# Fundraising Success Celebrated at Feather & Rock the Nest Events



On Saturday, April 10, more than 350 alumni, staff, parents, friends and supporters gathered at Rock the Nest to celebrate the successful conclusion of the CHS Foundation's three-year fundraising campaign. Held just steps away from Central at the Joslyn Art Museum, the delightful evening featured socializing, dining and dancing in the Fountain Court and a silent auction on the Strauss Bridge.

The Joslyn's polished marble walls were embellished with projected images of the Rock the Nest logo. Black and white linens adorned the tables with tasteful accents of Central purple found throughout the décor.

"It was wonderful to have the opportunity to celebrate with many of the individuals who helped us reach our goal," said Susan (Strauss) Lebens '70, CHS Foundation Board Secretary. "We are truly grateful for the more than 1,500 donations we received, including the generous \$100,000 challenge grant from the Robert Daugherty (CHS '39) Foundation that put us over the top."

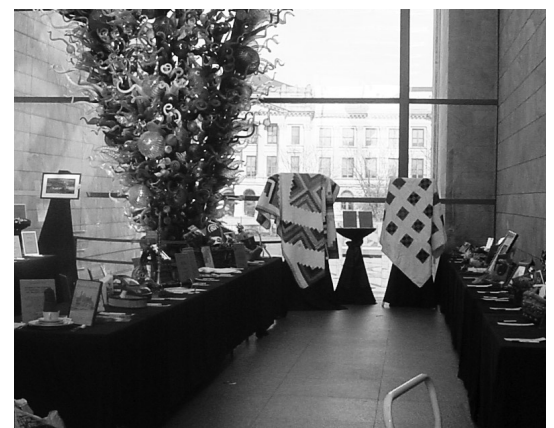

Sesquicentennial funding has been used to underwrite scholarships and an exterior and interior lighting project at Central. Most recently, funds were used to build and install a third wooden display cabinet for historical exhibits in Central's courtyard. Funds are also being used to underwrite the scanning of Central's fragile historical documents, mainly yearbooks and *Registers*, into a searchable database that will be accessible via the Foundation's web site.

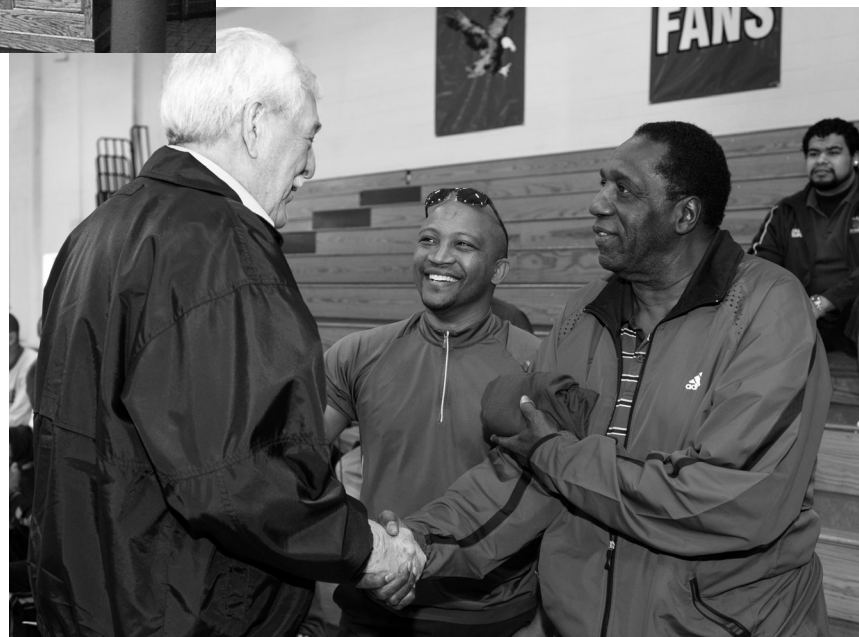

## A Cappella Reunion Choir Performs

“How Can I Keep From Singing?: A Century of Singing at Central” was presented in the CHS Auditorium during the Rock the Nest Open House on April 10. The concert was a tribute to the 150th anniversary of Central and also served as the 79th anniversary reunion of the A Cappella Choir.

The performance featured an amazing spectrum of OPS talent including the CHS Handbell Choir, Future Eagles Choir, OPS Mini Singers, 2009-2010 A Cappella Choir and the A Cappella Alumni Choir.

