DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Dear Central High School Supporter,

On behalf of the Central High School Foundation Board of Directors, the Foundation staff, and myself, I hope this Annual Report finds you and your loved ones well!

This annual report provides an overview of this year's wins, laying out all the opportunities made possible by your support. After all, this year's success is entirely attributable to you and your support.

As Mike Lebens said in his letter, this past year the Central High School Foundation has been utilizing precise measures to support Central High School teachers and students where they need it most. The tradition of excellence built into the culture of our community combined with your assistance have proven to be the exact tool needed to secure our students' success. From the bottom of our hearts, thank you.

This year the Central High School Foundation was able to provide a record number of academic scholarships to graduating seniors. In May, we awarded 85 scholarships, ranging from \$1,000 to full tuition, to Eagles who will attend colleges all across the country. Compared to the eleven scholarships we were able to provide at our organization's inception in 1996, this is a powerful demonstration of how robust our organization has become. Our ability to support Eagles as they fly beyond the nest is an unprecedented example of our commitment to supporting the present and *future* success of Central High School students.

Also, this year, the Central High School Foundation made a significant impact on our current Eagles. Through classroom and teacher grants, we were able to fund a number of supplemental curricular projects, trips, leadership programs, and much more. For example, our support allowed current students enrolled in performing arts classes to attend a showing of *The Lion King* at the Orpheum Theatre to support their learning about stage management, performance, and production. Speaking of theater, the Foundation also provided key financial support for the annual musical, *Mamma Mial*, which gave more than 150 students a hands-on opportunity to fully execute a full-scale mainstage musical production.

Support from the Central High School Foundation allowed our football team to attend Battle 7v7 in Las Vegas and Houston. This elite sports camp, hosted by Battle Sports, helps players develop their skills as they compete against top teams from across the country and exposes them to top college recruiters. Opportunities such as this help to retain and recruit student athletes who are vital to our tradition of athletic excellence. Additionally, funds from the Central High School Foundation helped to cover the registration fees for the OnToCollege test preparation course for students in an effort to help students raise their ACT scores, which impacts college admission options and scholarship opportunities.

There was one significant grant the Central High School Foundation was able to provide this year, in partnership with the Edward and Sally Malashock Family Foundation, which allowed our English Language Learner students to travel to Washington D.C. to make connections between what they've learned in U.S. History class and the places where these events happened. This powerful and significant learning experience helped students who are new to this country become grounded in what it means to be an American citizen and the rights that all Americans have and for which they can advocate. The

opportunity enabled students to visit these historical landmarks for themselves and empowered them to use their voice and bring diversity to the forefront. Support for this learning opportunity demonstrates that the Central High School Foundation stands on the shared values of Central High School to eliminate the gaps of opportunity for all students.

As we continue our work with precision and passion, we remain dedicated to creating the opportunities which allow our Eagles to learn, grow, and succeed. Every win this year was achieved on the wings of Eagle Nation; your support was essential to our success. We genuinely thank you for your support of the Central High School Foundation. Together we can ensure that Central does not forget its past, continues to live successfully in its present, and plans for its future.



Your Impact





Scholarship Endowment

The Senior Recognition Ceremony for the Class of 2024 was held in May. This annual event is presented by Central High School, the Central High School Foundation, and the Central High P.E.P. to honor graduating seniors. Graduating seniors from the Class of 2024 earned a total of \$23.1 million in scholarships to further their education. **Charlie Yale** and **Amy Fischer** were awarded the DeEmmett Bradshaw Zerbe ('43) and Mason Speltz Zerbe ('48) Central High School Student of the Year Scholarships. Government and social studies teacher **Jordan Boyer** was named the Teacher of the Year.

The Scholarship Endowment Fund began in 1980 when a 1932 alum donated \$2,000. Then-principal Doc Moller immediately began to solicit money from various sources in order to guarantee the perpetual growth of the fund.

Today, the Central High School Foundation Scholarship Endowment has grown to nearly \$2 Million! Scholarship recipients are chosen by the Central High School Scholarship Committee on the basis of application, scholarship, citizenship, and need. Congratulations to all scholarship recipients!

