The future will soon be the present.







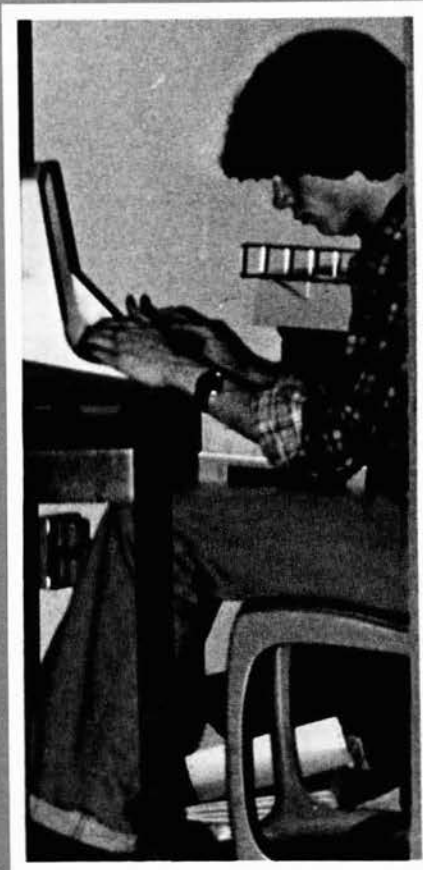


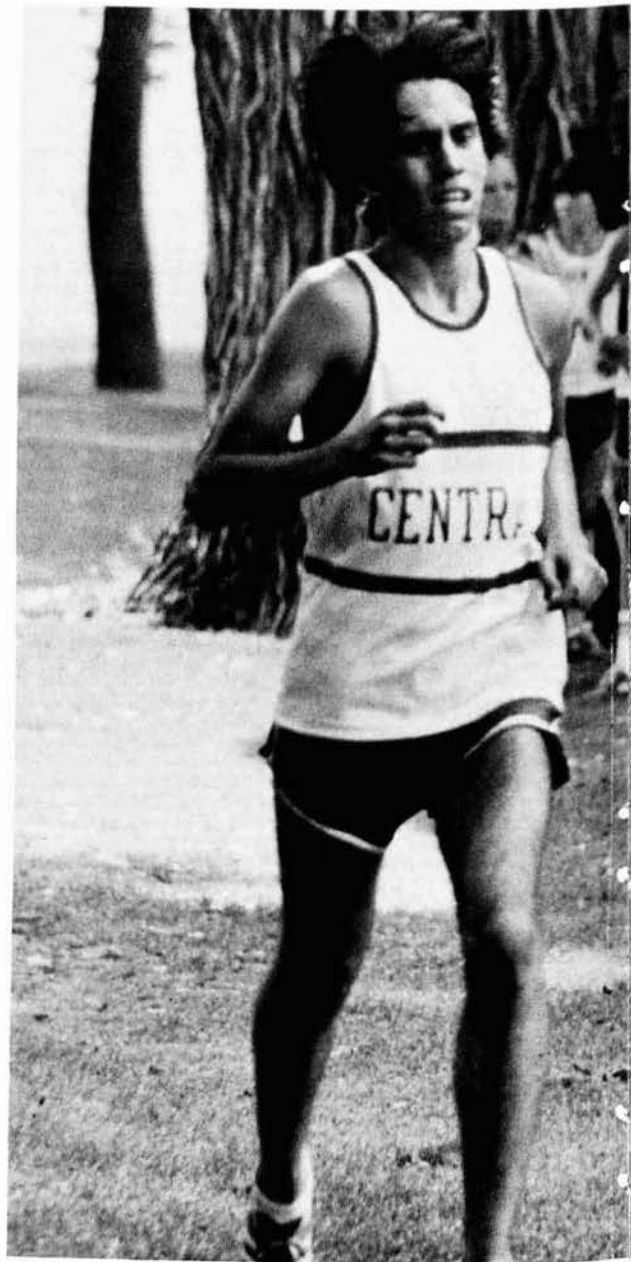

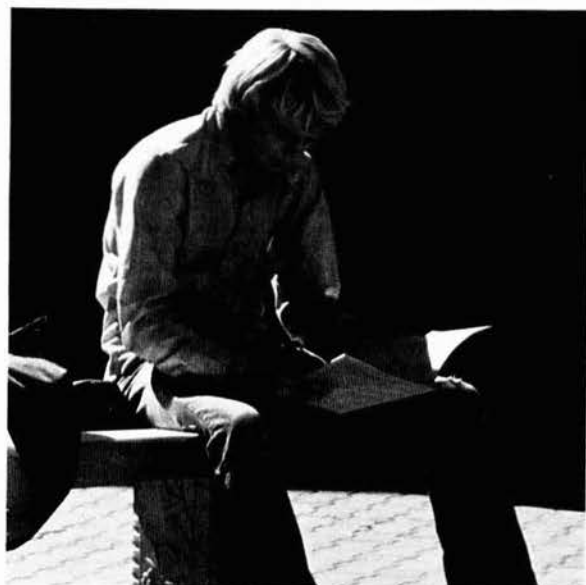
Central has opened many doors to a successful future. Three years ago we walked in Central's doors—soon we will walk out the same doors, completely changed.



Central has prepared us today for our future tomorrow.