The event was especially meaningful for A Cappella alumni who numbered over 100 strong and represented classes ranging from 1940 to 2009. Founded in 1921, the A Cappella choir has a long and distinguished history at Central.

“Singing in the choir is a special bonding experience,” said CHS Vocal Music Director Lyn Bouma. “It’s similar to belonging to a sports team and the members become like family.”

The April concert was the third A Cappella reunion organized by Bouma, who has taught music at Central for 17 years. “I received a letter from a gentleman from the class of 1940 who referred to the event as a ‘joyful experience,’” she said. “The alumni really enjoy having the opportunity to relive their high school singing experiences, especially if

they don’t often have the chance to sing.” Another student, Mark Zoll ’03, was faced with a scheduling conflict as his bachelor party was being held the same evening as the concert. Zoll, and three of his friends who are also A Cappella alumni, decided to begin their evening by participating in the concert and then moving on to the rest of the bachelor party.

“We felt we had an obligation to Mr. and Mrs. Bouma to be there and represent our class,” said Zoll. “They gave us so much over the four years we had them as teachers. We couldn’t pass up the chance to sing with them again. It was great.”

Former vocal music director Bob McMeen and accompanist Pat Allender both participated in the concert. Bouma anticipates the next reunion concert will be held in the next three to eight years.

“CHS Vocal Music director Lyn Bouma made me feel especially welcome and announced that Bob Reisser ’40 and I represented the earliest choir and that I came the greatest distance except for a man who was there from Israel,” said Johnson.

Although only six members of the Class of ‘40 were able to attend the event, Johnson was able to reconnect with others using contact information pulled from the Foundation’s database. He is appreciative for this help and also the kindness shown to him by all connected to Central during his time in Omaha.

## Class of ‘69 Holds Outstanding Reunion & Wins First Class Challenge

The Class of ‘69 has two post-reunion reasons to celebrate: they are the winners of the 2010 First Class Challenge AND they had an amazing reunion that people are still talking about.

The First Class Challenge is a friendly competition among classes holding reunions that raises money for the CHS Foundation’s day-to-day operating expenses. At the end of the year, the class that donates the most money wins.

Held September 11-12, 2009, the Class of ‘69 reunion began on Friday with a tour of Central followed by dinner in the courtyard and a home football game; despite a rain interruption, the Eagles beat Grand Island 14-10.

That evening, classmates went downtown to the Old Mattress Factory for drinks, snacks, music and socializing. On Saturday, the group boarded two buses for a tour of Omaha followed by drinks, dinner and a program at Castle Barrett. Roger Sayers ’60 attended the event and spoke on behalf of the Foundation. Doc Moller was also present and gave a fantastic speech that “brought everyone back to 1969.”

“There was so much excitement at the reunion and everyone was ready to reacquaint without trying to impress each other with our accomplishments or lack thereof,” said reunion organizer and treasurer Pam (Schmieding) Friskopp ’69. “Over and over again, people mentioned how much they valued

the diversity they experienced at Central and how it had been a real asset to their lives.”

Steve Marantz ’69, who also helped organize the reunion, recently wrote a book on Central’s diversity and how it played out during the late 60s entitled, *The Rhythm Boys of Omaha Central: High School Basketball at the ‘68 Racial Divide*.

“The story is well known to Central students of our era – about the collision of our talented basketball team with social upheaval and civil rights in March 1968 just before the state tournament,” said Marantz. The book will be published by UNO in spring 2011.

The buzz about the book, and the fact that Marantz contacted quite a few classmates while doing research for the book prior to the reunion, contributed to the outstanding attendance. In addition to a “save the date” postcard and letter, the class also developed a Facebook page to help spread the word.

According to Marantz, other factors explaining their success may have included the upbeat and inclusive attitude created during the first year of the Obama presidency, the fact that when people reach their late 50s they are able to relax and “ponder the journey” and that the value of the Central experience has grown over time. Following the reunion, a booklet with information about members of the Class of ‘69 was mailed out.

Pat (McLaughlin) Peterson ’69 compiled the booklet based on information provided on questionnaires. It also included reunion photos and listings of “lost” and deceased classmates.

“Reunions have a restorative effect,” concluded Marantz. “For a short time, you get to be a teenager again. It’s a joyous feeling; I could see it on the faces of my classmates. We are so appreciative of the support given by the CHS Foundation.”