Matthew Aden

Class of 1974

The longtime successful businessman has been a strong, passionate, and transformative leader for the CHS Foundation. Aden's 40-year career in sales saw him rise to senior leadership positions with General Instrument, Motorola, Casa Systems, Harmonic, Concurrent and the Society of Cable Telecommunications Engineers. He has also been a cable television business consultant and was honored in 1984 with a Cable TV Pioneers Award for his industry leadership. Aden served as president of the CHSF Board from 2012 to 2019, a noteworthy tenure that saw the school reshaped by two major fund drives. Aden and wife Sheri chaired the \$1 million campaign to update technology infrastructure. Then he served on the committee that spearheaded the \$19.5 million Arts and Library Addition. Opened in 2019, it will benefit Eagles for years to come and stands as a legacy of Aden's impact at Central.

Robert X. Fogarty

Class of 2001

The entrepreneur has lifted his adopted home of New Orleans through the founding of organizations aimed at protecting vulnerable citizens in disasters as well as promoting artistic expression and love for the city. He was working in the corporate world in 2007 when he felt a calling to join Americorps. He worked as a volunteer coordinator for the mayor as New Orleans activated an evacuation plan with the approach of Hurricane Gustav. Afterwards, Fogarty founded evacuteer.org, a non-profit that recruits and trains evacuation volunteers to assist vulnerable citizens in an emergency. In 2010, he founded Dear New Orleans, an arts organization encouraging people to take photos with messages written on their bodies expressing love for the city. It exploded into Dear World, with countless people globally expressing themselves and spreading hope through the interactive storytelling method.

Kristie Hayes, M.D.

Class of 1973

Dr. Hayes is an Associate Professor Emeritus in Dermatology and a leader in inclusion and diversity work at the University of Nebraska Medical Center. She earned her medical degree in 1989 at UNMC and completed post-graduate training at both UNMC and at the University of Illinois-Chicago to become certified in dermatology and pediatric dermatology. Her UNMC appointments have included Distinguished Chair of Dermatology and Assistant Dean for Students and Multicultural Affairs in the College of Medicine. Dr. Hayes has been recognized numerous times as a top teacher in UNMC's Department of Internal Medicine. In 2023, she received the Distinguished Service to Medicine Award from the Nebraska Medical Association, the Women's Dermatologic Society Volunteer of the Year Award, and the UNMC Unsung Hero Award. She continues to give back to Central as a member of the CHS Foundation Board.

Keith Kretschmer

Last Attended 1951

Kretschmer's varied career has taken him from Korea's DMZ to the White House to Wall Street. After graduating from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and Wentworth Military Academy, Keith served as an Army ranger in Korea from 1956-58. For six years beginning in 1970, he served on the White House advance staff under Presidents Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford. He went on to have a 30-year international career in financial services. He was a General Partner of Bear, Stearns & Co, in Los Angeles and a Senior Managing Director with the firm in Boston. In 1994, he joined Oppenheimer & Co. in New York, where he was responsible for starting the firm's Australian business. Prior to his investment career, he was CEO of a computer company and helped start a life insurance company. He also authored the 1978 book Your Option, a guide to understanding and utilizing stock options.

Col David A. Napoliello

Class of 1964

Napoliello distinguished himself in a 28-year Army career, serving around the globe and retiring as a colonel. After commissioning, he served in Vietnam as a field artilleryman, participating in over a dozen operations and flying 152 combat missions. His career took him to 35 assignments in the U.S., Germany, Syria, Israel, Lebanon, Jordan, and Egypt. As a United Nations observer in Sinai and the Golan Heights, he shared in the 1988 Nobel Peace Prize awarded to UN Peace-Keeping Forces. Besides command and staff assignments, he was program manager for the \$12 billion Advanced Field Artillery System, with responsibilities in both research and development. He received over 30 decorations and awards, including the Army's highest honor, the Distinguished Service Medal. In retirement, he worked in the defense industry, served with the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund, and was active in Native American veterans affairs.

Jed Ortmeyer

Class of 1997

Jed became the first Omaha native and Central graduate to play in the National Hockey League. Jed first led the Omaha Lancers in scoring and won a league championship with his brother, Jake. He earned a scholarship to Michigan, where he served as team captain for two years and helped the Wolverines to three straight Frozen Fours. The defensive-minded forward made his NHL debut in 2003 with the New York Rangers. In 2004 and 2007, he earned the Rangers' Steven McDonald Extra Effort Award after returning to the ice from a serious health condition that nearly ended his career. He played eleven years professionally, including 362 NHL games with New York, Nashville, San Jose, and Minnesota, recording 23 goals and 32 assists, and lining up for 384 games in the American Hockey League, recording 68 goals and 107 assists. He was inducted into the Omaha Hockey Hall of Fame in 2015.