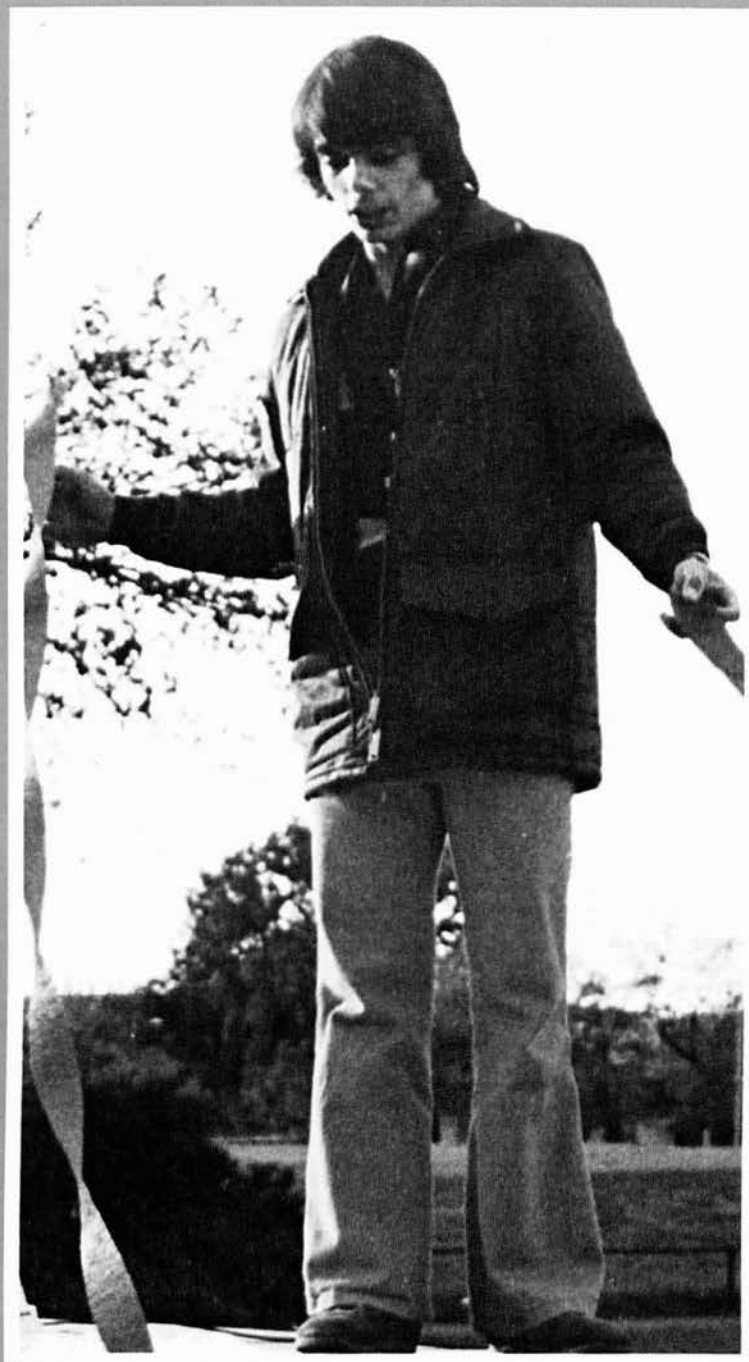








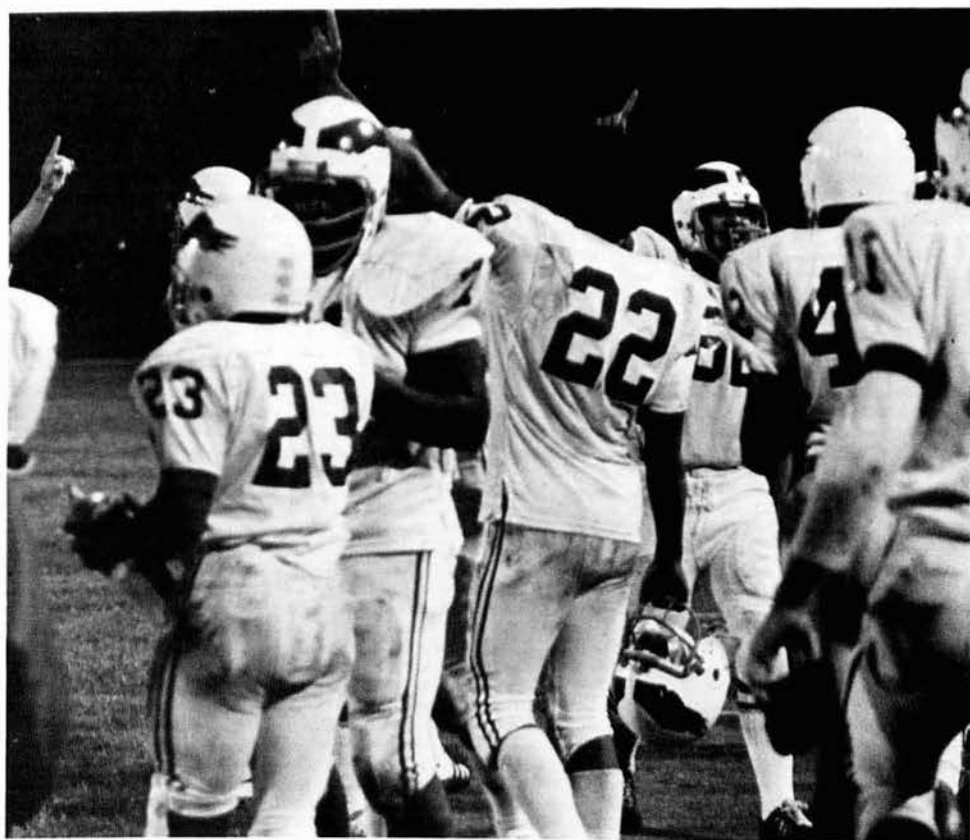