## Semrad & Sayers '60 Honored at 8th Annual Golf Outing

More than 110 players participated in Central's eighth annual Golf Outing held on June 7 at Shadow Ridge Country Club. This annual event raises funds for Central's Athletic Department while honoring alumni, teachers and supporters who have made significant contributions to the school's athletic programs. This year's honorees were Paul Semrad and Roger Sayers '60.

Semrad spent his entire 32-year career at Central. He taught social studies for 17 years and served as assistant principal for 15 years. He coached boys' junior varsity baseball for six years and established the girls' basketball program in 1974.

Semrad went on to coach the girls' basketball team for 11 years and achieved two back-to-back undefeated seasons which culminated in state championships in 1983 and 1984. The '83, '84 and '85 seasons included a 58-game unbeaten streak; a feat which remains a state record.

Several years ago, the accomplishments of the '83 and '84 teams were celebrated by the Nebraska Sports Hall of Fame. Seeing so many of his former players come back for the ceremony felt "as good as winning state," said Semrad.

Regarded by many as the fastest man in the history of Omaha athletics, Roger Sayers excelled in track and football at both the high school and college levels. In 1958, he won the Nebraska Boys' State 100 and 220-yard dash gold medals and led the Eagles to a state championship. Sayers also earned All City and All State honors in football.

After graduating from Central, Sayers continued to excel in both sports at the University of Nebraska Omaha. He captured the NAIA championship in the 100 and 200 meter races and led the university to a Central Intercollegiate Conference title and an All Sports Bowl Championship.

Sayers was also selected as a member of the record-setting 1962 United States Track Team that defeated Poland and the Soviet Union in dual competition. He has been inducted into three Track and Field halls of fame, the University of Nebraska Football Hall of Fame, five athletic halls of fame and the Central High Hall of Fame.

## Mark Your Calendar! The Rematch: Central vs. Prep at Rosenblatt

This fall, Central and Prep will meet again on the same gridiron where they faced off 50 years ago. In honor of the 50th anniversary of the 1960 Central vs. Creighton Prep game, a rematch is being held at Rosenblatt Stadium (known back then as Municipal Stadium) on October 8, 2010.

Members of the legendary 1960 Central Eagles team are being invited to return for this much-anticipated game. The team featured All State, All Inter-City halfback Gale Sayers '61, All Inter-City fullback Vernon Breakfield '61, All State, All Inter-City tackle Don Fiedler '61 and quarterback/linebacker James "Jim" Cappelupo '61.

The 1960 challenge ended in a 0-0 tie, part of an undefeated season for the Purple and White. Jim Karabotsos, who coached football at Central from 1951 to 1961, remembers the 1960 game vividly. "Both teams had the chance to score and both teams failed," he recalls. "We didn't consider the 0-0 score to be a victory."

Karabotsos was the assistant coach during the 1960 game. The head coach, Frank Smagacz, is now deceased.

Jim Cappelupo remembers the intense media hype prior to the game. Both teams were

undefeated (and went on to have undefeated seasons that year). "When we got to the stadium, the place was packed," he said. "The crowd was just short of 15,000."

Cappelupo recalls the game as a contest between two teams that were remarkably well-matched. "Prep had a stalwart defense and we had a potent offense," he said. "We both had opportunities to score, but were unable to capitalize."

The October 8th game's meaning takes on added drama as it will be the final high school football game presented at Rosenblatt Stadium, which will soon be torn down and replaced with the new downtown TD Ameritrade Park.

# Scholarships & Recognition

## Theresa Lomneth '10 and Pete Wilger Claim Top Awards at Central's Annual Senior Recognition Event

The achievements of the Central High School Class of 2010 were celebrated at the annual Senior Recognition Event in May. This remarkable class earned a record-breaking total of over \$11 million in scholarships to further their education at post-secondary institutions. This amount includes \$125,000 awarded through the CHS Foundation.

The Teacher and Student of the Year awards were presented by CHS Foundation President Dr. Rusty Crossman. Each year, the Foundation's Board of Directors selects a Teacher of the Year from a pool of deserving nominees. Seniors nominate themselves for the Student of the Year award by filling out the Foundation's nomination form and are selected by the Foundation Board of Directors and Board of Counselors.

