Central's \$100,000 Challenge...

A Matching Grant Opportunity From the Daugherty Foundation

The Robert B. Daugherty Foundation recently awarded a \$100,000 challenge grant to the 150th anniversary underwriting campaign undertaken by the Central High School Foundation. The "challenge" means that, in order to receive the grant, an equal \$100,000 match must be raised by April 2010.

"I have great memories of Central and I am pleased to help support its future activities," said Robert B. Daugherty, who graduated from Central in 1939.

When matched, this final \$200,000 will bring the campaign to its goal of raising \$750,000 to provide a meaningful and lasting legacy in honor of the 150th anniversary of Central.

The underwriting campaign will support a variety of programs and projects including:

- Scholarships for graduating seniors;
- Support for Central's signature athletic, arts and other extracurricular programs;
- Support for the CHS Foundation and Alumni Association who communicate regularly with a nationwide network of over 50,000 alumni, parents, staff and friends; and
- A legacy project called "Preserving the Past for the Future" which will safeguard Central's fragile historical documents and make them accessible via the Foundation's web site.

"We could not be more thrilled with this announcement," commented CHS Foundation President Dr. Rusty Crossman. "We truly appreciate this generous gift and are confident that CHS supporters will rise to the challenge."

Gifts of \$3,000 or more to the underwriting

Preserving the Past for the Future

One of the activities that will be funded by the underwriting campaign is the archival project undertaken by the CHS Alumni Association. This effort involves the scanning of historical documents including all of the issues of the 134-year-old Central High *Register*, yearbooks, photos and other items relevant to Central's history.

These documents, especially early issues of the Central High *Register*, are very fragile and even crumbling. The CHS Alumni Association is planning to digitally scan all of the archival information and make it accessible on-line through the Foundation's web site at www.centralhighomaha.org. Optical character recognition will make it possible to look up specific subjects and names.

"Once all of the documents are scanned and accessible via the Foundation's web site, it will be important not only to those of us associated with and interested in the history of Central, but the history of Omaha, as well," commented CHS Foundation Executive Director Terry Price.

Another part of the "Preserving the Past for the Future" project involves the building and installation of a third, custom-made cabinet to display historical memorabilia in Central's courtyard.

Timeline banners honoring Central's history were installed in Central's courtyard in March. As the second part of the banner project, commemorative 150th anniversary banners will be installed on light poles in front of Central in August. The Central High "Tradition of Excellence" has been a standard for decades. We're proud of the outstanding accomplishments of our alumni, students and staff. This year, the Class of 2009 amassed nearly \$10 million in scholarships to post secondary institutions setting a new school record by over \$2 million!

Other accomplishments include a State Chess Championship (six state championships in the last seven years!) and the third straight third-place finish at state for the Academic Decathlon Team. 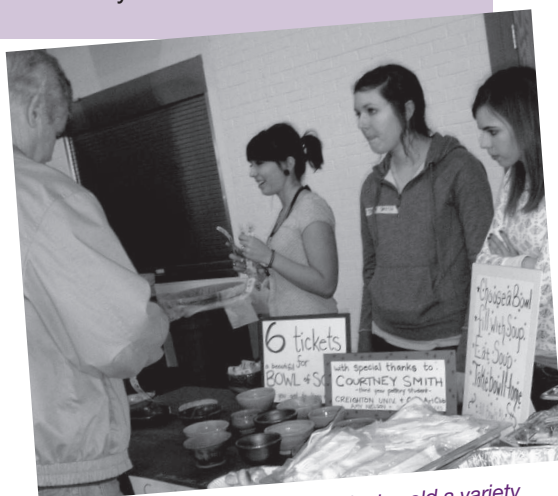

Groups Under The Umbrella

The organizations listed to the right benefit from the CHS Foundation's non-profit status and receive its assistance in raising and managing funds to support their projects. A brief description of each organization's mission and activities is provided here.

Athletic Booster Club

The Athletic Booster Club's mission is to provide support and recognition for Central's athletic teams, cheerleaders and pom squad. The Athletic Booster Club also organizes four annual athletic banquets that acknowledge Central's incomparable athletes and teams.

Band Parent Organization (B.P.O.)