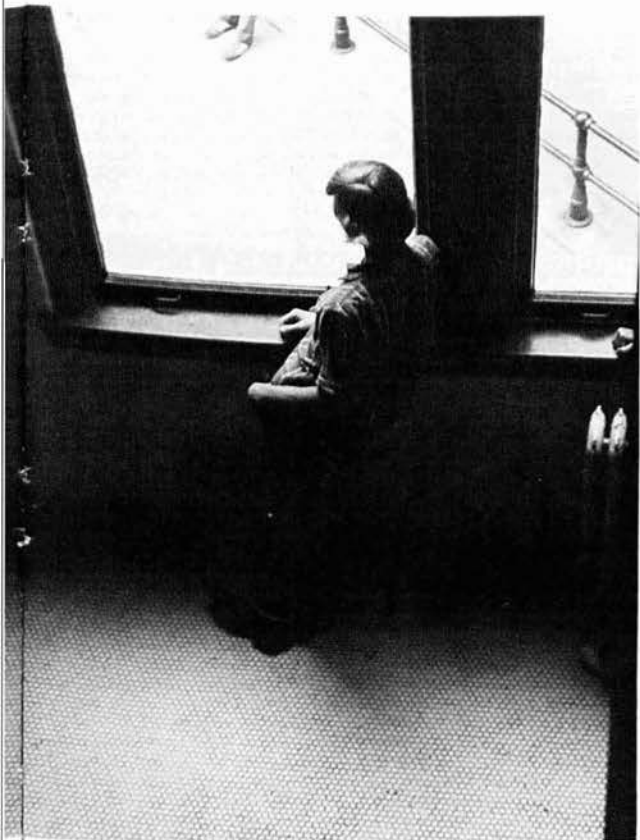
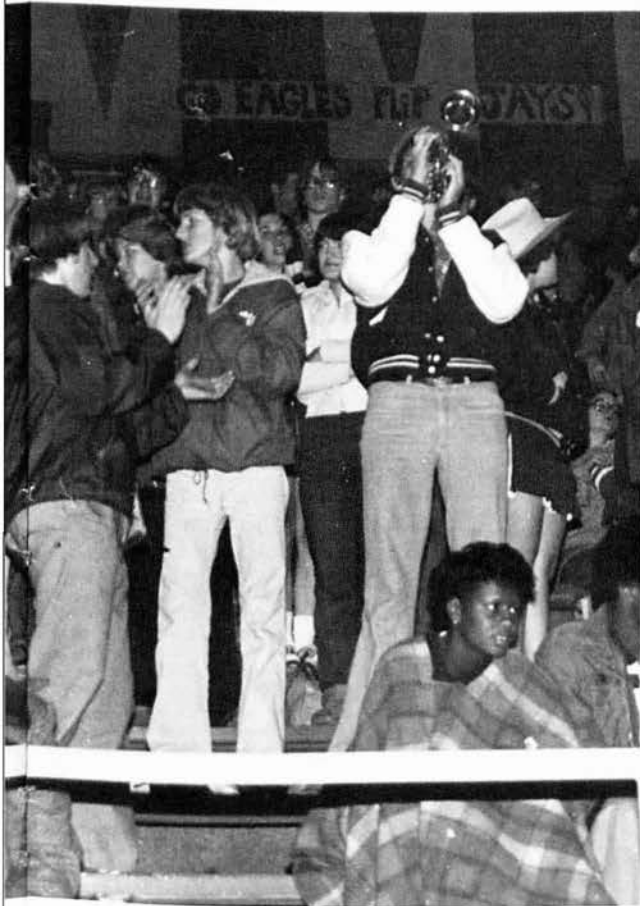