Theresa Lomneth '10 was honored as Student of the Year, as her brother Philip Lomneth was in 2008. One of Central's eight National Merit Scholars, Theresa's accomplishments include participation in numerous leadership activities and volunteer efforts both at CHS and in the community – all while maintaining a 4.82 GPA. She received a \$1,000 scholarship to continue her studies at Claremont McKenna College in California where she plans to major in economics.

"Everyone I know who applied for the recognition is a fantastic representation of Central who I would

have been happy to see win," said Lomneth. "For me, though, the most exciting part was seeing my name on the plaque in the courtyard and realizing that I am officially a part of Central's history."

Teacher of the Year Pete Wilger has been an instrumental music instructor at CHS since 1991 and a teacher for 25 years. A graduate of Omaha Bryan and UNO, Wilger also has a Master of Music degree from UNO.

Under his tenure at Central, the music department's staff has grown from one to two vocal teachers as well as an assistant band director and an orchestra director. In 2010, Wilger helped create the new Performing Arts Department to provide expanded opportunities for students interested in theater.

New this year, the Teacher of the Year received a generous \$1,000 from the

Phillip & Terri Schrage Foundation because Phil Schrage '55, who passed away in June, felt it was important that the Teacher of the Year also win a monetary award.

"The award was a real surprise and quite humbling," said Wilger. "I am so thankful to everyone who recognized my efforts."

## Henry Davis '69 Establishes "Special Needs" Fund for Vocational or Technical Training

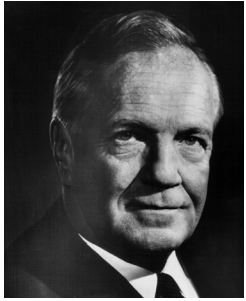

### **Howard F. Ahmanson** **Class of 1923**

Howard F. Ahmanson, Sr., made his mark in the financial world, becoming recognized as one of the most successful business leaders of the twentieth century. This financial success evolved from the humble beginnings

of the H.F. Ahmanson Co., a fire insurance and savings and loan company which he established in Southern California in the 1930's. In 1947, Howard bought Home Savings & Loan Association, which provided financial backing for the California housing boom that resulted after World War II. Realizing great achievements with this business, he and members of his family wanted to give back to the Southern California community and in 1952 established the Ahmanson Foundation, currently based in Beverly Hills, CA. Over the years, the Foundation has awarded millions of dollars in grants in support of nonprofit organizations in the Los Angeles area. Some gifts have also been made to Omaha area institutions. Today, the Foundation's work continues in support of cultural projects in the arts and humanities, education at all levels, health care programs related to homelessness and underserved populations, and other human services programs.



### **James Sunderland** **Backer** **Class of 1980**

Jim Backer's educational success at Central, Stanford University, and UCLA equates very well with his business success in real estate development and community involvement in

the Santa Clarita Valley of southern California. As a CHS student, Jim was the editor of the *Register*, a member of Latin Club and, at the same time, participated in basketball, baseball, and tennis, winning the Metro singles title on three occasions. He then moved on to Stanford, graduating with a B.A. in history and, eventually, receiving his MBA from UCLA. Jim's work experience began with The Newhall Land and Farming Company, a real estate development firm. His work there in commercial land development and sales set him on a highly successful real estate development career, leading to Jim's establishing his own firm, JSB Development, in Valencia, California. Jim's firm helped to develop over twenty-five buildings and other commercial development projects in support of the Valencia Gateway Master Plan, with Valencia Gateway being the largest master-planned center for business and technology in Los Angeles County. His firm is the developer of Vista Canyon, which is projected to be a transit-oriented mixed-use development consisting of residential, commercial and recreational uses (trails and parks) served by a Metrolink station and bus transit facility. In addition to his business success, Jim has been active in his Santa Clarita community, serving on several foundations and boards, including the Foundation for Children's Dental Health and as the founding President of the SCV Education Foundation. The Backer family, including his parents, sister, and brother, continue to support Central, having established and provided continuing support to the Sunderland Memorial Scholarship, given annually to a CHS senior in honor of his grandfather, John E. Sunderland, Class of 1916.