Harold Pharoah

Class of 1966

Pharoah has been a stalwart member of the Central High School Alumni Association, particularly providing leadership on matters related to the school's veterans. Since joining the association's board more than a decade ago, the Navy veteran has been active on the History, Alumni Engagement, and Hall of Fame Committees and co-founded the Veterans Committee. Pharoah took the lead to restore the school's 30-year-old Vietnam memorial, which had suffered weather damage. Pharoah, a prostate cancer survivor in 2011, started the Cruisin' for a Cure Car Show, to provide free prostate cancer screenings to men over 40 years of age. In 2018, he started the Nebraska Prostate Cancer Alliance, a 501c3 organization raising awareness of prostate cancer in the Omaha metro area. In 2019, he led the push for the creation of a Nebraska prostate cancer license plate.

Richard Steele

Class of 1961

Steele built a company specialized in maintaining locomotive engines, instilling it with a unique cooperative culture. After graduating from Iowa State University in 1971, Steele with two friends founded Peaker Services, a firm that maintains the engines of the backup generators electrical utilities used to meet peak demand. Starting with three trucks and working out of a two-car garage, Steele helped grow Peaker Services into a \$35 million company servicing large engines for a range of industrial customers, among them utilities, railroads, and the maritime industry. As the CEO, he adopted the industrial model of post-war Japan and established a company culture built around extreme cooperation over internal competition, continual learning and a shared vision of quality, creating an environment where workers experienced a greater sense of purpose and fulfillment. He remains chairman of the now employee-owned company.

Judy Storm

Distinguished Educator

Judy taught for 27 years at Central, serving as chair of the Special Education Department, where she was active in the lives of students and was a mentor to fellow faculty. After graduating with an education degree from UNO in 1980, Judy launched her 32-year OPS teaching career, joining the Central staff in 1985. In addition to teaching, she served as sponsor for the Student Council and helped coordinate the spring prom for 20 years. She received the National Association of Student Councils Award for Leadership of Youth in 2005 and the Alice Buffett Outstanding Teacher Award in 2008. In retirement, Judy continues to substitute teach at Central and is a regular at Eagle activities. Her children, Central graduates Jennifer and Matt, followed her into education in OPS, Matt now a physical education teacher and wrestling coach at Central, and Jennifer a counselor at Dundee Elementary. This is her second OPS Hall of Fame induction, as she was inducted into South High's Hall of Fame in 2012.

Patrick Venditte

Class of 2004

Pat made Major League Baseball history as the first ambidextrous pitcher in the modern era. His unique skill led to a change in baseball's rules unofficially dubbed "The Venditte Rule" which requires the pitcher to declare his pitching hand before facing each batter. Pat was second-team All-State at Central and an All-American pitcher for Creighton before being drafted by The New York Yankees in 2008. In June 2015, he became just the second Central grad to play in the big leagues. Pat pitched in five major league seasons with Oakland, Toronto, LA Dodgers, Seattle, San Francisco and Miami, striking out 58 batters in 72 innings and compiling a 4.73 ERA. He also twice pitched for Italy in the World Baseball Classic and numerous international competitions. He was named to Creighton's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2021.



In the 68 years since he first became an Eagle, Roger Sayers, CHS 1960, has seldom been anything but busy. A notable, multi-talented athlete during his career at Omaha Central High School, Sayers was a record-setting track star and won the Nebraska Boys State 100 and 220 yard dash gold medals in 1958. While leading the track team to two state championships in 1958 and 1959, Sayers was also named All City and All State in football.

