JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY

JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY, which was founded in 1923 by Principal J. G. Masters for the purpose of recognizing individuality and high achievement both in scholarship and in school activities, of encouraging leadership, and of developing character among the students of the freshman, sophomore, and junior classes, is considered the highest goal toward which an underclassman of Central High school may strive.

In the freshman year, scholarship and character are the only requisites for membership, but in the sophomore and junior years, leadership and service to the school are also taken into consideration. To become a member of any of the chapters a student must receive two A's and no grade lower than B. If he is carrying five subjects he is permitted to have one C.

Three chapters compose the organization: Epsilon for freshmen, Delta for sophomores, and Gamma for juniors. This year 189 underclassmen were elected to membership by a general council of faculty members under the chairmanship of Mrs. Edna S. Dana, a member of the Commercial department. At the end of one year active membership ceases, but graduates who have belonged to the Junior Honor society are considered honorary members.

Announcement of the election of this year's members was made in the Central High school auditorium on May 4, with Assistant Principal Fred Hill in charge. J. G. Schmidt, physics teacher, announced the names of the juniors who had been elected to the Gamma chapter; Frank M. Rice, English teacher, read the list of new members of the Delta chapter, and Mrs. Irene Haskins Jensen, music instructor and adviser of freshman girls, announced the Epsilon chapter. Miss Jessie Towne, dean of girls, gave the charge.

PUBLICATIONS

LONG RECOGNIZED for its excellent journalistic merit, the Central High Register, a weekly publication, has been a part of Central High school since 1874. Under the direction of Mrs. Anne Lane Savidge, the paper is published by students who have had one or more semesters of journalism. All-American Honor rating, one of the highest awards conferred by the National Scholastic Press association, was received again this year for the period of 1935-1936; this rating was also won for the years 1927-1932.

This year marked the tenth anniversary of the founding of Quill and Scroll, international honorary society for high school journalists. To celebrate the event, Quill and Scroll and the journalism round-table sponsored a banquet attended by journalism students from Omaha and Council Bluffs high schools and universities. The forty students elected this year bring the total membership of Central High's Quill and Scroll chapter to 364, admitted since 1926.

The Central High Press club was formed this year so that members of the journalism department might meet together to make suggestions for and to offer criticisms of the content, makeup, and other phases of the paper, and to provide speakers. James Milliken was elected president of the organization; Charles Harris, vice-president; Jack Sabata, secretary-treasurer.

Under editorship of Richard D. Smith, the Latin club published the ninth annual Loquax, newspaper of the Latin department, as a special commemorative edition to honor Central High school's first graduating class of sixty years ago. The paper, printed on May 8 as a part of the regular Register, also contained prize winning translations in the Susan Paxson Latin examinations. While chief editors were selected from the Register staff, other members of the group were chosen by Mrs. Bernice Engle and Mrs. Bessie Rathbun, instructors in the Latin department.

The O-Book, annual publication of the senior class, was published by a staff composed of members of the Register department, and by editors appointed from the senior class.