### **Jerry Bartee** **Class of 1966**

Recognition of excellence by one's peers in one's chosen profession is the ultimate recognition of achievement in a career and in life. Jerry Bartee's career has included successful positions with Creighton University as its

head baseball coach and with the Omaha Public Schools as a teacher at Nathan Hale Middle School, assistant principal and principal at South High School, and as the Assistant Superintendent for Business Services for the district. In all of these positions, Jerry has been recognized by his colleagues both for his leadership and for his compassion. In their words he is "loyal, creative, hard working, dependable, and enthusiastic." He is "a person who sets high standards for himself and for those around him, but was patient, kind, and firm when he worked with individual students." He was able "to get staff and student to try harder. In tough times he is the person you want beside you – a sensitive, caring, strong personality." Jerry's role as assistant superintendent carries the responsibility for preparing and monitoring a multimillion dollar budget that provides funds that support a great share of the school district's everyday needs and future planning, including funding for building maintenance and supplies, curriculum materials, facilities construction, nutrition services, transportation, school planning, district security, and other areas. Throughout his personal life and in his educational career, Jerry has been "a decisive leader who inspires distinguished performance and motivates others to do their best." He will always be known as "a person who believes that every child is to be valued and has the right to a quality education."



### **Deborah (Roach) Gilg** **Class of 1970**

The legal career of Deborah (Roach) Gilg has both spanned and connected the state of Nebraska. As a result, Deb has been able to build bridges between the rural and urban communities of the state. From her work in

western Nebraska as County Attorney for Arthur and Keith counties, as a Special Deputy County Attorney for Garden, Deuel, and five other western Nebraska counties, as City Attorney for Ogallala, and as the Village Attorney for Arthur and Paxton to her work in eastern Nebraska as Deputy County Attorney for Saunders County, as a private practice attorney in Omaha, and, ultimately, to her presidential appointment as the first woman to serve as the United States Attorney for the District of Nebraska, Deb has covered the state making legal decisions in a fair and just manner for all Nebraska's citizens, no matter their location in the state. A colleague has identified Deb's qualities of "calmness, fairness, patience, and modesty" as the foundation on which she has based her work as a lawyer. Through her work she has connected, not divided, the state. As she has said, "I owe much to western Nebraska for ... teaching me what an honorable profession it is to be a lawyer -- and that there doesn't have to be a gap between urban and rural Nebraska." Her professional achievements include three Outstanding Public Service Awards and her selection as Chair of the Nebraska Equal Opportunities Commission. Deborah has also served on, or been a member of, several professional committees and associations

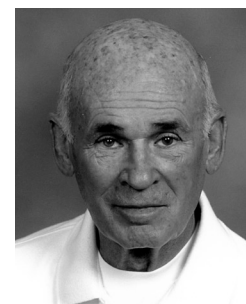
affiliated with her legal work, including the Nebraska County Attorneys' Association, the Robert Spire Inns of the Court, the National District Attorneys' Association and the U.S. Attorney General's national terrorism and security committee, civil rights committee and Native American committee.



### **Howard J. Kaslow** **Class of 1957**

As a graduate of CHS, second in his class, Yale University, magna cum laude, and Yale Law School, cum laude, as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University, and as a practicing attorney, Howard J. Kaslow was, and remains, at the top

of his class and at the top of his profession, having been recognized for his outstanding achievements in his academic preparation, in his legal career, and in his volunteer work in the community. While at Central, he combined classroom excellence with debate championships and track achievements, contributing to CHS track championships in the high and low hurdles. Howard's law career has focused on business organizations and transactions, trusts and estate planning. During his law career, he has been selected as a Fellow of both the American Bar Foundation and the Nebraska State Bar Foundation, has been listed in "Best Lawyers in America" for more than 15 years, and was named "Omaha Best Lawyers Corporate Lawyer of the Year for 2010" by Best Lawyers. Beyond his law career, Howard has been involved with numerous civic groups, including serving as a board member of the Omaha Community Foundation and Boys Town, as a Director and Past President of the Fontenelle Nature Association, as Past President of the Jewish Federation of Omaha, as a Director and Past Chairman of Inclusive Communities and as a member of the governance council of the Institute for Holocaust Education.