B.P.O. works side-by-side Central's music staff to provide students with the best music

experience possible; awards scholarships to graduating seniors; accompanies the band to music contests; transports equipment to games, parades and competitions; and even assists with instrument maintenance and repair.

CHS Alumni Association

In support of its mission of "Keeping Central, Central," the CHS Alumni Association coordinates the annual Hall of Fame event, publishes a twice-annual newsletter, maintains the CHS Alumni Library, compiles information related to alumni

war casualties and is responsible for the collection and storage of historical memorabilia.

Parents, Educators and Pupils (P.E.P.)

As Central's parent-teacher organization, P.E.P. supports students, teachers and administrators through a variety of fundraising programs and special projects. Events supported by P.E.P. include the Holiday Tea for teachers, Purple Feather Day, the Post-Prom Party, National Honor Society Reception and Senior Recognition Day.

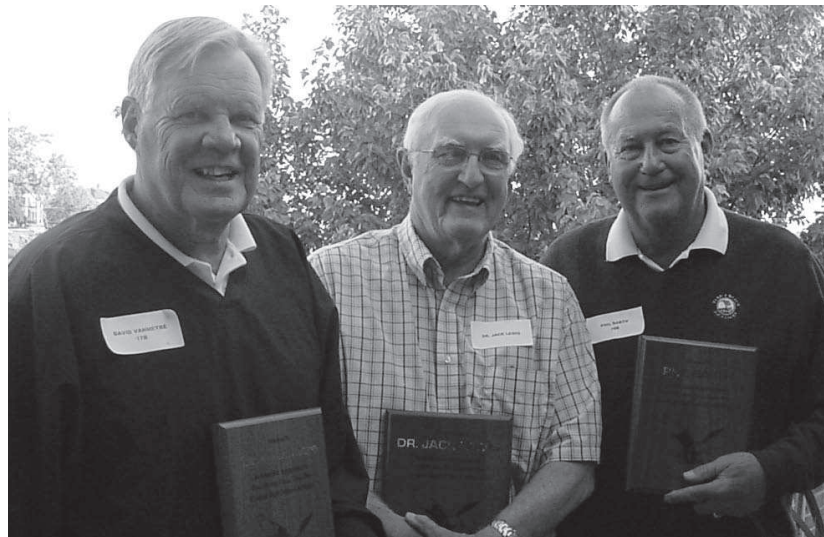

Scholarships & Recognition

Supporters Gather To Honor Student and Teacher of the Year

Students, staff, alumni, friends and supporters attended the Central High School Class of 2009 Senior Recognition Event held in May. This remarkable class earned a record \$10 million in scholarships to further their education at post-secondary institutions – including \$147,000 awarded through the CHS Foundation.

The Teacher of the Year and Student of the Year awards were presented by CHS Foundation President Dr. Rusty Crossman. Each year, the Foundation's Board of Directors selects a Teacher of the Year from a selection of nominees. Seniors nominate themselves for the Student of the Year award by filling out the Foundation's nomination form and are also selected by the Foundation Board of Directors and Board of Counselors.

Greg Sand, who has taught math at Central since 2002, was honored as Teacher of the Year. Beyond his excellent work in the classroom, Greg is responsible for growing the Middle School Math Olympiad to the second largest contest in the state and for developing the event into a student-run competition.

Greg also helped coordinate the addition of Calculus 3 into the curriculum and initiated the option of dual enrolling in both Differential Equations and Calculus 3 through UNO. Students are able to earn up to seven hours of college credit for taking these classes at Central, which saves students and their families both time and money.

"Just to have your name mentioned alongside some of the outstanding faculty who have taught at Central really blows me away," said Greg. "But the fact that seniors took the time to write letters nominating me for this award is really fantastic."

Student of the Year Michael Walsh '09 participated in numerous leadership activities and volunteer efforts during his high school career, all while maintaining a 4.72 GPA. This fall, Michael will attend the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) where he will pursue his interests in robotics, aerospace engineering and bioengineering.

Michael received a \$1,000 scholarship and an engraved paperweight. Both honorees have also been added to the Teacher and Student of the Year plaques located in the CHS courtyard and CHS Foundation office.

Scholarship Supporters Attend Recognition Event

Many of the generous individuals who have funded scholarships through the CHS Foundation, including Dee Maycock, Hugh Williams '48, and Jim and Colleen (Kelly) '67 Sariscsany, were on hand to celebrate the achievements of the Class of 2009.