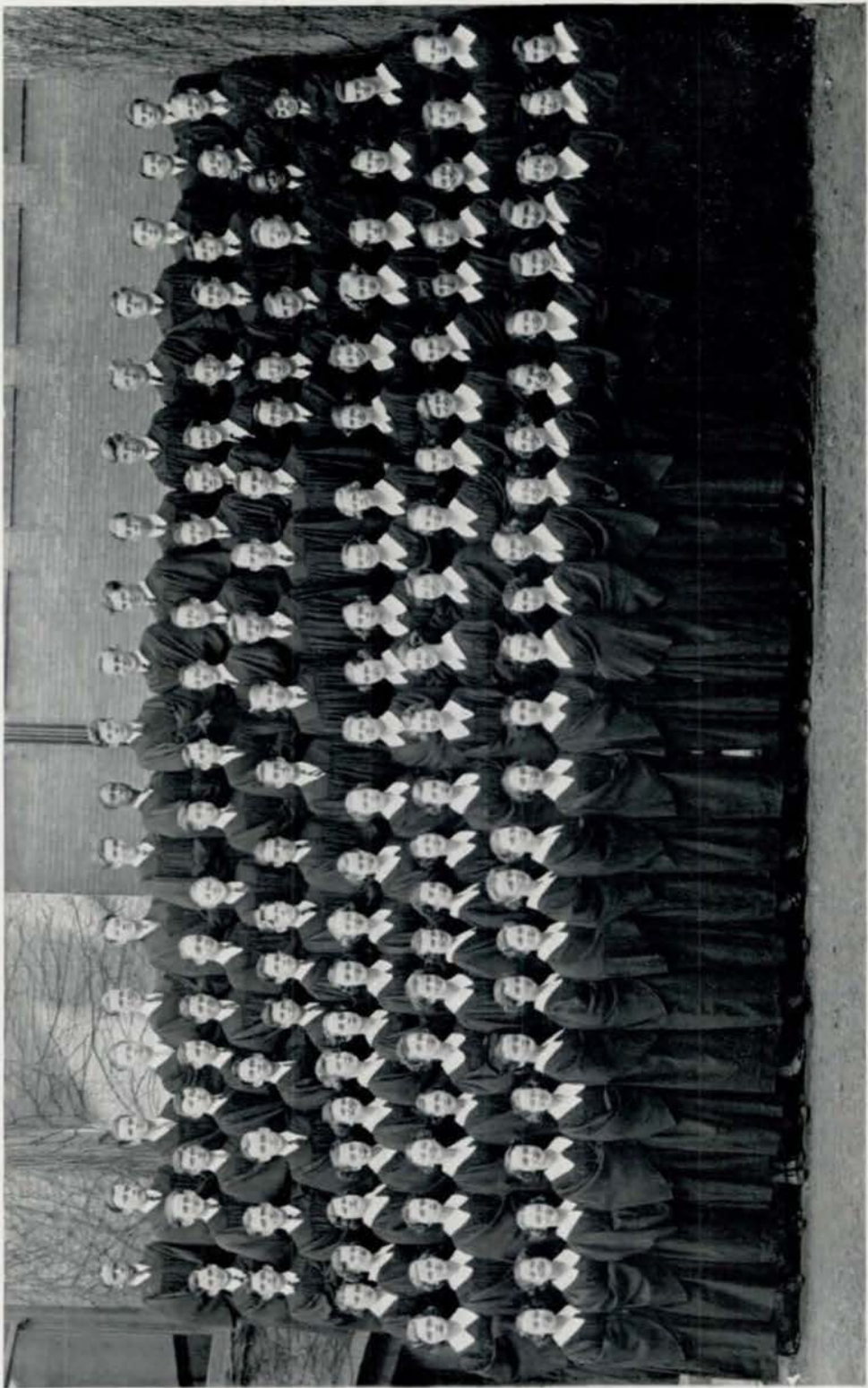

MUSIC DEPARTMENT

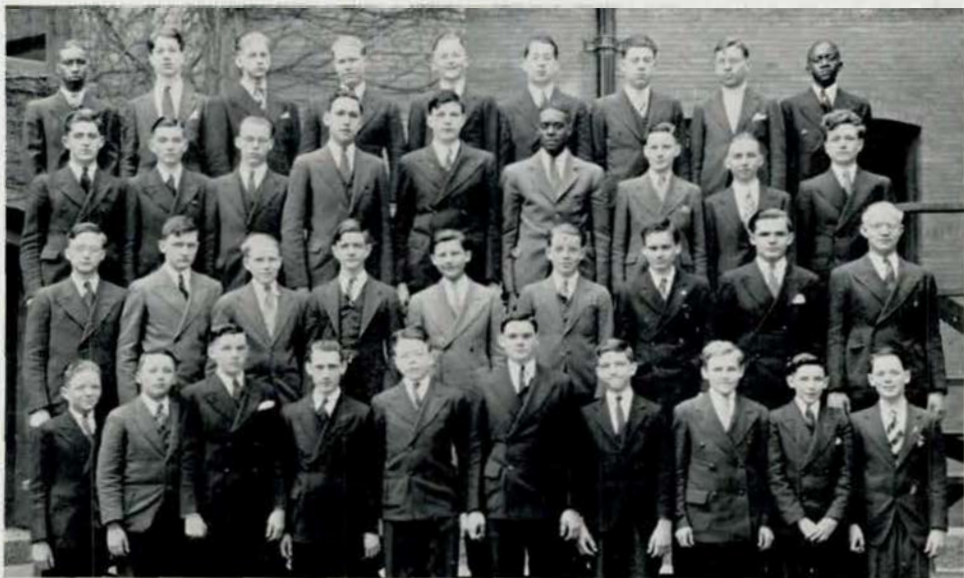

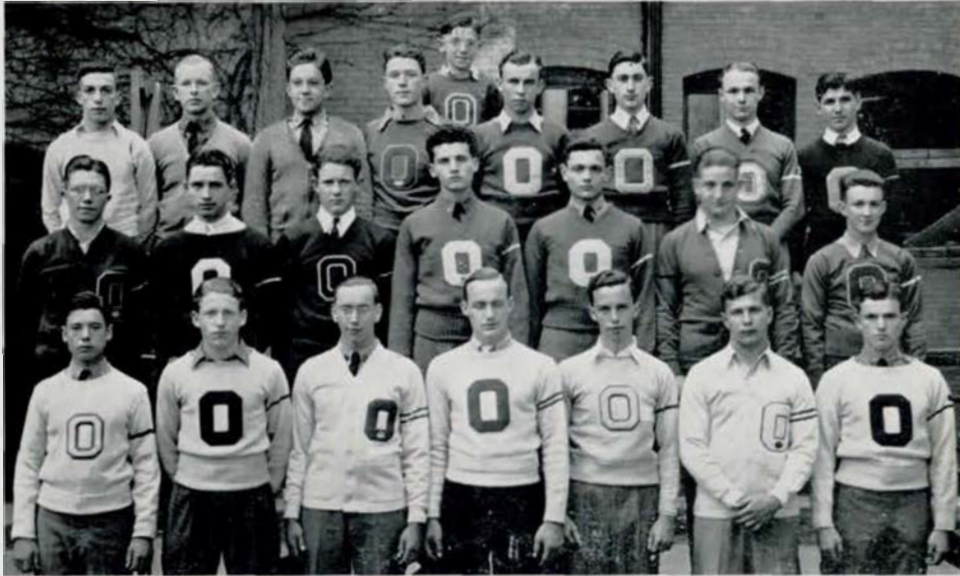

FOOTBALL

WITH EIGHT LETTERMEN in the lineup, the Eagles from Central opened their 1935 season with a 25 to 0 conquest over Fremont. Scoring almost at will, the Purples were easily the masters throughout the game. In the second contest, the Eagles encountered a heavy and strong St. Joe Central team, and