### **Jim Karabatsos** **Distinguished** **Faculty, 1951-1962**

The influence, which Jim Karabatsos continues to have on the lives of the students who were in his classroom and the athletes whom he coached, carries far beyond the classroom walls

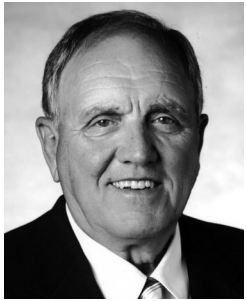
where he taught English at CHS and the baseball diamonds and football fields where he coached CHS athletes. Jim's expectations for students, whether in the classroom or on the field of athletics, were always challenging but fair, demanding but achievable, and the students and athletes whom he taught and coached would all agree that, as one of his former athletes has said, "Coach K was the most compelling and abiding influence of their high school years, the teacher who left the most lasting impression on their lives." Whether presenting a classroom literature lesson or coaching a game on the field of competition, Jim was the best because he could teach both content and character, and his students and athletes recognized, respected, and revered him for his efforts. When Jim left Central to become a professor of English at Creighton University, where he received his bachelor's and master's degrees, and, later, a doctorate from UNL, the university gained an extraordinary faculty member. During his tenure at CU, the university recognized his excellence, as seen in Jim's receiving the Distinguished Faculty and Administrative Award,

the Distinguished Faculty Service Award, the first Distinguished Advisor Award and being honored as a Professor Emeritus of English, an award which recognizes him as “the epitome of what a college teacher and a human being should be.”



**Milton D. Moore, Jr.  
Class of 1958**

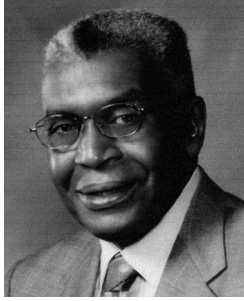
It is only fitting that one of the many assignments that Lieutenant Commander Milton D. Moore, Jr., completed in his career with the United States Coast Guard included his assignment to the Cutter Westwind, an icebreaker that participated in Operation Deepfreeze in the Antarctic. This is true because Milton Moore, a JROTC Captain and track athlete, became a barrier breaker in many ways during his service with the Coast Guard. Beginning his military service as a seaman stationed at Cape May, New Jersey, he advanced through several ranks, at several bases from New Jersey to Newfoundland, from Bermuda to Vietnam, and from St. Louis, MO, where he completed a management degree from Webster College, to Yerba Buena Island in San Francisco, CA, where he became the first African American selected to command a United States Coast Guard base. During his USCG career, Milton received many awards for his impeccable service, including, among others, the CG Achievement Medal and Unit Commendation Ribbon, the Navy Meritorious Unit Commendation with Bronze Star, the National Defense Service Medal, the Antarctic Service Medal, the Combat Action Ribbon, the Vietnam Service Ribbon, and several others. He promoted the value of a diverse Coast Guard, and, in the words of one of those whom he mentored, “He was regarded as a strong leader, a highly capable professional, and a dedicated mentor...his legacy of courage, commitment, and resourcefulness will remain as a shining example for other Coast Guard members to emulate.”



**Patrick J. Salerno  
Class of 1958**

For Pat Salerno, achievement in activities, service to the community, and enthusiasm for new opportunities have been the motivators for his life. At Central, Pat excelled in athletics, and before graduating in 1958, was selected for All-City, All State, and All-Midwest honors in football. Pat was also a baseball and basketball letterman. At the University of Nebraska, Pat achieved athletic success by lettering in both football and baseball for the Huskers and academic success by being awarded the Boucher Medal for the senior athlete with the highest GPA. He graduated with distinction in 1962 with a B.S. in education. Pat began his teaching career by returning to Central as an English teacher and assistant football coach, eventually becoming head baseball coach and then head football coach. In 1968, after completing an M.A. at UNL, Pat and his family moved to Lincoln to complete work for his

Ph.D. at UNL. He then returned to OPS, joining the faculty at South High School as English Department Chairperson, also serving as an assistant principal for one year. Pat then joined the OPS district staff as Supervisor of English and Language Arts until his retirement from OPS after 35 years of service. Pat has continued to seek opportunities for service by participating on community boards and committees associated with several organizations, including the Nebraska High School Sports Hall of Fame Foundation, the Christ Child Society, the Central High School Alumni Association, Metropolitan Community College, Omaha by Design, and the Nebraska Arts Council.



**Donald R. Townsend  
Class of 1959**

After graduating from Central, Donald attended Coe College where he graduated with honors. He was accepted to University of Nebraska’s College of Medicine, graduated with honors, and entered the military, serving as flight surgeon in the U.S. Air Force during the Vietnam War. Following his service, Donald began a residency at the University of Southern California, and, upon completion, he entered private practice in Oakland, California, where he completed over 40 years as an orthopedic, pediatric surgeon. He was also chief of staff at two hospitals. During his career, Dr. Townsend completed a Fellowship in Pediatric Orthopedics at University of Cincinnati Medical Center and was the chair of the Department of Pediatrics at the Children’s Hospital of Oakland. He also participated in Operation Rainbow, a project related to pediatric procedures being used in Lima, Peru. While there, Dr. Townsend was given the nickname of “Dr. Rapido” for the rapid, but precise, techniques which he used for addressing the birth defects afflicting the children of that region.



