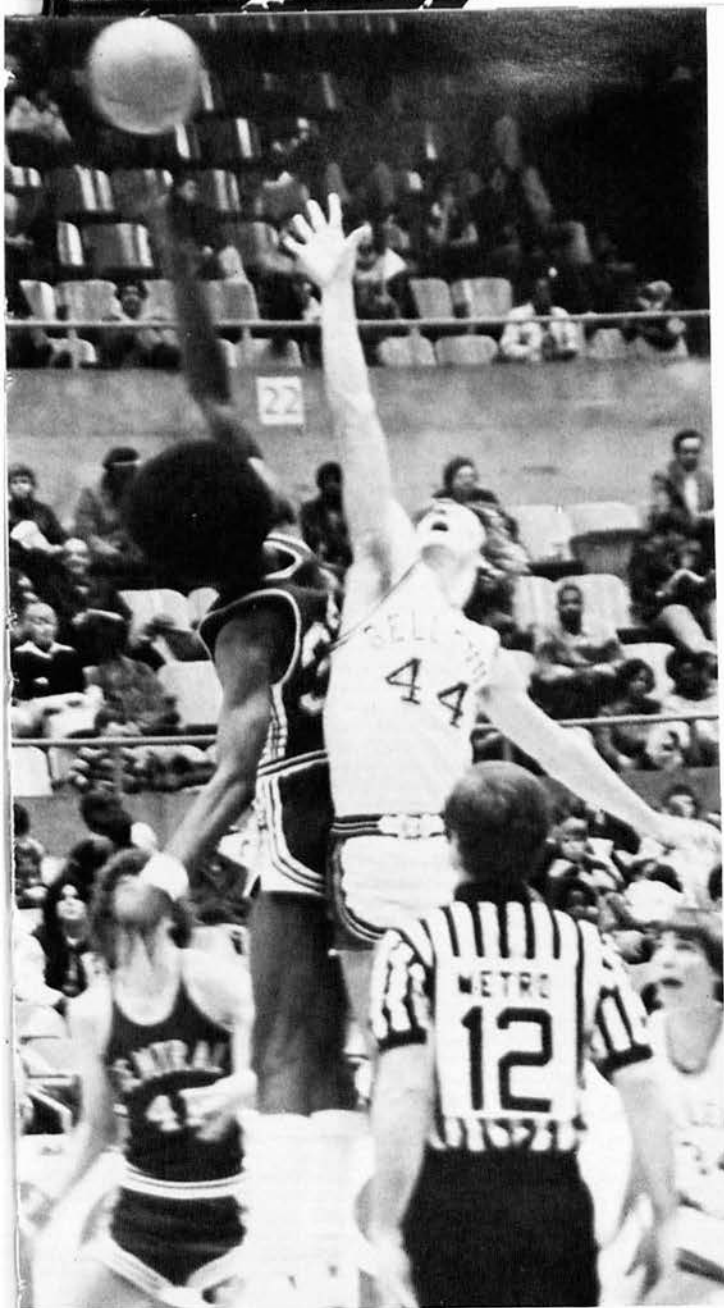
In the last moments of a basketball game, we have all felt a surge of excitement. As the Central players glided down the court, we rose to our feet and gradually lost the use of our voices.