Roger then launched into his collegiate athletic career at Omaha University, where he received scholarships to participate in football and track. After winning 28 consecutive races during his freshman year, Roger then enjoyed the best two-year period of any Omaha University athlete ever in 1962 and 1963. During this period, Roger captured the NAIA championship in the 100 and 200 meter races, accomplished 100 meter titles at the Texas, Kansas, and Drake relays, defeated Olympic gold medalist Bob Hayes twice in 1962, and led Omaha University to a Central Intercollegiate Conference title and an All Sports Bowl championship. Roger set multiple records on the football field while helping to lead Omaha University to its second bowl appearance in 1962. Amidst his collegiate athletic success, Roger was also selected to be on the United States Track Team in 1962, defeating Poland and the Soviet Union in dual competition. For these achievements, Sayers was named the 1962 Nebraska State College Athlete of the Year.

Because of his success, Roger has been given a number of accolades celebrating his athletic career. Sayers has been inducted into three track and field halls of fame, the University of Nebraska Football Hall of Fame, five athletic halls of fame, and the Central High School Hall of Fame.

Since the end of his athletic career, Roger has continued to find success and fulfillment in his personal and professional lives and in his community. After graduating from Omaha University with a degree in Business Administration, he went on to get his Master's in Business Administration from OU. He then spent 26 years working for Union Pacific and served the City of Omaha as its Director of Human Relations.

For the last 39 years, Roger has been married to his wife, Annette, whom he says is his very best friend. "As I have repeatedly said on many occasions, we are compatible on so many levels." Together they love to travel and visit their large family. They have five children, twelve grandchildren, and twelve great-grandchildren. They have also taken 40 cruises together, enjoy taking long walks, and share an appreciation for theatre arts. For over 40 years, the couple have also been members of Salem Baptist Church, of which Roger currently serves as a trustee.

Along with service at his church, Roger has served his community in numerous ways. He has been president of both the La Fern Williams Stage Theatre and the Urban League of Nebraska, served as the Nebraska coordinator of the United Negro College Fund, and spent time on the Board of Directors of Make-A-Wish Nebraska and the Central High School Foundation. "Volunteer work has always been an integral part of my life. I

have always felt that anyone who has the time should consider volunteering with the many organizations throughout the city that could benefit from their skills and talents."

Being the community-minded man that Roger is, he has never forgotten where it all started for him - in the hallowed halls of Central High School. "I've always been in love with Central," says Roger, with a glimmer in his eye. "Central has always been a foundation for everything I've done." Roger looks back at his time at Central with a fondness that shines through his every word. "Because of the academic background I received at Central, my first year at Omaha University, although challenging, was not overwhelming. I found myself well suited for the academic experience at Omaha University. I quickly learned that with my reading, writing, and academic skills developed at Central, I could compete at the university at both the undergraduate and master's level." His enthusiasm and appreciation for Central is what inspired him to create the Roger Sayers, CHS 1960, Endowed Scholarship, which will award two \$5,000 scholarships to qualifying students every year.

Although it has been many years since Roger graduated, he says that he thinks about Central on a daily basis. "Central was all inclusive for me," he says, "I enjoyed my fellow students, I loved my friends, and I enjoyed the athletic and academic aspects," which are what he says made Central magnetic for him. Roger has a magnetism about him, too. There is a reason why he has so often been a leader in his communities, and it is the warmth and compassion he shows to those around him. Roger has an immense love and trust for Central, and says, "Central is always a part of me." This is why he has maintained a close relationship with the Foundation and why he feels it is important to give back. This scholarship is incredibly meaningful to Roger, and he says, "I do want to emphasize that my gift to Central High School is a

direct reflection of God's purpose and direction for my

Roger's decision to make this donation, though he thought carefully about it, was ultimately not a difficult one. He says, "When you make a decision like this, there are various factors involved. When they add up, the pluses outweigh the minuses, and in this case, there weren't many minuses." He feels inspired by teachers and staff at Central, principal Dionne Kirksey in particular, and by the efforts of the Foundation. He says Ms. Kirksey has a difficult job and she goes "unappreciated, like most principals and teachers around this country, but there is a support system

there through the Foundation that is really significant and encouraging to me."

Roger has many hopes for what will come of his donation. He says, "I hope it will benefit as many students as possible going forward, and I hope it will give them a jump-start to their college career." He says that he also hopes that his donation encourages other people who have the ability to do the same. "Central, like any other inner-city school, needs the support of the alumni, so this is my opportunity to do that." His pride in Central is palpable; "Central has been a vital part of producing leadership in the Omaha area, and that shouldn't go unnoticed."