At the sound of the bell the halls come alive.

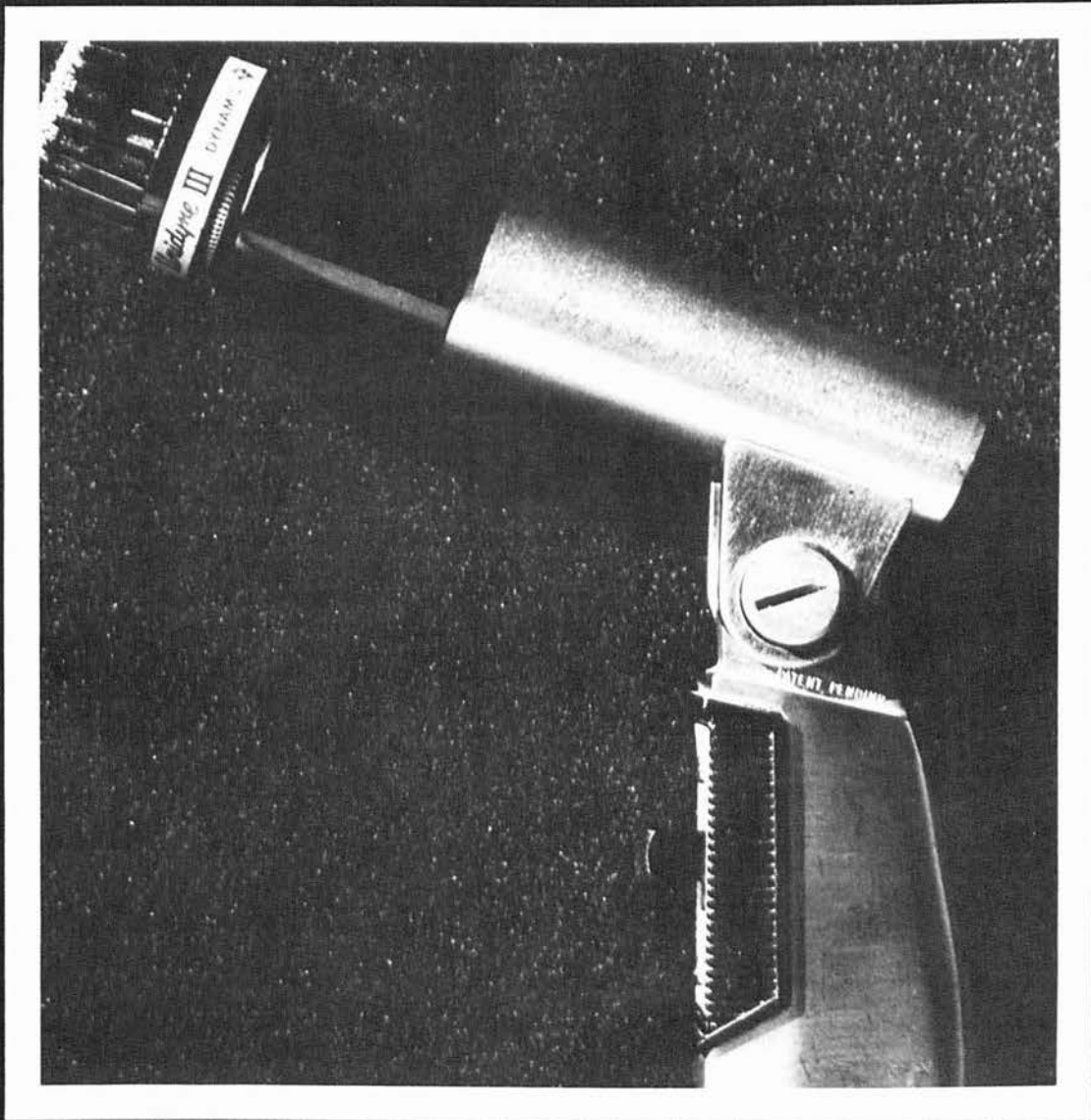
The four minute passing period is more than just a passing period. It is a time for students to gather in small groups. It is a chance to chat with a friend or to take one last glance at the day's notes.

