Message from the Principal

In a conversation with my two Central High Alumni, Casey (2005) and Michaela (2012), I asked them, "What did you learn from your Omaha Central High School experience?" Their responses included the following: "I learned how to write"; "I was able to compete against some of the best students and athletes in the state"; "I gained the ability to fit in with any socio-economic, racial, language, and ability group"; "The Road Show, the athletics, and activities all prepared me for the next level of education."

With those answers in mind, the next question I asked was: "What monetary value would you put on your overall Central experience? Ten dollars? One hundred dollars? One thousand dollars? Or more?" Casey's answer was, "I don't know what you would pay for an experience that is so life-defining, but it would have to be a lot."

Why do individuals such as Casey and Michaela proclaim their love, their allegiance, and their success to this unique downtown public high school? Why, after 153 years, does Central High School continue to shine as a beacon for public education? It is because of YOU and the other 35,000 members of the EAGLE nation who love this institution and are thankful for the foundation of success it provided them.

While Central continues to serve as that foundation for many prosperous current and former students, the Central High School Foundation acts as the infrastructure of the entire institution - truly the rock upon which we all stand. They provided a substantial amount of support to the academics and extra-curricular activities of Central in 2013. This past year, the Foundation secured the funding for Holocaust literature English students to go on a field trip to visit the Holocaust Museum in Skokie, Illinois and the Holocaust Memorial in downtown Chicago. Similarly, they provided the means for the athletic department to take the boys basketball team to compete in the 2012 City of Palms Classic in Fort Meyers, Florida. Back home, the Foundation provided complete classroom sets of graphing and scientific calculators to the math department and funding for the performing arts department for the production of their 2013 spring play, *Kill Me, Deadly*.

Throughout the years, it has become increasingly clear that Eagles truly do lead by example. Just this past year, the CHS student body banded together to raise over \$2,700 for the Methodist Hospital Foundation, which will go toward the expansion of the Methodist Hospital surgery department. This spirit of giving and support is not something that magically happens within the archaic walls of Nebraska's oldest and largest high school; it is something that is shown through countless acts of generosity from our alumni, then translated into the conversations of the classrooms, then instilled into the fabric of the CHS community and cultivated through repetition—whether it is by an act as simple as lending a pencil to a fellow student or by joining forces to better our community.

This constant exchange of giving and receiving provides priceless education both within and beyond the classroom. That is what makes it so difficult to put a monetary number on the invaluable education reveived at Central High School. It is an uncontrollable benefit that students of CHS bloom in a community of diversity and respect, but it is the tireless effort of those driving forces, such as the work of the Central High School Foundation, that continue to provide the real-world opportunities that students seek out, eventually leading them into the halls of Omaha's downtown high school.

Back then, the Commodore 64 boasted a powerful 64 KB of RAM, impressive new graphics of its time, and a 5-1/4" floppy drive! The same year we received a TI-99.

How times change! Our business education department was chaired by a wonderful educator, Mrs. Wanda Utecht. She made sure all of our business students were well trained in typing on the Olivetti Praxis 40 typewriters and how to use a mimeograph machine. Miss Orr was also an excellent business education instructor, and many of my fellow 1983 graduates can still recite and write the "brief forms" she taught us in Short Hand class.

I have many fond memories of Central, especially of all of the wonderful teachers. I credit Central for providing me with the skills and education necessary that allowed me to succeed in college, obtain my engineering degree in 1987, and start my own business in 1989. As a third generation Central High School graduate, that is why I made a contribution to the Central High Legacy Endowment Fund.

I wish the Foundation the utmost success in continuing the tradition of excellence established at Central over 150 years ago.


2013 EVENTS

Annunciata Garrotto Class of 1924

After graduating from CHS and from Omaha University with high honors in her chosen fields of music and languages, Annunciata traveled to Milan where she studied voice, made her operatic debut, and began a distinguished career that led to her singing with the Royal House of Malta and then with the San Carlo Opera Company, singing in over 16 countries during the 1930's. During this period, she sang the role of Cio-cio-san in the opera, *Madama Butterfly*, a role which led to her being recognized as the greatest living interpreter of *Madama Butterfly*. It was also during this period that she sang significant roles in several other operas, including *La Boheme, Pagliaci, Manon, Carmen,* and *Faust,* completing more than 150 performances of these operas. At this point in her career, she returned to the United States where she was selected as the national soloist for NBC radio's coast-to-coast opera broadcasts. She then sang with the Chicago Opera Company and followed that experience by performing with the New York Hippodrome, completing more than 100 performances and receiving great critical acclaim. She also appeared as a soloist for the Radio City Music Hall, the New York Metropolitan Opera Association, the New York Mozart Club, and the New York City Club. She married world famous tenor, Lawrence Power, and together the couple performed around the world.