pulled out with a scoreless tie after displaying remarkable defensive ability.

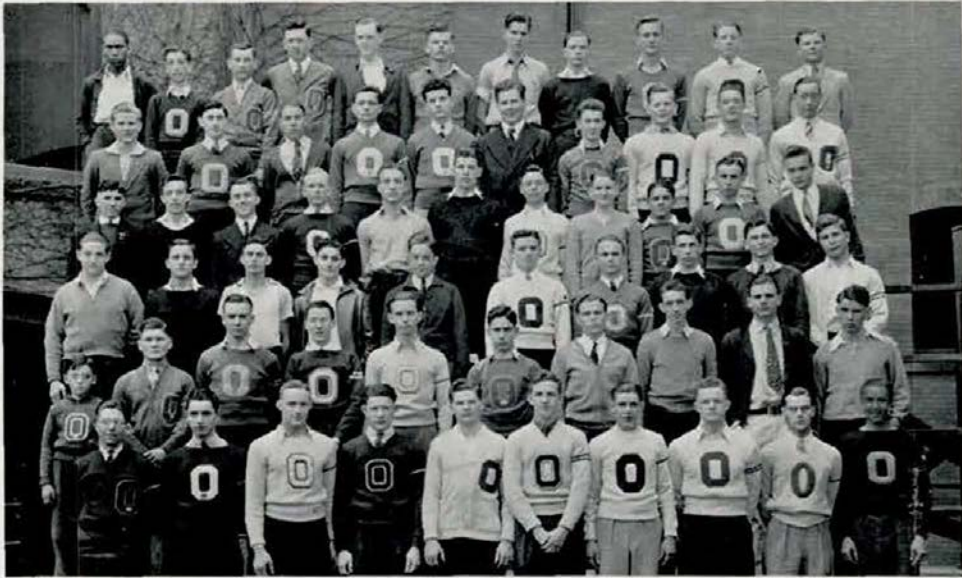
Traveling over to Council Bluffs, Central suffered a letdown after the hard struggle against St. Joe, and eked out a 14-0 victory over Abraham Lincoln. Against South, the Eagles picked up where they left off at Fremont, and promptly swamped the Packers by a 19 to 0 score. In this game Central found its scoring punch and won easily.