Boys' and Girls' State, sponsored by the American Legion, gives students an opportunity to learn about and participate in state government.

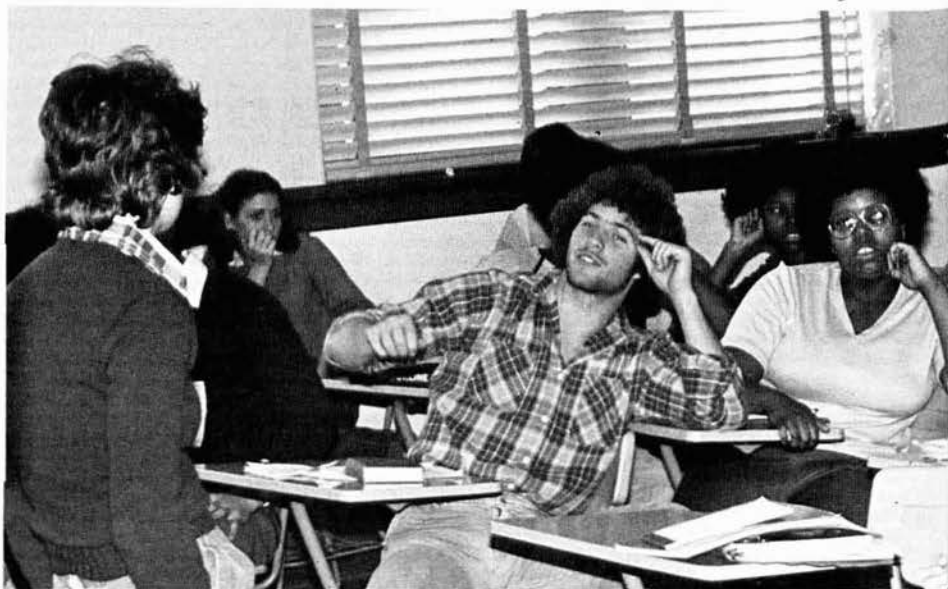
Karen Ray was named one of 300 in the honor's category of the Westinghouse National Talent Search for her experiments with the use of heat pipes.