Pegi (Bryans) Georgeson Class of 1961

Pegi's enthusiasm for CHS and its traditions is unmatched. Not only is she a CHS graduate and former cheerleader, she was a CHS student teacher, the CHS drama teacher for 25 years, and a CHS substitute teacher. In addition, she is a member of a family of Eagle graduates, including her father, a sister, two brothers, and two daughters. In her role as CHS drama teacher, Pegi capably and enthusiastically directed school plays, musicals, and the *Road Show*. These productions were often recognized for their excellence, particularly for the professional level of performance by students and the accompanying excellence in staging as directed by Pegi. In addition to her work as a teacher, Pegi is an accomplished actress, and performed in many plays and musical theater productions in the area, including several productions at the Omaha Community Playhouse: *I Do, I Do*, (Fonda McGuire Award), *The Philadelphia Story, Fascinating Rhythms* (Cameo Awards for both), *George Washington Slept Here, The Unsinkable Molly Brown, Ballroom, Auntie Mame, Oh Coward, Cole*, and *The Man Upstairs*. As a result of her enthusiasm for her work and her ability to motivate students, several of her students have also achieved success in theater, in film, and in television.



Ann (Kennedy) Goldstein Class of 1964

Ann's understanding of the need for a strong, supportive Omaha community is clearly seen in the leadership that she provided in her work with the Omaha Chamber of Commerce and in the many community organizations which she supported and in which she participated. After a five year teaching career with OPS, Ann joined the Omaha Chamber of Commerce where she directed leadership development initiatives, including Leadership Omaha, Youth Leadership Omaha, the Omaha Executive Institute, and Neighborhood Builders. Because of her special work with those initiatives, the chamber established, in her honor, the Ann Goldstein Outstanding Young Leader Award. Ann's volunteer work also had a great impact on the greater Omaha community. She took a special interest in anti-discrimination issues and served as the President of the Midwest Region of the Ant-Defamation League. She also had a seat on the Omaha Jewish Federation's Community Relations Board. Les "Pee Wee" Harrison Class of 1982

Les has gone from being a standout junior college basketball player at lowa Western CC. and George Fox College to being a Harlem Globetrotter performer with Meadowlark Lemon's Harlem All Stars. He completed his B.S. in Business Economics and Masters of Business in Leadership. A national known motivational speaker and founder of several youth organizations such as Showtime Athletics, 3 Guys and a Ball, Elite Ballers, Les developed the Applause program with emphasis on anti bullying and developing a positive self image. Les is an accomplished business entrepreneur in the field of public relations, executive coaching, and media relations. With over 20 years of business experience in organization management, sales and public relations. Les "Pee Wee" Harrison has been a positive role model and has had a major impact on lives of students and business personnel across the country.



C. Lowell Harriss Class of 1930

Nationally and internationally recognized for both his teaching and research in the field of economics and having prepared himself for a career in economics with academic degrees from both Harvard (B.S.) and Columbia (Ph.D.), Dr. Harriss devoted his life to the study of economics and the impact of economic theory on related fields, including taxation, government fiscal policy, economic development, and public finance. In addition to lifelong teaching at Columbia, he was invited to teach at other prestigious universities including Stanford, Yale, Cal. Berkley,, Princeton, University of Pennsylvania as well as Cambridge. Dr. Harriss also received Fullbright professorships which took him to the Netherlands, England, and France. He has served as an expert witness, a conference presenter and lecturer, an economics consultant and advisor, and has been a member of many professional organizations. While teaching and consulting, Dr. Harriss also wrote several books and a myriad number of articles on various economics-related topics, including inflation, land management, tax policy, fiscal policy, budgeting, and economic development. For his lifetime of work, Dr. Harriss was awarded an honorary degree from Columbia a Phi Beta Kappa honorary selected and a Life Member of the International Institute of Public Finance.