"I am always so grateful for the opportunity to attend the honors event to see what the Senior Class has accomplished," said Dee Maycock. "I am especially pleased if I get to meet the Maycock Scholarship winner and have an opportunity to learn what his or her plans are."

This year's Maycock Scholarship winner, Sarah Medeiros '09, plans to attend UNO and major in social work. "I think she will be excellent at this or whatever she decides to do," added Dee. "I was very impressed with her and enjoyed meeting her, her parents and her grandfather."

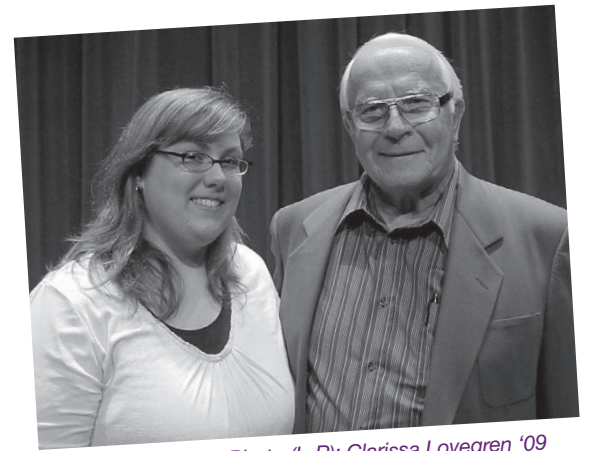

Jonis Agee Class of 1961

A nationally-recognized novelist and short story writer, Jonis Agee gives credit to her CHS English teacher, Frank Rice, for encouraging her to pursue her writing talent.

This she has done, producing 13 books, including five novels and several short story collections. Jonis received her B.A. from Iowa and her M.A. and Ph.D. from SUNY Binghamton. She is currently the Adele Hall Professor of English at UNL where she teaches creative writing and 20th century fiction, and she is also the founding director of the Nebraska Summer Writers' Conference. Her latest works include *The River Wife*, a Nebraska best seller; short story collections including *Bend This Heart* and *A .38 Special and a Broken Heart*; and anthologies (editor), essays, and film projects. Jonis has received many writing awards, including both the Gold Award and a Book of the Year Award from ForeWord Magazine, two Loft-McKnight Awards (for Fiction and an Award of Distinction), two Nebraska Book Awards for Fiction, the Nebraska Arts Council Merit Award, and recognition for three Notable Books of the Year by the New York Times. Reviewers of her work have praised her novels, describing *The River Wife* as "an all-consuming experience" (Booklist) and *Sweet Eyes* as "A big, complicated book about small town life, in the great American tradition of Faulkner, Willa Cather, and Sherwood Anderson" (*Philadelphia Inquirer*). Jonis has been described as "a gifted poet of that dark lushness of the American landscape" (*New York Times*).



Susan A. Buffett Class of 1971

Susan A. Buffett, Susie to those who know her and to many who do not, is a 1971 Central graduate and an avid supporter of her alma mater, as well as an

advocate for all children and people in need. Through her Sherwood Foundation, Susie has accomplished many of her goals, including the creation of two Educare Centers in Omaha. In addition, her direct involvement made the extensive land exchange between the Joslyn Art Museum, Creighton University, and the Omaha Public Schools a reality that culminated in the construction of the new Seemann Stadium on Central's campus. Susie recently joined the board of directors of the Central High School Foundation.



Fred Burbank Class of 1959

Dr. Fred Burbank's achievements as a psychiatrist, diagnostic radiologist, medical instruments inventor, and medical businesses

entrepreneur in the field of medicine are outstanding. Fred gives credit for his success, in part, to his academic preparation at both Central (ROTC colonel, tennis letterman, Road Show performer and director) and to Stanford University (completed both his B.A. and M.D. there). As a diagnostic radiologist, Fred focused on the health of women, particularly seeking to improve a physician's ability to perform biopsies of the breast. To that end, he invented a biopsy needle which, with image guidance, allowed breast tissue to be analyzed without surgery. Following this success, Fred formed a breast device company, SenoRx, and instructed approximately 10,000 doctors from around the world in how to perform this less invasive breast biopsy procedure. Fred was also responsible for inventing another device which led to another major breakthrough in women's health. When used for the removal of a fibroid tumor, this device, a specially-designed clamp, eliminated the need for a woman to have a hysterectomy as part of the procedure. In addition to these two major accomplishments, Fred holds over 50 patents for other inventions, has formed three medical instruments companies, has written numerous medical articles, books and book chapters, and has delivered countless medical lectures and presentations, both nationally and internationally.



