Message from the President

As I complete my second year as the President of the Central High School Foundation's Board of Directors, I am often asked the following questions: "How does Central stay Central? Why has Central not gone the direction of other major city downtown high schools? Why does Central continue to be a beacon for public education across the country?" My answer has always stayed the same: "Our high school has never forgotten its past, it continues to live successfully in its present, yet it is always planning for its future." In short, our school is Central because of individuals like you who love and cherish this institution for the educational foundation they were given and have a desire to make sure that same foundation is there for present and future Eagles.

There is also another reason that our school has been able to stay Central, and that reason is the Central High School Foundation. In my tenure as President, I have gained a greater appreciation for what it takes to keep our school, Central High School, one of public education's great legacy high schools relevant in the 21st century. The challenges facing our high school include school finance, facility maintenance, academic excellence, student equity, public relations, student recruitment, and a host of other considerations that makes "keeping our school—Central" a daily challenge. The Central High School Foundation works as a conduit and support system to help the school, alumni, students, and parents navigate and focus on meeting the many internal and external issues that face the past, present, and future of OUR downtown high school.

On behalf of the Central High School Foundation Board, I have had the opportunity to be a part of a number of Foundation sponsored activities that allows our school to remember and respect its past students and their accomplishments. Class reunions, Hall of Fame ceremonies, dedications and historic celebrations, Alumni tailgates, and Scholarship endowments all continue to reinforce the school's credo of "A Tradition of Excellence." All these events, hosted by the Foundation, provide past, present, and future Central students the opportunity to share and learn about our institution's unique and storied past.

The Central High School Foundation has also worked to ensure that the educational opportunities and experiences afforded to today's Central students are second to none. These projects include the development, funding and installation of a complete campus-wide wireless infrastructure (the only one in the Omaha Public Schools), Senior Recognition, Purple Feather, Road Show, the implementation of the International Baccalaureate program, and support for student field trips to the holocaust museum in Chicago and the World War I Museum in Kansas City to supplement classroom instruction. These activities are just a small sample of what the Central High School Foundation does every day to insure that all Central students continue to have a four-year academic experience grounded in a traditional college preparatory curriculum and supplemented with a broad base of experiential learning. These activities don't happen at our high school without the Central High School Foundation.

The Central High School Foundation's role in preparing for our school's future takes many avenues, but its main objective for the near future is the establishment of the Central High Legacy Walkway and Plaza. This outdoor project, designed by two Central graduates, Adrian Ferguson, CHS 1989, and James Dahlin, CHS 1984, will not only add to the overall student, staff, alumni, and community use of and beauty of the Central High campus, but will also work to continue the focus on ensuring that our high school continues to be a lighthouse for public education throughout the country. I encourage you to take the time to read Central High alumni Clark Lauritzen's, CHS 1995, letter in this report. The letter overviews the project and establishes how you can be involved in helping our school, Omaha's original high school, prepare for its future. Clark's letter can be found on page 8.

In closing, it is my sincerest hope that you will support the Central High School Foundation and the unique role it plays to ensure our high school's past, present, and future will continue to shine brightly!

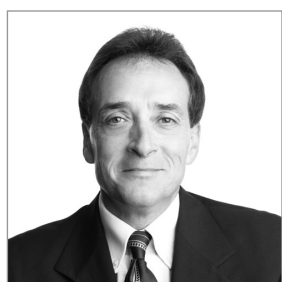

The 100th Annual Road Show featured an exclusive alumni performance, honoring the history of the Road Show by bringing back alumni from all over the country, spanning many decades. Sara Cowan, a 2004 graduate and current Vocal Music teacher at Central, was a part of the planning process for the alumni event. Once an open call for auditions was announced, she said the response was overwhelming. "I was very pleased with the auditions we got," she said. "There were a lot of people who responded right away, really positively."

The planners of the event managed to get a diverse group of alumni from each decade to perform a variety of acts including instrumental music, comedy, singing, and dancing. "The stage crew was phenomenal – just phenomenal!" said Pegi Georgeson, who has quite the resume of experience with Road Shows as both a CHS alumni and teacher in Central's theatre department from 1976 to 2001. "It was run so smoothly!"