Playing a heady and smart game, the Eagles rolled up 13 points against their ancient rivals, Tech, in the first half, and then let up in the second half — in fact, the last few minutes — to enable their rivals to score 12 points. With a few seconds to play and victory hanging in balance, virtually the whole Purple line broke through to block the try for point that would have tied the game.

Meeting North on a wet field, the Purples suffered another letdown, and managed to pull out with a scoreless tie over an inspired Viking eleven. Central suffered its worst defeat of the year at the hands of the state champions — Lincoln. With the field a slough of mud and without the services of their ace punter, Bane, the Eagles were hopelessly outclassed by a strong all-round team, 25-0.

In their last game, playing for the intercity championship, the Eagles were the victims of an injury jinx which removed four regulars from the game. This, together with the fact that Coach Justice was called out of the city the week prior to the game, resulted in the Purples' loss to Benson, 7-0.

Central's 1935 season record stands at 4 wins, 2 losses, 2 ties.



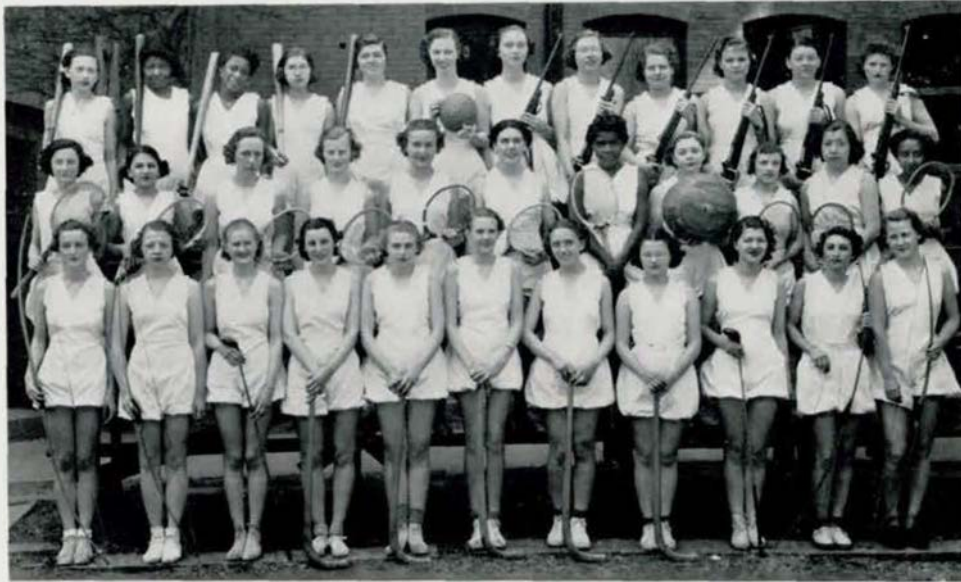

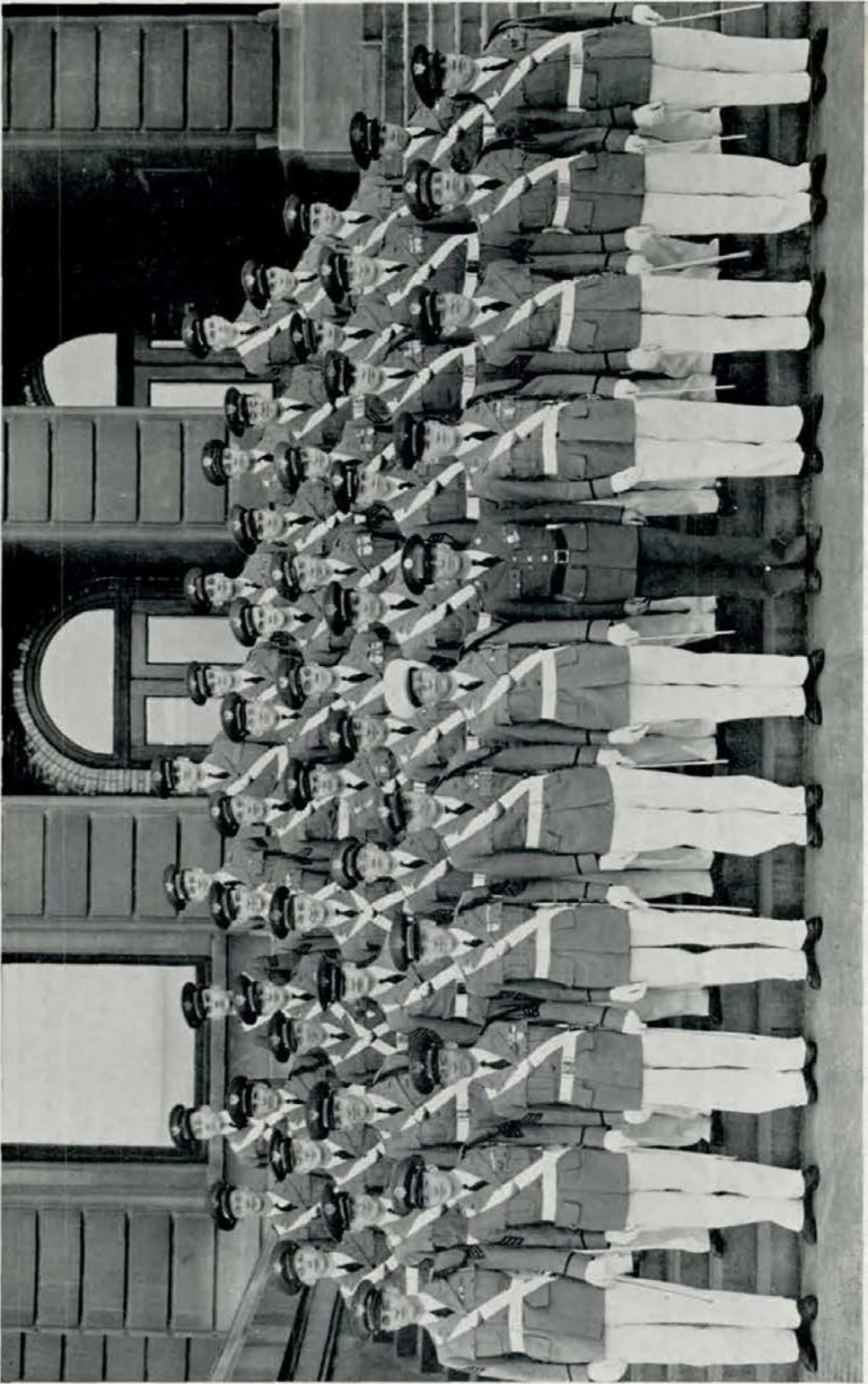

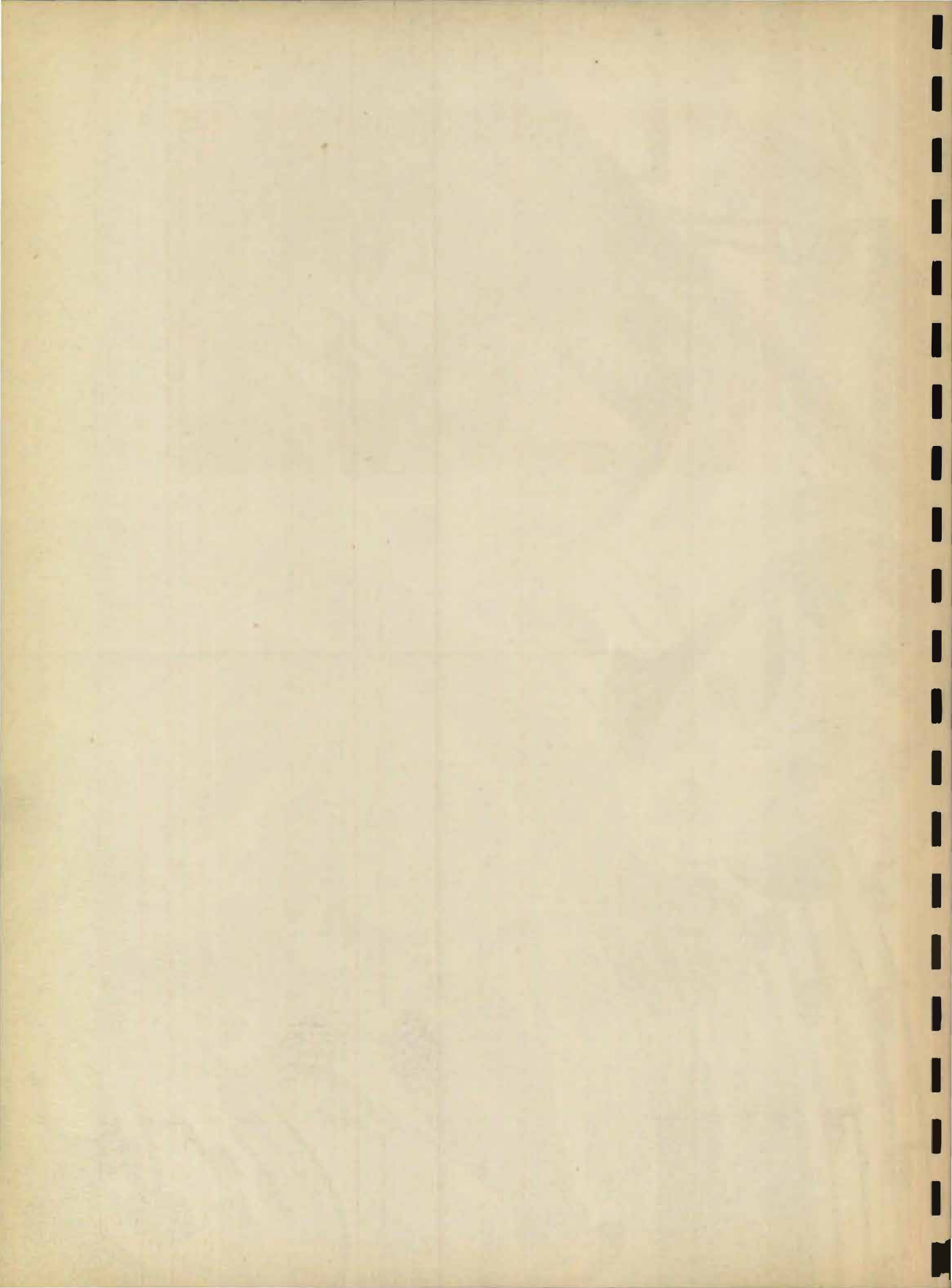

LININGER TRAVEL CLUB

The faculty sponsors are Miss Mary Parker, Mrs. Grace Knott, and Miss Margaret Mueller. All girls wishing to become members of the Lininger Travel club fill out application cards and are voted on by members of the club.

Travel talks are given by many people who have visited foreign countries. Some of the speakers for this year have been Miss Odessa Yant, who spent her winter in Cuba; Miss Elsie Fisher, who visited the Scandinavian countries last summer; and Miss May Mahoney, whose topic, "Through Unbiased Eyes," related to life of school girls in Spain, France, Belgium, and Italy, where she has studied.