**Hugh Williams  
Class of 1948**

The career of Hugh Williams follows a path that Hugh took to transform the old line firm of Drake-Williams-Mount Co., his family’s original sheet metal and boiler repair company into Drake-Williams Steel, Inc., a multi-plant structural and miscellaneous steel fabrication business. It amounted to making a transition from steam powered equipment to modern electro-hydraulics. After a stretch of military service, Hugh moved the company in a completely new direction: structural steel fabrication for all kinds of buildings, despite the fact that the company had no experience in this field. Soon after Hugh became President, he enlisted the support of his employees by establishing a profit sharing plan, thereby boosting employee morale and gaining the confidence of local bankers and suppliers. Soon the company began to win more contracts, purchasing new equipment and acquiring some less successful plants, plus expanding into additional markets. Company sales increased fifteen-fold and Drake-Williams furnished steel for many of Omaha’s well-known landmarks, including the Creighton Dental School, Children’s Memorial Hospital, W. Dale Clark Library, and Joslyn Art Museum. After retirement and this success in the business, he wrote a book, *Steel Resolve*, which is a history of both the company and of early Omaha. Hugh has given generously for CHS projects, including donating the large bronze “Victory Eagle” at the entrance to Seemann Stadium, providing financial assistance for Central’s 150th celebration, and establishing a new annual scholarship, named the Augusta Turpin Memorial English Scholarship, given in her honor to a deserving CHS senior student.

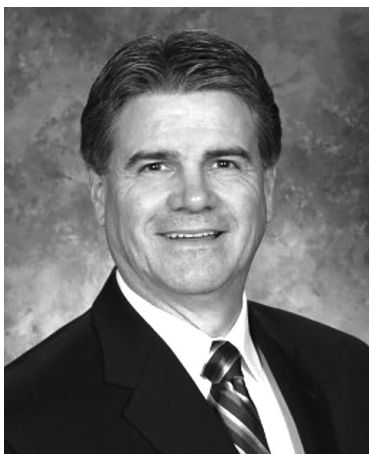

**A Message from Principal Greg Emmel: Strong Academic Tradition Continues to Distinguish Central**



In May, Central concluded an exceptional academic year. Last fall, eight seniors were named National Merit Semi-Finalists. This is the largest number at Central since 1993. More than 1.5 million juniors in more than 22,000 high schools entered

the 2010 National Merit Scholarship Program and less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors achieved this status.

All eight Central High School students were eventually named finalists and became eligible for National Merit scholarships. The eight scholars are:

Rosemary Brusnahan, Emily Epperson, Eric Jizba, Catherine Larsen, Carmen Lau, Theresa Lomneth, Taylor Olson and Alexandria Tran.

Also last fall, the Omaha School Board approved Central’s pursuit to become an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School. If successful, there will be a Middle Years Programme and a Diploma Programme.

Programs in IB World Schools are governed by the International Baccalaureate Organization in Geneva, Switzerland and administered by the International Baccalaureate Curriculum and Assessment Center in Cardiff, Wales. The organization originated over 30 years ago in an effort to ensure quality educational standards for students, regardless of where they lived.

Central’s pursuit of the IB program will in no way diminish the school’s commitment to the College Board Advanced Placement (AP) program. This year, 786 students were enrolled in 23 AP courses.

Of those students, 294 took advantage of dual enrollment with the University of Nebraska-Omaha (UNO).

Dual Enrollment allows academically talented students to earn college credit while still in high school. The courses are taught at the high school by teachers that have been selected by UNO to be adjunct faculty. Central students earned a total of 1,041 college credits this year.

In January, art students placed second in the Nebraska State Visual Arts Competition. In February, Central’s Academic Decathlon Team again advanced to the state competition and finished with a bronze medal for the fourth year in a row. The Central High Chess Team, coached by technology teacher Drew Thyden, won the silver medal in the state competition. The team has won the state championship an astounding six of the last eight years.

## Scanning Project Safeguards Fragile Documents for Future

The historical document scanning project is well underway, according to Alumni Association Archives Committee member Jim Wigton '66. “We are currently scanning all of the *Registers* from 1886 to the present,” he said. “Next, we will move on to the *O-Books*.”