The hard work and dedication for current CHS students was instrumental in the show's success. Both Pegi and Sara said they were proud to be a part of the event, both as former and current teachers and especially as graduates of Central. The show, which was open to the public, filled out Central's beloved auditorium to maximum capacity.

"There's no business like show business!" Pegi said proudly, "And Central's been in the business for 100 years."

The Central High School auditorium filled quickly with alumni, friends, and family of Central on Thursday, May 1, 2014 for a very special event: the 100th Annual Road Show Alumni Performance. The Road Show, Central's annual talent show, is a tradition all Eagles have had a hand in while they were attending high school. This year's special event took a team to construct, including the skill of the show's director Tom Bertino, CHS 1980, producer Dionne Kirksey, assistant producer Pegi Bryans Georgeson, CHS 1961, and many others.

The Central High School Road Show began as a traveling show sponsored by the Cadet Officer's Club in 1915. It has always featured the best performances in music, singing, dancing, and acting. Some of the entertainment industry's best names got their start in the Central High School Road Show, including Dorothy McGuire, CHS 1923, Henry Fonda, CHS 1923, Wynonie Harris, CHS 1931, Inga Swenson, CHS 1950, Frank Tirro, CHS 1953, and Henry Friedman, CHS 1964.

Alumni enjoyed catching up with old acquaintances over glasses of wine and hors d'oeuvres, and listened to opening remarks by Central's Principal, Dr. Ed Bennett, and OPS Superintendent Mark Evans before hopping a golf cart ride, provided by Central's Eagle Battalion, over to the school for the show.

"I would say it was a very successful event. The reception at the Joslyn was great," said Roger Robinson, CHS 1955, who traveled in from his home in Pennsylvania to attend the event. "It was just good to see the work of the Foundation and it was nice to see the new Superintendent of the school district."

The following day, alumni reconnected at the Durham Museum, where they were given a tour called "Stories of Omaha." To round off the weekend, the final event was held at the Field Club of Omaha. Classmates danced the night away to sounds of Gooch and his Las Vegas Big Band, assembled by Mike "Gooch" Gurciullo, CHS 1977. Classmates were able to catch up on years past as they ate dinner and Dr. Keith Bigsby, CHS Principal Emeritus, addressed the group.

"It was a fantastic event," said Dr. Bigsby. "It's very special when we can offer things, such as this reunion, to our fantastic alumni. It is because of our strong sense of community within the Eagle family, no matter how scattered it may be, that we are able to have successful events like this. And it wouldn't have been possible without the hard work and dedication from the Central High School Foundation."



What's Your Legacy?

Ann Kennedy Goldstein, CHS 1964



Don noted that in high school Ann was a good friend to so many. "All the friends she made at the grade school and high school level she kept throughout her life," he said. In fact, her close group of friends from elementary, middle, and high school still meet once a month for dinner.

Ann graduated from Central and continued on to the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, where she got her teaching certificate in 1968. She was a first grade teacher and worked for Omaha Public Schools for five years until the birth of her daughters, Rebecca and Deborah.

"My girls would say that she was very patient with everyone," said Don. He believed this was because of her work as a first grade teacher. "They would use Ann as a sounding board because she understood children and people so well."

In 1990, Ann went back to work for the Omaha Chamber of Commerce as a Manager in their Leadership Development Department. She ran Leadership Omaha, a program which brings young leaders into a concentrated program to learn more about the inner workings of the city. She became heavily involved in volunteerism. Her work spanned across a wide range of community initiatives including the Omaha Children's Museum, the Junior League, the Omaha Summer Arts Festival, the Jewish Federation of Omaha, Planned Parenthood, the Great Plains Girl Scout Council, the Anti-Defamation League, the Westside Schools Multicultural Task Force, and many others.

"She did what she felt strongly about," said Don. "She was really enthusiastic about everything she did. All the good stuff she did rubbed off on anyone she touched."

Throughout her life, Ann struggled with complications from Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). "One thing that people who don't know Ann should know was that she was very brave," said Don.

Ann left the Omaha Chamber of Commerce in 2009 due to declining health from PKD and underwent a kidney transplant, donated by her good friend and 1966 Central graduate, Cheryl Milder Cooper. Her time in the hospital at UNMC made her an advocate for organ donation and an informal spokesperson for the transplant center. When new patients had questions about the transplant process, the hospital encouraged them to contact Ann, who was always very uplifting.

