

Alumni Spotlight: Vincent 'VJ' Orduna, CHS 1987



Via the Omaha Playhouse:

Vincent Orduna, CHS 1987, will be joining the Omaha Playhouse as its creative director. A graduate of Omaha's Central High School, VJ earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Midland Lutheran College. During that time, he made his OCP debut as the Scarecrow in the production of The Wiz. VJ went on to complete post-graduate work at the National Shakespeare Conservatory in New York City.

VJ's career has taken him across the country, including directing for the New York Board of Education's SPARK program, which serves high school students; serving as Cultural Arts Coordinator, Acting Instructor, Director, and Summer Teen Musical Director at Carco Theatre in Renton, Washington; and working as Theatre Manager and Technical Director at the Mountlake Terrace Performing Arts Center in Lynnwood, Washington.

For the past three summers, VJ has directed productions at the UNO Summer Musical Theater Academy, including Fame, Footloose, and Legally Blonde. His additional directing credits span a variety of iconic shows, including Rent, Pippin, The Drowsy Chaperone, Next to Normal, Steel Magnolias, A Christmas Carol, Little Shop of Horrors, and Sweeney Todd.

As Artistic Director, VJ will be responsible for programming and season planning; cultivating and maintaining relationships with artists; oversight of all artistic staff; and contributing to the long-range vision of OCP.

His expertise in stage direction, program leadership, educational initiatives, community engagement, and administrative oversight will be instrumental as the Omaha Community Playhouse enters its second century of service to the Omaha community.

Evelyn "Eve" Mayberger (CHS 2005) has long been a fierce supporter of Central High School. Since graduating, she has watched her younger brothers and cousins pass through the esteemed classrooms of Central. While a student at Central, Eve was involved in music (concert band and orchestra), athletics

(cross-country, swimming, and track), and Academic Decathlon. Eve took full advantage of the honors and AP courses offered and particularly loved history, math, and English classes. Eve credits her dedicated Central teachers for her interest and passion in these subjects.

Using what she had learned at Central, Eve earned a scholarship to Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. Eve fell in love with the interdisciplinary field of art conservation; a profession that combines art history/archaeology, chemistry/material science, and studio art/craft skills. After finishing her undergraduate degree, Eve interned for two years at different East coast museums to gain more practical art conservation experience.

Eve was then admitted into the art conservation graduate school program at New York University. In 2016 she accepted a post-graduate fellowship at the Museum of Fine Arts Boston (MFA). Upon completing her fellowship, Eve was promoted to Assistant Conservator at the MFA. During her career, Eve has participated in multiple excavations as an archaeological conservator in Turkey, Sicily, Egypt, and Sudan.

Her time at Central laid the foundation for her professional trajectory; Eve feels it is important to give back so others can follow their dreams and aspirations. She believes it is our duty to invest in our communities and to contribute what we can for the betterment of society for current and future generations. A tangible way to do this is to keep our public educational institutions, such as Central High School, strong and well resourced.