Edward "Chip" Jepsen Class of 1961

Edward "Chip" Jepsen's outstanding business career covered several different business endeavors. After his CHS graduation, Chip attended Antioch College (receiving a B.A.) and then Harvard Business School (receiving an M.B.A). While serving in the U.S. Army Reserves, Chip began his business career with the prestigious accounting firm of Price Waterhouse, becoming the youngest partner in the history of that firm. With his leadership skills clearly evident, he joined the senior management team of Amphenol Corporation, an electronics component supplier, and, sales rose from \$450M to\$ 4B while employing 40,000 people. Chip currently owns controlling interest in Coburn Technologies, a leading producer of ophthalmic lens processing equipment, where he is the principal shareholder and CEO. Chip has served on the boards of three public NYSE companies: Amphenol, ITC Holdings Corporation, and Gerber Scientific, Inc. While achieving this outstanding business success, Chip has remained committed to CHS as demonstrated in his family's establishing the Paul Jepsen [Chip's father] Scholarship Foundation. Since 2002, this foundation has annually awarded two \$40,000 scholarships (\$10,000 a year for four years) to two deserving CHS seniors. Thus far, the family has contributed \$880,000 for these scholarships and is committed to their continuing support.



L. Zenaide Luhr Distinguished Educator

As a CHS art teacher and Art Department Head with a B.A. and an M.S. from Omaha University, Miss Luhr, as she was known, was extraordinary, enthusiastic, enigmatic, both excitable and exciting, and exacting. The many students who were fortunate to be in one of her classes knew of her high expectations for achievement, and they were also well aware of her passion for helping them to learn and for the personal interest she took in those students who had the desire, and gave the effort, to learn. Her classroom doors were always open for all periods of the day, and many students took advantage of her expertise to learn not only art techniques and skills but also what it means to be a friend and to accomplish goals. Zenaide demanded excellence, but she tempered those demands with understanding and careful instruction. In addition, she was an excellent artist and jewelry maker in her own right, and, to that end, she helped to establish the Artist Cooperative Gallery in Omaha's Old Market. To record all the praise given by both her colleagues and her students would be a daunting task, so the following comment from her principal will have to suffice: "She was strikingly independent, opinionated in a non-offensive way, and a marvelously positive influence on colleagues and students alike."



Louis J. Miloni Class of 1958

At CHS, Lou was an outstanding halfback on his senior-year football team that shared a state title with two other schools; however, his accomplishments as a CHS wrestler surpassed even his football accomplishments as he compiled a 75-4-1 record, winning two state titles, three All-Metro titles, and being chosen as the team's most outstanding wrestler. At Omaha University, Lou continued his remarkable success, three times earning All-Conference football honors, and as a senior, his team won the CIC Title and the All-Sports Bowl with Lou's being chosen co-captain. In wrestling, Lou compiled a 39-3 record, was selected as the university's Athlete of the Year in1962, and was inducted into both the university's Wresting Hall of Fame (1998) and its Athletic Hall of Fame (2002). At Westside High School, where Lou was its wrestling coach and teacher over a 36 year career, his wrestling teams won16 District Team Championships, 2 Class A State Championships, compiled an overall record of 244-88-7, and had 24 individual state champions. Because of the leadership which Lou provided for high school and youth wrestling, he was inducted into the Metro Coaches and Officials Wrestling Hall of Fame (1985), the Nebraska Scholastic Wrestling Coaches Association, and the Omaha Westside Alumni Association's Athletic Hall of Fame.



Henry Monsky Class of 1907

After his graduation from CHS, followed by his completion of a law degree from Creighton, Henry Monsky dedicated his work, and his life, to social justice issues on local, national, and international levels. At the local level, Henry established a lifelong relationship with Boys Town through his collaboration and friendship with Boys Town's founder, Fr. Edward Flanagan. From Boys Town's very beginning, Fr. Flanagan relied heavily on Henry's legal expertise and personal counsel, and Henry's support was unequivocal because Fr. Flanagan and he shared the same vision for youth, including a sincere interest in helping young people work through the challenges of the juvenile justice system. On the national level, Henry served on many boards and spoke to many groups, including interfaith groups, on issues of juvenile justice and as a child welfare advocate, established the AZA, the world's largest Jewish youth organization, and received appointments from Presidents Roosevelt and Truman. Henry also traveled internationally, focusing on Jewish causes in the world, including serving as International President of B'Nai B'rith, the world's largest Jewish service club, helping to form the National Jewish Conference, serving as editor of the *National Jewish Monthly,* and consulting with the U.S. delegation at the formation of the United Nations.