"After the transplant, we had a nice, normal life," said Don. "All our grandkids were born between the times of the transplant and her death. The effects of the transplant allowed her to get to know all her grandchildren."

Ann passed away March 12, 2011 from an infection and difficulties from PKD. But her spirit continues to support the Omaha and Central communities in many ways.

Ann continues to exemplify the true spirit of an Eagle through her powerful personal legacy. Continuing to give back in the way she had always done, Ann's substantial gift to the CHS Legacy Fund continues to impact and secure the futures of the students of Central High School, an institution she cared very much about.

As a community advocate, Ann Kennedy Goldstein, a 1964 Central graduate, exemplified the leadership skills needed to advance many of the civic initiatives of the City of Omaha. Her resume of accomplishments is impressive: she was a powerful community activist against discrimination and directed leadership development initiatives, including Leadership Omaha, Youth Leadership Omaha, the Omaha Executive Institute, and Neighborhood Builders. She was one of the founders of the Omaha Children's Museum and was awarded the Omaha Children's Museum Founder's Award. She was also the recipient of the Jewish Federation's Justin Greenberg Young Leadership Award and the Omaha Education Association's Human Relations Award. In April 1997, Goldstein was honored by the YWCA for career achievement and the Greater Omaha Chamber of Commerce established the Ann Goldstein Outstanding Young Leader Award as a tribute to her.

Even after her untimely death in 2011, Ann continues her awe-inspiring support of the community through her legacy gift to Central High School. Every day, current students of Central are given opportunities because of her financial support. That continued support comes from Ann's deeply rooted love of Central.

"Ann was a good student," said Don Goldstein, Ann's husband and fellow 1964 alumni. "But she learned more at Central than just English, math, and science." Ann cultivated a foundation for her love of diversity, education, leadership, and volunteerism at Central, which led her to do great things for the community in her later years.

Don and Ann were in the same kindergarten and eighth grade classes at Dundee Elementary, but did not become close friends until they went to Central together. The two began dating in 1962, which was the start of a life-long relationship.

"She had a wonderful personality, very outgoing," he said. "And she always had an upbeat attitude." Ann was a cheerleader during her years at Central, and Don was a member of the swim team. "It was always a joke that she would come to the swim meets and cheer, then cheer at the basketball games later," he said. "Cheering twice in the same night would always wear her out!"

The Central High Legacy Fund

Established in 2011 with the inaugural contribution of Stanford Lipsey '45, the Legacy Fund allows a donor to provide a financial contribution to the areas of greatest need at Central High School. The funds are endowed to create a permanent source of support to ensure the Tradition of Excellence continues for future generations.

A "Legacy Walkway" will be erected on the west side of Central High School honoring Legacy Fund donors.

The Legacy Fund is managed by The Central High School Foundation to ensure that donors' charitable gifts will grow over time and be distributed to make the greatest impact.

