
Mike Lebens:

Jack Nixon, CHS 1968, has been named to New Mexico State Athletics Hall of Fame!

Jack Nixon is being recognized for his long commitment to New Mexico State athletics by being inducted into their Hall of Fame.



Congratulations to Jack Nixon, CHS 1968, who has been named to New Mexico State Athletics Hall of Fame!

Jack Nixon is currently in his 34th year as the radio playby-play voice for New Mexico State University athletics. Only 11 other college-radio announcers have a longer tenure at one school than Nixon has at NM State.

The 'Voice of the Aggies' has broadcast over 400 Aggie football games and over 1,000 Aggie men's basketball games. On Jan. 14, 2012, Nixon broadcast his 1,000th game for the men's basketball program to join a list of only six radio announcers with at least 1,000 men's collegiate basketball games called for one team. During his time as a radio broadcaster, Nixon has won numerous local, state and national awards.

Child Savings Institute will be hosting a panel discussion with Steve Marantz and Susie Buffett March 20th in the Central High School Auditorium.




Eagles supplemented their studies over winter break by visiting the National World War I Museum, the Truman Presidential Library and Museum, and the Nelson-Atkins Art Gallery.



Academic Decathlon, AP US History, and IB History students recently went on a 2-day field trip over winter break to the Kansas City/Topeka area to visit museums and historic sites related to their studies. In Kansas City, they visited the Truman Presidential Library and Museum, the National WWI Museum where they got a chance to tour the archives and meet research staff, and the Nelson-Atkins Art Gallery.

The following day they went to Lecompton, KS to see the 1857 territorial capitol and hear discussions related to "Bleeding Kansas." They also toured the Kansas state capitol in Topeka as well as the 1855 territorial capitol building/ museum that also served as an Underground RR station.

Students shared Central's connection to Nebraska's territorial capitols with the museum staff. The trip finished at the Brown vs. Board of Education Museum in the former Topeka Monroe Elementary- now part of the National Park Service.



In the spring of 1968, the Omaha Central High School basketball team made history with its first all-black starting lineup. The Rhythm Boys, as they were called, were slated to win the state championship that year, but after segregationist George Wallace ignited the city's smoldering racism, the team, the school, and the city were left forever changed.
