

Congratulations to our Eagles for their performances at the Nebraska Thespian Festival!


## Roberts Shares Building Progress with Optimists Club



## Update from the Alumni Association



The CHS Alumni Association has several very active committees including: Alumni Arts, Technology, History, Special Events, Military Veterans, Hall of Fame, Recruitment and Eagle Business Alliance This month we are spotlighting one of the oldest committees, the History Committee, which was formed in 1997.





Its mission is to gather artifacts pertain to the history of Central High School. An early task completed by the committee and continued today is to digitize all O-Books and Registers, which are <u>available on-line</u>.

Committee members review artifacts that are donated and they also maintain a database of all items.

Merrliee Miller, History Committee Chair shares they are always looking for wonderful additions to our collection. Not sure if it is something they want -- just contact the History Committee members. They will pick up your Central High-related goodies from your home!

The committee meets several times throughout the year to assess ideas for the archives and to assess new items for inclusion. Their meetings are very casual, and full of good humor. If you would like to get more information on this committee, please contact the Alumni Association.

## Interesting History Artifacts Collected by the History Committee

The book, *Musee de Versailles ou tableau de l'histoire de France*, was donated to the archives by the CHS Art Department (thank you Tanya Simmons). It has two interesting features.

First, as the card packet shows, the CHS Library was listed as the Omaha Public Library and Museum, Central High School Branch. It is unknown how long that association lasted.

Second, it is inscribed by Sara Stebbins, Dec. 26th 1886. Jim Wigton (CHS Historian) believes Sara taught at CHS.

Another artifact is a vintage projector, thanks to Janis Elliott, head of the Science Dept. is a 1950's vintage projection microscope. This was used to project slides on walls, the table, etc. using this device.

Can you believe the Central's cafeteria once had official china? Merrilee Miller shared a picture of a CHS china plate. She also shared a spoon that shows OHS (Omaha High School). It is believed that graduating girls would get sterling spoons rather than class rings.

## Tagg Your Holiday Purchases - Download the App!



You can now TAGG your purchase by taking a picture of the receipt rather than taking a picture of a QR code! That way if you forget to TAGG your purchase before leaving the restaurant, you can take a picture of your receipt after getting home!

Omaha Central High School Foundation has partnered with TAGG (Together A Greater Good), an Omaha start-up, to provide an easy and free way to support the Foundation. TAGG offers a smartphone app that, when used at 120 participating local businesses, the business will donate 5% of your purchase, any day any time! The app, available on iPhone and Android devices, is free to download and easy to set up. Here's how to get started:

- 1) Go to the <u>App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u> and download the free app 'Together a Greater Good' to your iPhone or Android device.
- 2) When it's time to pay at a participating business, click the orange 'TAGG My Purchase' button on the app and tell the cashier that you want to 'TAGG' your purchase.
- 3) On your phone, enter in the total pre-tax amount of your purchase and click 'Next.'
- 4) When you go to TAGG a purchase, you will now have the option to take a picture of your receipt (instead of asking a cashier for a QR code to scan). We ask that you do this within 7 days of purchase.
- 5) On your phone, select Central High School Foundation from the list of organizations.