As part of the club's charity work, baskets are sent to poor families at Thanksgiving and Christmas. The club also has a family which it takes care of by sending clothing, food, and money. The family is chosen by members of the club, and a committee is appointed to visit it often and give reports to the club.

Lininger Travel club teaches girls to cooperate, while the purpose of the club is to inform them about the customs of other countries, to establish a friendly interest in foreign affairs, and to realize the possibilities and value of world peace. LE CERCLE FRANCAIS

LE CERCLE FRANCAIS was founded in February, 1923, by a group of students who were interested in the furthering of the study of the French language and literature at Central High. Madame Barbara Chatelain and Miss Bess Bozell, instructors in French, were chosen as sponsors. The club's aims are to promote interest in French, in the culture of France, and to create a feeling of friendliness between the young people of America and the young people of France. The last purpose is accomplished by obtaining for each member a French correspondent of the same age. Letters and photographs are exchanged, and, in some cases, a life friendship is formed. The requirements for membership are a year's study of French, or its equivalent, and the approval of the members of the club. The officers for the year 1935-1936 were Jean Patrick, president; Frances Heagey, vice-president; Jackie Fuller, treasurer; Dorothy Basar, secretary; and Mary Louise Cornick, chairman of the program committee.

This year, Le Cercle Francais, in cooperation with the Gentlemen's French club, sponsored a dance in the school gymnasium, to which the entire school was invited. Each Christmas the club cares for a poor family, supplying them with food, toys, and clothing. At meetings, some phase of French culture is studied, either with a speech in French by some noted linguist, by the singing of French songs, or by a talk about life in France.

The newest project launched by the joint action of the French clubs is to establish a junior division of the Alliance Francais in the high schools of the city. To date, this has not been accomplished, but these students have gained for themselves the privileges of attending the movies in French sponsored by the Alliance. One of those presented this year was the famous "Maternelle," which is the story of life in a nursery school in the very poorest section of Paris. The film, "Louis Pasteur," was shown in which Sacha Guitry, the French actor who has long been famous in both France and America, stars.

Correspondence is carried on with students in France. The programs include French in the form of plays or dialogues, or guest speakers, who speak on some subject related to French. Dr. Felix Despecher, president of the Alliance Francais, spoke and showed slides of Brittany, where he was born. Philip Horan told of his experiences while studying in France, immediately after his return. Dr. A. D. Cloyd, Sr., related stories in French and advised the boys to study French well in school and make it a hobby after graduation from school.

The club is associated with the Alliance Francais both in funds and work of the organization. A donation is given to the Community Chest each year. Previous to this year, the annual project of the French clubs has been a play, but this year a dance was given. The dance, the first one to be sponsored by a school club and held at night, was given March 6 in the school gym, with music by Bill Braden's orchestra.

Although the members of the club feel that the year's work has been very successful and that a great deal has been done to fulfill the purposes of the organization, they also feel that the French phrase, "Ce n'est que le commencement," is a very appropriate one with which to end the season's work.



