

FROM THE DESK OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Supporter,

It is critical to the Central High School Foundation that Central High does not forget about its past, continues to live successfully in the present, and is planning for its future. In recognition of the challenges that current and future CHS staff and administration face in educating our young people for both academic and career opportunities of today and tomorrow, particularly in a building designed in the 19th century, the Central Foundation has been asked to and has agreed to help upgrade Central High School into a 21st century educational facility.



In partnership with the Omaha Public Schools and through the generous support of Central High School alumni, as well as friends of the school and families of past, present, and future Central graduates, the Central High School Foundation is proud to announce that we will be breaking ground this summer on a 50,000 square foot addition on the east side of Central High School. Once the addition is completed, the re-purposing and upgrading of 25,000 square feet in the existing building space will follow.

The new Central High School addition will be attached to the east side of the building and will consolidate the art, instrumental music, drama, and vocal music departments as well as a digital library, into one location. The new building addition will also include a 300 seat black box theater that will be available for both school and community use. This project will not limit the significant role that the current auditorium plays in the school's operation. The addition's east entryway will provide a powerful connection to the Central High School

student parking lot and to downtown Omaha. The entry point of the addition from the existing building will be a showroom for visual and performing arts as well as a digital library. This space will also serve as the conduit from the existing building to the library and will offer panoramic views of downtown Omaha. This area will also provide access to four art studios and will function as lobby space for the black box theater on the lower level. The lower level of the addition will indude music dassrooms as well as rehearsal and performance space containing the black box theater. The addition's profile will be limited to below the elevation of the exiting east structure. The addition's roof structure will become an accessible outdoor plaza significantly larger than the existing patio.

The portions of the existing building spaces that currently house the library, vocal music, instrumental music and art will be re-purposed and updated for use as ACP, Student Support, ELL and general dassrooms. This recaptured space of up to 25,000 square feet will also have other possible uses including learning studios, project based labs and success centers for tutoring and individualized learning.


The Omaha Landmarks Heritage Preservation Commission and the Omaha Public Schools have completed a comprehensive review of the addition proposal and has given its approval to proceed with the project. 
Clark Lauritzen Named President of First National Bank



Bob is a well-recognized business man in Omaha, having served as the company spokesperson and Executive Vice President of Nebraska Furniture Mart, a Midwest institution in the furniture, appliances, and electronics business. In

addition, he has been a mentor to many young people in Omaha and a supporter of civic causes such as purchasing video cameras for police cruisers. TAGG your purchase by taking a picture of the receipt rather than taking a picture of a QR code! That way if you forget to TAGG your purchase before leaving the restaurant, you can take a picture of your receipt after getting home!

Omaha Central High School Foundation has partnered with TAGG (Together A Greater Good), an Omaha start-up, to provide an easy and free way to support

the Foundation. TAGG offers a smartphone app that, when used at 120 participating local businesses, the business will donate 5% of your purchase, any day any time! The app, available on iPhone and Android devices, is free to download and easy to set up. Here's how to get started:

1) Go to the <u>App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u> and download the free app 'Together a Greater Good' to your iPhone or Android device.

2) When it's time to pay at a participating business, dick the orange 'TAGG My Purchase' button on the app and tell the cashier that you want to 'TAGG' your purchase.

3) On your phone, enter in the total pre-tax amount of your purchase and click 'Next.'

4) When you go to TAGG a purchase, you will now have the option to take a picture of your receipt (instead of asking a cashier for a QR code to scan). We ask that you do this within 7 days of purchase.

5) On your phone, select Central High School Foundation from the list of organizations.