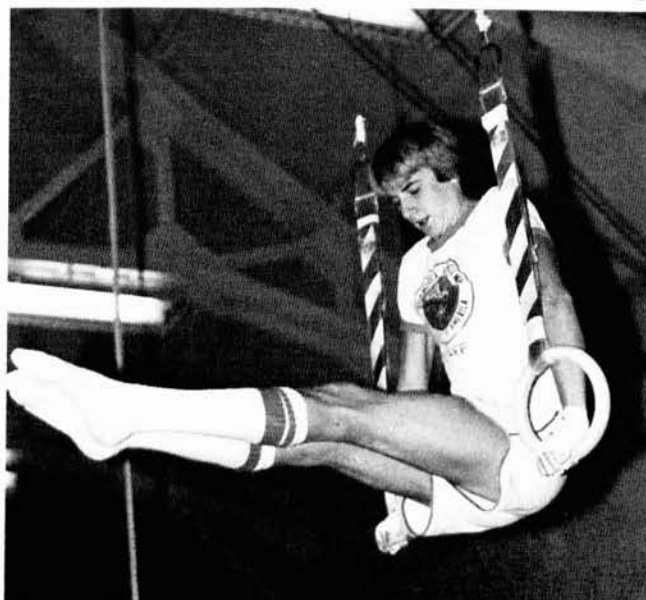
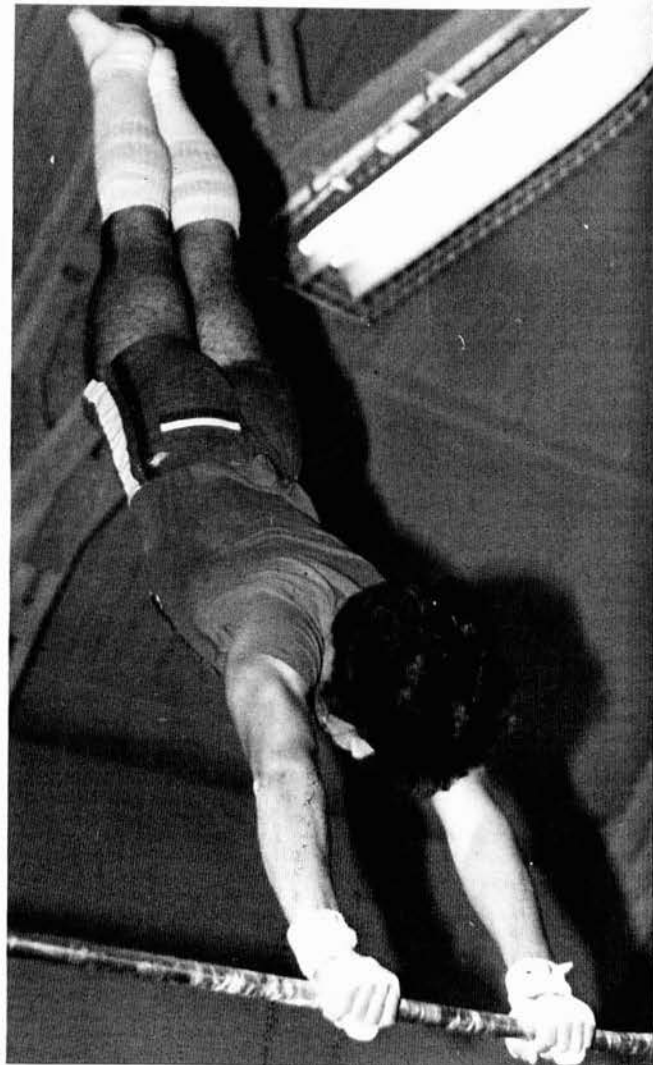
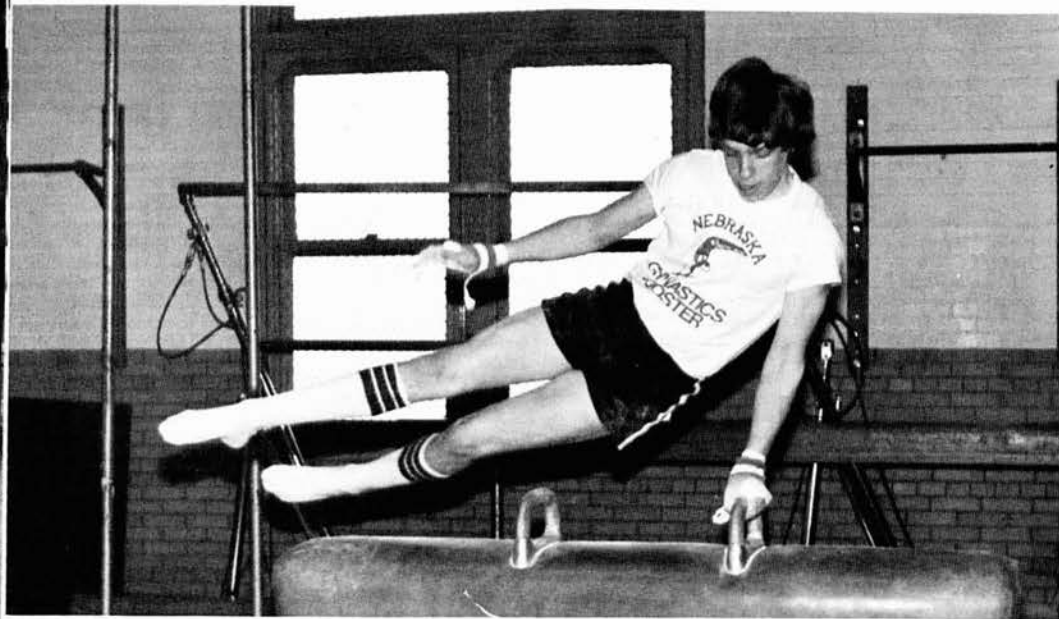
J.V.'s, the future Eagles