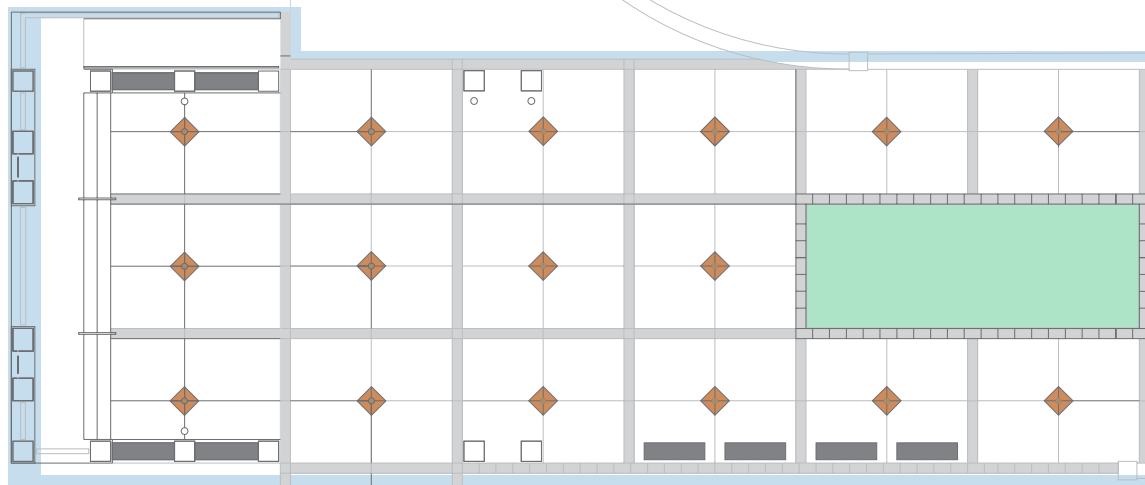

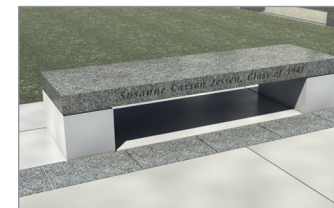

Ramona (Thompson) Bartee Class of 1963

Over her 30 year career as an educator, Ramona served the students, parents, teachers, and community associated with the Omaha Public Schools in an exemplary fashion. She served at several elementary schools, including as a teacher at Franklin and Martin Luther King, as an administrative intern at Irvington/Masters, and as principal at Highland, Laura Dodge, and Lothrop. Along the way she completed her B.S. and M.S. at UNO and her Ed.D. at UNL. In addition to her OPS career, Dr. Bartee also served Omaha's university community as an adjunct professor at UNO, the College of St. Mary, and Creighton University. In her work at Creighton, she also held the position of Director of Teacher Certification & Placement. Dr. Bartee has also served the community as a board member of Voices for Children, the College of St. Mary, and others. The lives and careers of both Dr. Ramona Bartee and her husband, Dr. Jerry Bartee, an OPS assistant superintendent, exemplify the meaning of the phrase, "providing dedicated service to the community."



Sam Beber Class of 1919

After his graduation from Central and then Creighton University Law School, Sam became a highly-successful attorney recognized for his integrity, wisdom, and legal counsel. In Omaha, in 1924, he created a program enabling Jewish young men, many of whom were immigrants, or their sons, to come together to socialize, to be of service to others, and to carry on Jewish traditions in the modern world. The program was named with the Hebrew letters, Aleph Zadik Aleph (AZA). Sam enlisted B'nai B'rith, an international Jewish service organization, to sponsor AZA which quickly became the largest Jewish youth organization in the world. Later, a similar organization for young Jewish women became, with AZA, the B'nai B'rith Youth Organization (BBYO), with chapters on every continent. Sam also was a founder of Omaha's Beth El Synagogue. He helped rescue Jews fleeing Nazi Europe and was involved in many charitable and civic causes. Sam became a developer, helping to develop Park Forest, Illinois, a planned community of over 22,000, initially built to meet the housing needs of returning war veterans and the Port of Ashdod, in Israel.



Peter Buffett Class of 1976

Central High School played a significant role in shaping Peter's future. From being a photographer and editing the yearbook to performing in the *Road Show* with Lars Erickson, Peter gives credit to Central for helping him create a life of music, videography, and writing. Peter began his career as a composer in San Francisco - writing for commercials as well as releasing several albums. He also created the theatrical event *Spirit - The Seventh Fire*, presented on the National Mall in support of the opening of the National Museum of the American Indian. He is best known for composing the "Firedance" scene in *Dances With Wolves* and the score for *500 Nations*, an eight hour CBS documentary about the North American Indian Nations. Peter authored the best-seller, *Life Is What You Make It*. The book offers many reflections on the importance of his Omaha upbringing. Peter and his wife, Jennifer, co-chair the NoVo Foundation, an organization supporting girls and women throughout the world.



David Jacobson Class of 1966

David Jacobson has achieved remarkable success as a corporate, civic, and community leader. After his graduation from UNL Law School, David practiced as a Legal Aid attorney in Omaha and joined the Kutak Rock Law Firm in 1977. From 1996 to the present, he has been Chairman of Kutak Rock LLP, a nationally-known law firm of 485 attorneys with offices in 16 states. David's leadership has preserved and maintained the firm's culture that supports the importance of community involvement, treating people equally, and developing the potential of all persons. David and his wife, Nancy, have four children (three Central alums) Rachel, Sara, Ben and Justin. David's civic leadership is seen in his involvement in many pro-bono and charitable causes, including as a 20 year board member of Partnerships 4 Kids, Chairman of the Board of Film Streams, and a co-founder of the Omaha Black/Jewish Dialogue. David has also provided community leadership for CHS by helping to raise funds needed to improve facilities for CHS athletics and by helping to establish the Central High School Foundation.



