Commitment to Closing the Opportunity Gap

In today's high schools, some students may find it difficult to adapt to traditional educational settings. Some students' top priority is earning a paycheck to help support their families. As CHS Counselor, Mr. Todd Hunter explains, "These students are more interested in non-traditional classroom methods of learning and their personal style of learning. Not every student goes to college, but every young person deserves the chance to pursue their dreams. Job Corps provides these students with that opportunity."

Pathways to College and Career Readiness

The visit to the Job Corps campus exposed students to an opportunity they may not have had without the help of the CHS Foundation. They learned about the various career training programs such as carpentry, bricklaying, CNA certification, pharmacy technician certification, and more. They learned that students who attend Job Corps are trained and prepared for an apprenticeship program while also being provided with housing and meals at no cost to them. Currently, Central has nine students who are signed up to apply for a spot in the Job Corps. The program offers these students the opportunity to transfer from Central to the Job Corps campus where they can train for a career that they are passionate about and earn their high school diploma simultaneously.

Alumni Spotlight: Hannah Harlow, CHS 2011



CHS 2011 alumna Hannah Harlow marked her seventh year working at Chicago's WGN-TV with some big milestones! She earned her first Chicago/Midwest Emmy nomination producing on WGN's history show *Backstory with Larry Potash* and became a member of the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences.



The nominated piece, *Achieving the Impossible Journey*, honored open-water long-distance swimmer Ted Erikson, who was the first person to swim across Lake Michigan in 1961. Hannah attended his memorial at Chicago's Promontory Point and interviewed his first wife and other loved ones, to capture firsthand accounts of his boundless spirit. Hannah found archival footage from throughout Erikson's career, highlighting

his record-breaking swims in the English Channel and the shark-infested waters of the Gulf of Farallones.

While her story didn't win, she is honored to have the opportunity to tell the story of a true trailblazer. And at the awards, she was able to accept an Emmy on behalf of the *Backstory* team for Outstanding Achievement for Magazine Program – Short Form Content.



Additionally, this month Hannah will launch a new original show, *What a Day!*, on the WGNTV+ streaming app and will serve as the supervising producer. On the show, Hannah will join anchors Brhett Vickery and Marcus Leshock for a deep dive into the day's big topics, as well as offer

behind the scenes content and interviews with the WGN Morning News team. Check out the show everyday at 2pm CST on the free streaming app WGNTV+!

Evelyn "Eve" Mayberger (CHS 2005) has long been a fierce supporter of Central High School. Since graduating, she has watched her younger brothers and cousins pass through the esteemed classrooms of Central. While a student at Central, Eve was involved in music (concert band and orchestra), athletics

(cross-country, swimming, and track), and Academic Decathlon. Eve took full advantage of the honors and AP courses offered and particularly loved history, math, and English classes. Eve credits her dedicated Central teachers for her interest and passion in these subjects.

Using what she had learned at Central, Eve earned a scholarship to Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. Eve fell in love with the interdisciplinary field of art conservation; a profession that combines art history/archaeology, chemistry/material science, and studio art/craft skills. After finishing her undergraduate degree, Eve interned for two years at different East coast museums to gain more practical art conservation experience.

Eve was then admitted into the art conservation graduate school program at New York University. In 2016 she accepted a post-graduate fellowship at the Museum of Fine Arts Boston (MFA). Upon completing her fellowship, Eve was promoted to Assistant Conservator at the MFA. During her career, Eve has participated in multiple excavations as an archaeological conservator in Turkey, Sicily, Egypt, and Sudan.

Her time at Central laid the foundation for her professional trajectory; Eve feels it is important to give back so others can follow their dreams and aspirations. She believes it is our duty to invest in our communities and to contribute what we can for the betterment of society for current and future generations. A tangible way to do this is to keep our public educational institutions, such as Central High School, strong and well resourced.