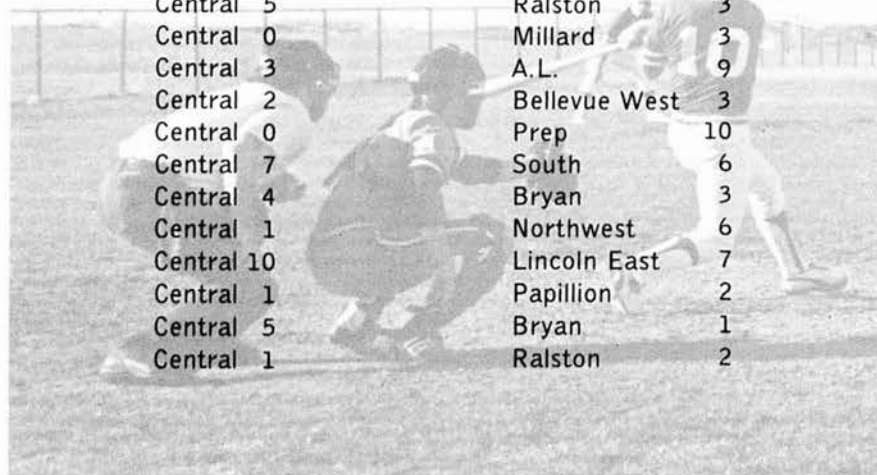
Baseball team hits home

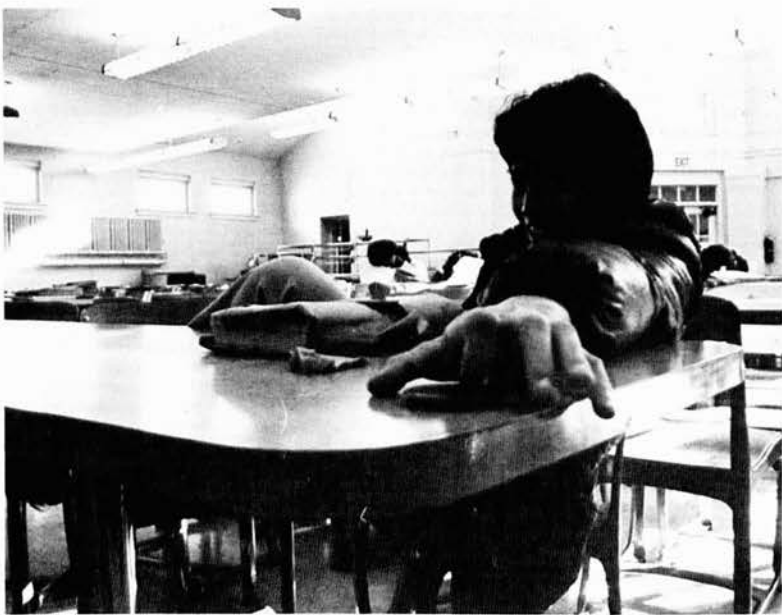
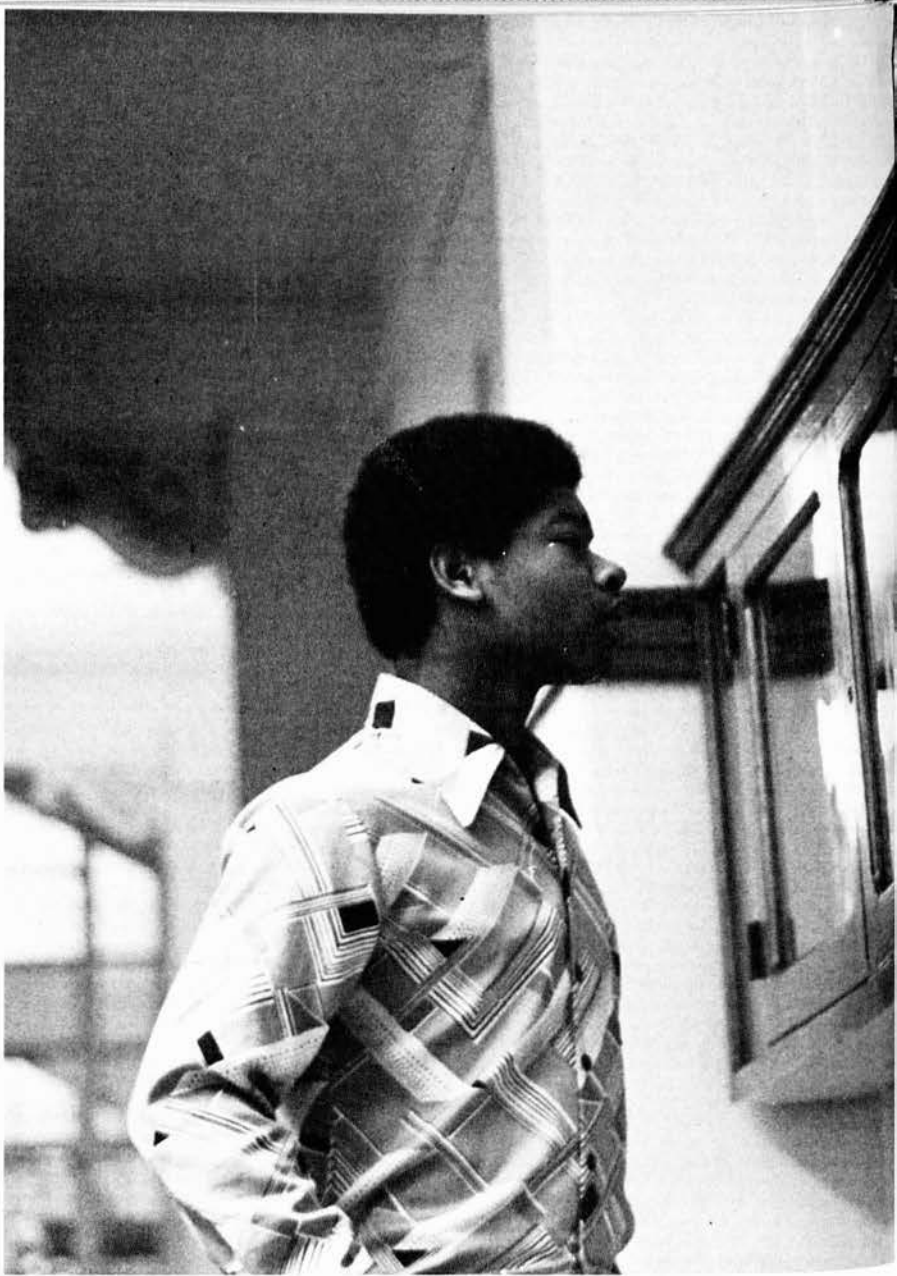