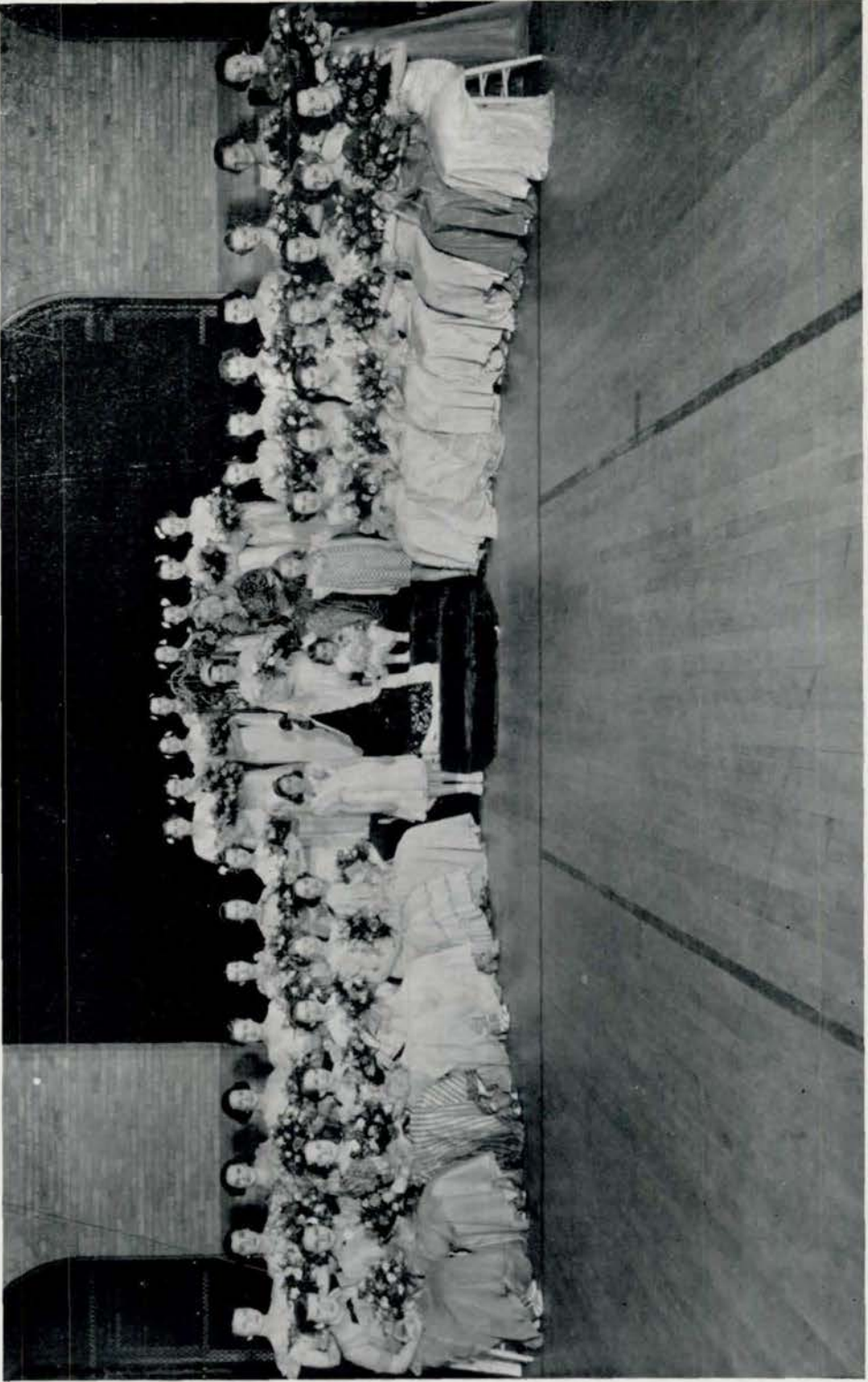

STUDENT CONTROL

STUDENT CONTROL, a form of student government, is the largest organization at Central High school. Application for membership must be indorsed by two teachers, and those who belong to the body are selected according to their character and executive ability.

The first Student Control was of comparatively short duration. Organized in 1911, the group continued till 1919, at which time it dropped out of existence. Under the direction of Louis N. Bexten, the club was reorganized three years later. During this period only seniors and juniors were admitted.

Mrs. Irene Jensen, who became sponsor in 1929, is largely responsible for the rapid growth of the present Student Control. Her untiring persistence has built the organization into a most efficient and effective group. The entire body is divided into five distinct parts. Nurses take charge of the nurse's office throughout the day. Students who assist the librarians check books, typewrite slips, carry duns, and watch doors. Another group patrols the halls and maintains silence during lunch periods. Those who work in the lunchroom keep the lines in order and watch the tables. Tutors help backward pupils in their work, and secretaries assist teachers.

President of Student Control this year is Don Arthur. Other officers are Rosemary Larsen, vice-president, and Betty Jane Hughes, Bill Fry, Jeanne Newell, and Eleanor Berner, secretaries.
