The walkout was held on Friday, March 31st to protest bills being debated in the Nebraskan Legislature. It was a day to show the senators voting to pass the bills the amount of children who don't want the bills to be passed and who want gender affirming care to remain legal for those under the age of 19 in Nebraska. Hundreds of Central students showed up to protest as well as news stations coming to report on it. The walkout was organized by Charlie Yale and Noa Gilbert. "Charlie and I began organizing the walkout after LB574, the ban on gender-affirming care for trans youth, passed the first round of debate. We had one week to organize, so we created a shared Google Doc with everything we needed to do, like emailing the press, getting approval from administration, and coordinating speakers," Gilbert said. Both Gilbert and Yale were incredibly proud of what they had accomplished with the protest and the large amount of turnout they had for it. However, even after the amount of protests that were organized all over Nebraska regarding the LB547, the legislature decided to pass the bill onto the next round. "I was saddened and scared by the bill's advancement," Gilbert said. However, they have faith in our community to be able to convince the senators to change their minds of making the bill law.