Francine L. Pope Huff Class of 1985

Francine Huff is a free lance writer, speaker, and editor who has established a solid reputation in the field of financial planning. Her

experience as an editor at the *Wall Street Journal*, coupled with her writings on this topic, have solidified her acceptance as a recognized consultant in this field. She is the author of several works related to helping individuals handle their personal finances, including *The 25-Day Money Makeover for Women*, a book designed to allow the reader to see financial results quickly. In addition, Francine has established a blog, *Super Savvy Spender*, which provides information on using one's money, time, and talents wisely, and she has appeared on "Money Matters," a financial program on the ABC television network. In her work, Francine has made a conscious effort to incorporate her faith with her financial advice. She uses scripture to show that financial references do appear and to reinforce the idea that individuals can learn to make sound, faith-based financial decisions. Francine graduated from Northwestern University with a B.S. in journalism degree.



Howard Kennedy IV Class of 1958

While at Central, Howard Kennedy IV achieved success in a number of

school activities, including baseball, winning the city's batting championship in both his junior and senior years, and in drama and vocal music, playing the lead role of Billy Bigelow in the school musical, *Carousel*. Howard attended the University of Iowa where he was the captain of the baseball team and held a major leadership role as a cadet in the university's ROTC program. After graduating with a degree in speech and dramatic arts, Howard served in the U.S. Army as a 2nd lieutenant before beginning his broadcasting career. He held a number in positions of radio and television broadcasting, including DJ, TV host and director, station manager, and general manager. His career took him to various cities, and, eventually, to Omaha where he became KMTV's general manager. During his broadcasting career, Howard served as the president of the CBS Affiliates Board, a prominent national position, and as president of the Nebraska Broadcasters Association. Among his many honors, Howard received the Distinguished Broadcaster of the Year Award from UNL, and he is a member of the Nebraska Broadcasters Association Hall of Fame. In addition to his distinguished broadcasting career, Howard has given much time and energy to his hometown community by serving on several boards, including the Urban League, Opera Omaha, United Way, the Omaha Chamber of Commerce, the Wellness Council of the Midlands, Lauritzen Gardens, the College World Series Board, and as a trustee of Dundee Presbyterian Church.

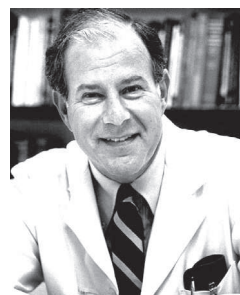


Paul Kutler Class of 1961

After graduating from Central and then from Iowa State University with an engineering degree, Paul Kutler continued his studies at ISU, achieving both his

M.S. and Ph.D. in aerospace and mechanical engineering. Later, he completed a Master of Science in Management from Stanford University. With this preparation, Paul developed a most successful engineering, business, and teaching career. He worked for the NASA Headquarters and NASA Ames Research Center in many capacities, including research scientist; Chief in the Applied Computational Aerodynamics Branch; Director of Aerodynamics Division (Acting); Manager, High Performance Computing and Communications; Director, Consolidated Supercomputing Management Office; Deputy Director, Information Sciences and Technology; and Director, West Coast Programs. He has been president of Flow Simulations, Inc. (his own company) and an instructor in mechanical and aerospace engineering at San Jose State University. In addition to his professional work, Paul has served in many roles and on many committees with the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics. In support of his profession, Paul has presented lectures, given interviews, provided testimony, presented at national and international seminars and written over 60 scientific

publications related to aeronautics, astronautics, fluid dynamics, and computers. Paul has served his local community as a member of several boards, a youth sports coach and an elementary school lecturer, helping with scholarship selection committees, and being an Angel Flight pilot.



