

Get your copy of "Citizen Akoy" autographed! CHS grad **Steve Marantz** ('69) will be signing copies of his new book *Citizen Akoy: Basketball and* the Making of a South Sudanese American on Friday, February 22 at 6 PM at The Bookworm.

The book features Akoy Agau, who led Omaha Central High School to four straight high school basketball state championships (2010-13) and was a three-time All-State player. One of the most successful high school athletes in Nebraska's history, he's also a South Sudanese refugee. At age four, Akoy and his family fled Sudan during the Second Sudanese Civil War, and after three years in Cairo,

they came to Maryland as refugees. They arrived in Omaha in 2003 in search of a better future.

Steve Marantz is the author of *The Rhythm Boys of Omaha Central: High School Basketball at the '68 Racial Divide* (Nebraska, 2011). He has worked as a writer, researcher, and producer for ESPN and has covered sports, government, and politics for the *Kansas City Star*, *Boston Globe*, and *Boston Herald*. His podcast, "That Championship Season," features great champions and their moments in history.





Update from the Alumni Association



On a regular basis the CHS Alumni Association receives donations to its library arts collection. The collection includes literary publications, music, and other artistic achievements, and it represents the considerable achievements of CHS alumni who have generously donated their works.

The Arts Library consists of works of fiction, non-fiction, text books, and musical sound tracks – over 300 items currently on display in the Central High School courtyard. The Library is maintained by the Central High

School Alumni Association, and with the assistance of the CHS Foundation, new items are solicited and added on a regular basis. A complete listing of contents can be viewed in the CHS Alumni section of the Foundation's website.

A Few Highlights of the Arts Library Include:

<u>Strange Angels</u> by Jonis Agee. Jonis Agee is a writer of short stories, novels, essays, and screenplays. She is the author of thirteen books, including five novels and five collections of short fiction. Three of her books have been New York Times Notable Books. She is the Adele Hall Professor of English at the University of Nebraska – Lincoln

<u>The Book of Qualities</u> by Ruth Gendler. Ruth Gendler is an artist, writer, and teach committed to the transformational potential of the arts. The Book of Qualities, now in its 40th printing, has been adapted as a two act theater piece and translated into German, Japanese, and Chinese. In addition to her personal essays and poems, Gendler writes books about the arts, education, health.

Offensive Football and I Am Third by Gale Sayers. Gale Sayers is a former professional American football player who earned acclaim both as a halfback and return specialist in the National Football League (NFL). After graduating from Central in 1961, he was twice recognized as an All American while playing for the University of Kansas Jayhawks. Sayers was drafted by the Chicago Bears in the first round, fourth overall, in the 1965 NFL draft. His autobiography, I Am Third was the basis for the 1971 made-for-TV movie Brian's Song. Sayers was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1977.

110 in the Shade, a CD featuring Inga Swenson. A 1950 graduate of Central High School, Inga Swenson studied drama at Northwestern University. She had many supporting roles in her early career, and as a trained lyric soprano had many starring roles on Broadway. She received a Tony Award nomination for Best Actress in a Musical for her performance in 110 in the Shade. She is best known for her role of Gretchen Krause in the TV sitcom Benson.

Tagg Your Holiday Purchases - Download the App!



You can now TAGG your purchase by taking a picture of the receipt rather than taking a picture of a QR code! That way if you forget to TAGG your purchase before leaving the restaurant, you can take a picture of your receipt after getting home!

Omaha Central High School Foundation has partnered with TAGG (Together A Greater Good), an Omaha start-up, to provide an easy and free way to support the Foundation. TAGG offers a smartphone app that, when used at 120 participating local businesses, the business will donate 5% of your purchase, any day any time! The app, available on iPhone and Android devices, is free to download and easy to set up. Here's how to get started:

- 1) Go to the <u>App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u> and download the free app 'Together a Greater Good' to your iPhone or Android device.
- 2) When it's time to pay at a participating business, click the orange 'TAGG My Purchase' button on the app and tell the cashier that you want to 'TAGG' your purchase.
- 3) On your phone, enter in the total pre-tax amount of your purchase and click 'Next.'
- 4) When you go to TAGG a purchase, you will now have the option to take a picture of your receipt (instead of asking a cashier for a QR code to scan). We ask that you do this within 7 days of purchase.
- 5) On your phone, select Central High School Foundation from the list of organizations.