Curt Reiter of Microfilm Imaging Systems is providing professional scanning services for this project. “The fun part is in reading how Central students talked about education years ago,” he said. “The challenge is that, over time, paper becomes brittle and black and white copy turns to brown and yellow.”

When the project is complete, every page of the *Registers* and *O-Books* will be accessible on the Foundation’s web site. The data will be searchable by name or by key word.

Concurrent to this project, Jim Wigton, Bob Wigton '60 and Barry Combs '50 have scanned over 7,000 pages of additional documents including photos, letters, newspaper clippings, and more. The Alumni Association is currently looking for old class photos to add to the archive.

“We only have a few photos from the turn of the century,” said Jim Wigton. “If anyone has old class photos, or any other documents of historical significance to Central, we would love to scan them, or better yet, have them added to the archives.”

Funds from the 150th campaign are underwriting the scanning project and were also used to purchase acid free boxes and steel cabinets for storing the original documents.

## Retiring Principal Leaves Behind Legacy of Achievement

After four years as principal of Central, Greg Emmel retired in July. Emmel will be remembered by staff, students and parents for maintaining the school’s tradition of excellence, strengthening the academic program and for achieving a high level of success in athletics.

Central celebrated its 150th anniversary in his final year, and the Foundation completed a successful three-year fundraising effort which concluded with the Feather the Nest and Rock the Nest celebrations. “Working with Terry Price, Rusty Crossman and the Foundation Board the past four years has been great,” said Emmel. “The strong support of the CHS Foundation, alumni, parents and staff is one of the things that make being principal here so special.”

During June and July, Emmel worked closely with incoming principal Dr. Keith Bigsby. Both principals led McMillan Magnet Middle School before moving on to Central High. Bigsby was formerly a business teacher, coach and administrator at Central.

After several administrative appointments in the district, Bigsby was assistant principal at Central during the 2005-2006 school year before becoming principal at McMillan the following year. He has two daughters who attend Central and another who graduated from Central. “I’m confident Keith Bigsby will do a great job,” said Emmel. “I’m leaving Central in good hands.”

“I’m very honored and humbled by the opportunity to follow in the footsteps of Central’s former principals and mentors G.E. “Doc” Moller, Gary Thompson, Jerry Bexten and Greg Emmel,” Bigsby said.

Emmel plans to spend more time with his wife and family in the years to come. He also hopes to continue working in some capacity that helps young people achieve important life goals.

“This has been a fantastic way to end a 33-year career with the Omaha Public Schools,” Emmel added. “I’ll miss everyone, but I’m confident I’ll still find ways to support Central and be a part of the ongoing success and traditions of this great public institution.”

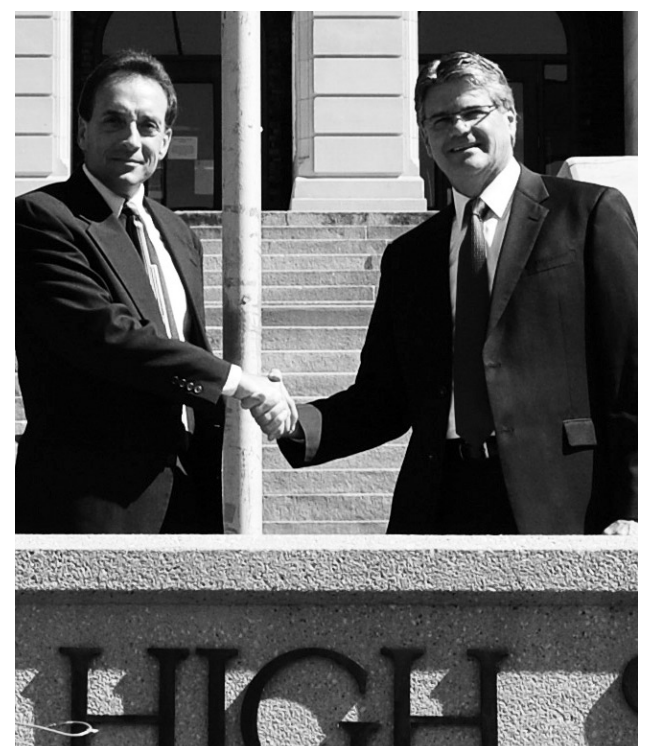