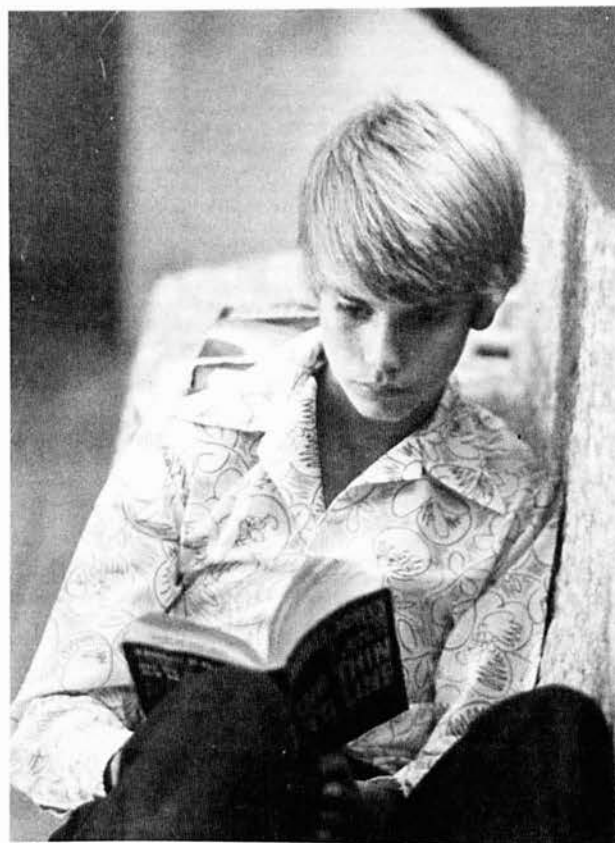
Years from now our friends will be scattered across the country. We will have different jobs, different opinions, and different friends. But we will always have one bond—the memory of our high school years at Central.

When Central is no longer our life, it will become our memory; a memory that will always bind us together.

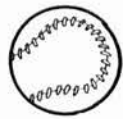