Roy Katskee Class of 1960

At Northwest High School, Roy achieved the highest recognition for his outstanding coaching accomplishments in girls' and boys' gymnastics, boys' track, and softball. Roy's 301-78 gymnastics record includes 6 state championships, 8 Metro Conference championships, and 8 individual all-around state champions. His track teams produced 27 individual, Metro, and state champions, and his softball teams compiled a 79-31 winning record. He is one of the Omaha Public Schools' most successful coaches and, as a result, he has been inducted into several halls of fame, including the Northwest High School Hall of Fame, the Omaha Public Schools Athletic Hall of Fame, the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame, and the Jewish Community Center Hall of Fame. Roy has also been active in his community, including serving as a merit badge consultant-facilitator for the BSA and giving dedicated support to CHS by serving as a board member and President of the Alumni Association and as Hall of Fame Chairman.



Alan Marer Class of 1951

After graduating from Stanford University, Alan served in the U.S. Army and then received his LL.B. from Columbia University in 1961. Alan began his career as a lawyer in the Appeals and Research Section of the United States Justice Department Civil Rights Division where he developed a passion for civil rights issues. He, along with others, drafted the Public Accommodations Act, the Voting Rights Act, and the Housing Act, laws that would eventually lead to providing equal opportunity for all U.S. citizens. Alan left the Justice Department in 1977, was appointed General Counsel of the Office of Economic Opportunity (for the Western Region), briefly entered private practice, and then returned to Washington, D.C., to work as a supervising attorney on the impeachment of President Nixon. Alan completed his legal career by practicing appellate law in California with his brother, Gerald.



Cory L. Richards Class of 1966

After graduating from Yale and working on Capitol Hill where he became involved in public health issues, Cory joined the Guttmacher Institute as policy analyst focusing on issues related to sexual and reproductive health and rights. His critical, creative, and strategic thinking abilities, along with excellent communication skills, provided the basis for his becoming the spokesperson for Guttmacher's research, public education, policy analysis, and advocacy initiatives. His intellectual talents and his outgoing personality helped him advance in the organization to Executive Vice President. Based on his identifying severe gaps in insurance coverage for contraceptives, Cory was the architect of policy changes that benefitted millions of U.S. women and families, and he also founded the *Guttmacher Policy Review*, a journal that analyzes sexual and reproductive health and rights issues. Cory was an enthusiastic giver of his time and talents, and he has provided generous support to Central through the CHS Foundation.



Rita Ryan Distinguished Educator

"An exceptional teacher for an exceptional class." These words express the feelings of the thousands of students who experienced the joy of being in one of Rita Ryan's Latin classes over her 42-year career teaching Latin at CHS. Rita had the ability to impart to her students her enthusiasm and her love for both the Latin language and the classical culture associated with the language. Her students always performed very well when participating in certamens, student competitions which require an in-depth knowledge of Roman history and the Latin language. Rita also sponsored the Junior Classical League, attending eight National JCL Conventions with her students, and she organized 15 trips to Europe for students, parents, and friends. Because of her teaching excellence, Rita has been the recipient of several prestigious awards, including the Alice Buffett Outstanding Teacher Award, the Central Teacher of the Year, and the STAR Award, a state world language teacher award. "Te amamus, Miss Ryan," say all of her students.



Jerome Turner Class of 1953

A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Finance, Jerry Turner became an innovative leader in the athletic footwear industry. Jerry's unique athletic shoe design techniques included using ethyl vinyl acetate (EVA), shock absorbing midsoles, removable sock liners, Gore Tex, dual density EVA, and varus wedge -- all innovations that became industry standards. He and his wife combined their skills and marketing knowledge to become one of the first foreign-owned Chinese manufacturing companies to employ hundreds of workers in the U.S. and thousands in China, producing such brands as Avia, Turntec, Nevados, And1, and Ryka. He has been inducted into the National Sporting Goods Hall of Fame (along with Phil Knight) and the Fashion Footwear Hall of Fame. He has also continued to support CHS by endowing a generous scholarship to be awarded to a CHS graduate who will attend the University of Pennsylvania.