**Harold A. Oberman
Class of 1949**

After earning his B.A. from the University of Omaha, Dr. Harold Oberman was accepted at UNMC, graduating cum laude in 1956. He

then entered the U.S. Army, completing his service as a captain at Walter Reed Hospital. He accepted a position in pathology at the University of Michigan, where he stayed for his entire academic and medical career. As a researcher and professor, Dr. Oberman focused on two major areas, breast cancer diagnosis and blood banking (transfusion innovations). He established the Breast Care Center, a clinic which allowed a woman to be seen at one location and in one visit by all the physicians responsible for her cancer treatment. His other major focus involved the design of significant blood transfusion innovations followed by other practitioners across the country. His work in both anatomic and clinical pathology was identified as the "gold standard" in academic pathology. In addition, he served as an editor and reviewer for several medical journals, as president of the Michigan Association of Blood Banks, as president of the Michigan Association of Pathologists, and as a member of several national advisory committees and professional societies. He published in excess of 100 journal articles, wrote numerous book chapters, and spoke at both national and international meetings. Over the course of his life, Dr. Oberman received many honors, including the prestigious UNMC Distinguished Alumni Award.



**Terry Price
Contributor**

Since its beginning in 1996, the Central High School Foundation, an organization serving over 50,000 alumni, students, parents, and staff, has been under the leadership

of its first Executive Director, Terry Price. Terry's dedication to Central is unequalled. Terry began volunteering at Central in 1990 when her son started there, and she served as P.E.P. president when her daughter was a senior in 1998. 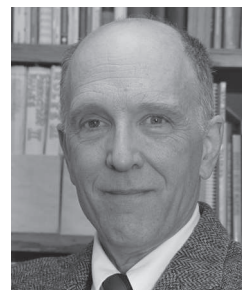

**Gregory M. Stejskal
Class of 1967**

An FBI agent for 31 years, a legal advisor/instructor, a lecturer/seminar presenter, a field coordinator, a trainer, a writer, and a

football player (Central and UNL): these are just some of the roles that identify Greg Stejskal. After his graduation from Central and UNL, Greg enrolled in the University of Nebraska College of Law where he received his J.D. He applied for, and was accepted into, the FBI program, a lifelong dream. His first assignment was in Detroit, Mich., (the fugitive squad), and, after a few years, he was moved to Ann Arbor, Mich., (bank robbery squad, surveillance squad, and SWAT team). He spent the majority of his career there, eventually becoming senior resident agent in charge of the Ann Arbor office of six agents in five counties, focusing on criminal cases and foreign counterintelligence. Over the course of his career, Greg led investigations involving kidnappings, mass murders, illegal drug use (steroids), and racketeering. Thanks to his work, many dangerous criminals were arrested and jailed. Some cases which involved Greg directly included the investigation leading to the capture of the Unabomber and Operation Equine, a case involving the illegal distribution of steroids. As a result of the steroid case, Major League Baseball was warned about a significant steroid problem in 1994, but the warning was in ignored. Greg and other agents received a special award from the FBI, the FDA, and the Royal Mounted Police for their work on that case. Greg addresses University of Michigan athletes annually on the dangers of steroid use. Greg has been characterized as "someone who always strives to do the right thing" and as "a rock solid law enforcement guy."



**Robert Swift Wigton
Class of 1960**

After graduating from Central Bob Wigton went on to Harvard, where he majored in English literature. He received his M.D., at UNMC,

where he completed an additional master's degree in physiology and biophysics, began an internal medicine residency, and then joined the faculty, focusing on patient care, teaching, and research. As associate dean for the residency programs and professor in internal medicine, he has focused on research in medical education and on how physicians make clinical decisions. He developed methods in computer-based teaching, and he established clinical decision rules designed to help physicians make more accurate diagnosis. He is recognized as a national authority on the teaching of medical procedures, having done research to make doctors' performance of procedures safer. He has received many awards, including the Irving S. Cutter Gold Medal for Outstanding Contributions to Medicine, the Elnora M. Rhodes SGIM Service Award, and the Eugene Saenger Award for Distinguished Service. He has received many grants and contracts in support of his work, and he has written innumerable scientific articles, papers, books, and book chapters on topics related to his field of medicine. Bob has also served on numerous medical committees, has been a national editor for medical journals and a medical board examiner, and he is a fellow in the American College of Medical Informatics.