Allan Noddle Class of 1958

Allan Noddle's career in the food distribution industry saw him reach the industry's pinnacle. After his graduation from UNL followed by his military service as a First Lieutenant in the Army, Alan returned to Omaha, and joined Hinky Dinky Supermarkets where he became Executive Vice President and COO, then moving to Giant Foods in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, where he became President/CEO, followed by his selection by Royal Ahold, the world's most successful food provider located in the Netherlands, as President and CEO of its Support Division. Ahold selected him as the company's Executive Vice President and appointed him to the Executive Board, resulting in his becoming the first American to be selected for that board in Ahold's 114 year history. Allan moved to the Netherlands and traveled the world where he was responsible for the management of all of Ahold's Latin American and Asian companies. Allan has also served as a board member and President of Daymon Worldwide, a global, retail branding and sourcing company, and chairman of Topco the world's largest cooperative buying organization. He also has served on the Boards of Junior Achievement, the Better Business Bureau, and the Jewish Community Center. He has also been a guest speaker and teacher working with consumer products companies and universities.

Cory Richards Legacy

Cory L. Richards, a 1966 graduate of Central High School, made a significant impact in public health policy throughout his career. He built a powerful personal legacy, always pursuing his passion to propel the world into a better future, but never forgot his roots. Continuing to give back to the world as he had always done, Cory contributed a substantial gift to the CHSF Legacy Fund, forever impacting Central High School.

"Everyone loved Cory! He had a very distinct personality and was a widely popular character," said his close friend, Jane Schmidt Browning (CHS 1966). During his time at Central, she said, Cory passionately participated in the Theatre Department, even playing the lead role of Professor Henry Higgins in the production of *My Fair Lady* during his senior year. She said, in addition to being active in drama, he also played violin for the orchestra. "He wasn't able to go out on dates until he practiced his violin," she laughed.

As high school neared a close, after many semesters of competing with her for who performed better on the honor roll, Jane recalled that Cory had a very impressive resume which earned him a full ride to Yale University.



"As a young freshman at Yale, he was surrounded by students from the finest private schools of the east coast," said Cory's brother, Scott Richards. "But he was very proud of his roots in Omaha. And even more, he was proud of the truly fine education he received at Central."

After his graduation from Yale in 1970, Cory went to Capitol Hill. Following a position with Rep. Peter N. Kyros (D-ME), Cory found himself passionately thrown headfirst into public health issues. In 1975 he became a policy analyst at the Guttmacher Institute, an organization to advance sexual and reproductive health and rights through an interrelated program of research, policy analysis, and public education. He was appointed vice president for public policy in 1988, became senior vice president in 2000, and finally executive vice president in 2008.

As executive vice president, Cory inspired and nurtured the Institute's evolution into a leading think tank on issues related to sexual and reproductive health and rights both in the United States and globally. A brilliant thinker and gifted communicator, he was a driving force behind the translation of Guttmacher's research, public education, policy analysis, and advocacy expertise into an influential and widely respected public voice that has shaped policy at the state, federal, and international levels.

However, his passion for the cause was not confined within the walls of the Guttmacher Institute. Cory held volunteer leadership positions with a number of prominent organizations in the field, including the American Public Health Association, Global Campaign for Microbicides, NARAL Pro-Choice America, National Abortion Federation, National Family Planning and Reproductive Health Association, and Sexuality Information and Education Council of the U.S. (SIECUS).

On April 4th, 2013, Cory passed away at age 64 of pancreatic cancer and is survived by his spouse of 23 years, Douglas Mitchell. However, his influence in Washington made a significant impact in public health policy and his financial support of Central High School will secure a future for CHS students that will continue to live on forever.

"Central High School was very, very special to Cory," said Jane. "None of us were ever able to forget how special an institution it is."

Cory instructed that in lieu of flowers to his memorial (which was held in Washington D.C. for over three hundred guests), that donations should be made to the Central High School Foundation.

"He always held his memories of his time at Central and his memories of the people there very close to his heart," said Scott. "They provided him with a great amount of satisfaction and pride. He was very proud to be a graduate of Central High School."
